Riley Bosch, St. Thomas

Pitcher - University of St. Thomas junior pitcher Riley Bosch (White Bear Lake, Minn.) allowed one run with 12 strikeouts and no walks in 10 1-3 innings for a win and a save vs. two nationally-ranked teams. In Tuesday's game-two against No. 19 St. Olaf, with UST just losing game one and needing a win to keep its MIAC title hopes alive, Bosch pitched a complete-game five hit shutout with no walks and six Ks in a 4-0 win. It was the first time St. Olaf was shutout in 54 games and just the third time the Oles were shutout by a conference foe in 130 games over five seasons. In Sunday's 6-4 win over No. 5-ranked St. Scholastica, Bosch allowed one run and two hits and no walks in 3 1-3 innings of relief. He struck out five of the last six batters he faced. Bosch (5-2), lowered his ERA to 2.38 and picked up his MIAC-best fifth save. The Toms had a 1.58 ERA in MIAC play and a 2.12 ERA in 37 games overall. St. Thomas is 29-8 and will be the top-seed for this weekend's MIAC playoffs.
