

2014 MIAC MEN'S TRACK AND FIELD CONFERENCE PREVIEW

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The 2014 men's track and field season is about to begin in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC). St. Thomas returns as the defending champion in both indoor and outdoor track and field, and the top question in 2014 will be whether the Tommies' reign will continue, or if one of the contenders is poised to knock them off.

If anyone other than St. Thomas hoists the MIAC Indoor Track and Field trophy, it would be a first. Head Coach Steve Mathre's team has won all 29 MIAC Indoor



championships since the event began in 1985. The Tommies run of MIAC Outdoor Track and Field titles is nearly as impressive. Their 31 championships are the most in MIAC history, and they've won two in a row, five of the last six and 26 of the last 31. Saint John's claimed all five non-UST outdoor titles since 1983, putting the storied football rivalry front and center on the track as well.

The Tommies ran away from the competition at the 2013 MIAC Indoor Championships, hosted by St. Olaf. Mathre's club racked up 204 points to finish 90 points ahead of the rest of the field. The host Oles were solidly in second with 114. Bethel rounded out the top three with 88 points, while Hamline barely edged Saint John's, 74.5-73, for fourth. Concordia (59) snuck by Gustavus (57.5) and Carleton (50) for sixth, while Macalester (29), Augsburg (26) and Saint Mary's (5) finished out the standings.

UST and SJU were again the top two outdoor teams, with the Tommies claiming their second-straight outdoor title on their home track in St. Paul. UST won with 186 points, while the runner-up Johnnies scored 116. Bethel joined that duo in the top three with a solid 103.5-point showing, and St. Olaf (93.5) and Hamline (86) rounded out the top five. Carleton (80) edged Gustavus (72.5) for sixth with Concordia (45.5) in seventh. Macalester (37.0), Augsburg (25.0) and Saint Mary's (9) completed the outdoor standings.

This year, St. Thomas brings back another talented team, but there is optimism around the league as the season is set to begin. Saint John's and Bethel again bring back talented teams, and St. Olaf is fresh off a cross country national championship that will no doubt be a boost to the Oles' track performance. Carleton, Gustavus, Hamline and Concordia all enter 2014 with hopes of improving upward in the MIAC standings, and Macalester, Augsburg and Saint Mary's are also excited about the dawn of a new season and the chance to display improvement with talented individuals back on each campus.

Whether its indoor during the remaining winter months or outdoor once spring arrives, the return of MIAC track and field is certainly cause for excitement on campuses throughout the conference.

WHAT'S NEW?

It was an offseason of change for many of the MIAC track and field programs, resulting in one new head coach and a pair of interim assignments. Saint Mary's welcomes new coach Niels Anderson, who replaces the departed Shawn McMahon. Anderson comes to SMU from nearby La Crosse, Wis., after a successful stint coaching the La Crosse Central high school squads.

There were also mid-season changes at Augsburg and Macalester, with a pair of longtime coaches moving on and assistants stepping in to lead in the interim. Both Dennis Barker and Augsburg and Martin Peper at Macalester recently announced their resignations after long, successful tenures at their respective posts. Peper and Barker had both spent 20 seasons with their respective teams. At Macalester, head cross country coaches Betsy Emerson and Matt Haugen have stepped in to lead the track programs, and former assistant Jarred Sampson has taken over for the Auggies, so even though their roles are new, these coaches will be familiar faces around the MIAC track facilities.

Tim Miles at Saint John's remains the dean of MIAC men's track and field coaches as he enters his milestone 35th season leading the Johnnies. Concordia's Garrick Larson is in his 21st season with the Cobbers and Mathre is opening his 19th season leading St. Thomas a the league's longest-tenured coaches.

WHO'S BACK?

Mathre's Tommie team lost a trio of stars to graduation in Eyo Ekpo (jumps), Cody Jerabek (sprints) and Gavin Yseth (multi-events), but St. Thomas should again be loaded with more than 90 athletes competing in purple and white. Indoor All-American and MIAC Decathlon champ Maxwell Dunne headlines the returners, along with versatile thrower/sprinter Aba Omot and runner Brian Jervey to bolster hopes of more titles in Tommie-town.

The Oles bring nearly everyone back from last year's squad and should dominate the distance events evidenced by their cross country national title. Head Coach Phil Lundin will look to junior Grant Wintheiser and senior Brian Saksa to continue their excellent distance careers this spring, and sprinter James McFarlin gives St. Olaf hope for balance throughout the running events.

In his 35th season, Miles welcomes back both talent and versatility to Collegeville, led by Saint John's sophomore Thomas Feichtinger, who earned All-American middle-distance honors in his college debut season. Distance runner John Subialka and jumper Nick Welshons are among the other talented Johnnie returners.

Bethel is another team built for middle distance success and beyond in Head Coach Andrew Rock's second season. All-American middle distance runners Zach Haskins and Matt Schaefer are both back, and distance runner Matt Berens adds to the Royals' strong core. Hamline welcomes back sprinter/hurdler Eric Hanson, sprinter Tom Larson and thrower Ben Dvorak, as the Pipers try to return to contention under Head Coach Paul Schmaedeke.

Gustavus loses MIAC pole vault champ Josh Owen, but Head Coach Dale Bahr has several other stars still in the mix. Thrower Ryan Oberle, versatile athlete Blair Riegel and multi-event star Cameron Clause have optimism soaring in St. Peter. Carleton will again be led by two-time steeplechase champ Marcus Huderle, and Head Coach Dave Ricks also welcomes back middle-distance runner Noah Laack-Veeder and sprinter Colby Seyferth to bolster the Knights' hopes.

A year ago, Concordia's Brandon Zylstra earned All-MIAC honors in a pair of jumping events at the indoor meet, as did pole vaulter Levi Bachmeier. Connor Johnson also had a great season throwing the javelin for Larson's Cobbers. Macalester received a pleasant surprise a year ago when freshman Logan Hovie won the MIAC outdoor high jump title and finished second in the event at the national indoor meet. He returns, along with sprinter/thrower Konnor Fleming and pole vault specialist Mason Kriegel to ease this year's transition to Emerson and Haugen's leadership.

Sampson will benefit from the return of three of Augsburg's most talented athletes in 2014, starting with distance runner Michaele Tesema. Sprinter Lekpea Kordah also returns, as does middle distance/hurdler Chase Grieves. Meanwhile, Anderson's first season at Saint Mary's will feature the return of two of the school's most decorated distance runners - Aaron Haley and John Soucheray - as well as sophomore jumper Bryan Ortman.

CIRCLE THESE DATES

The first two dates any MIAC track and field fans will want to mark on their calendar are March 6-8 and May 9-10. Those are the days the conference will come together to crown the MIAC Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field champions, respectively. The indoor meet will be cohosted by Saint John's and Saint Benedict at the Johnnies' indoor facility in Collegeville, Minn., while the outdoor meet will be hosted by St. Olaf in Northfield, Minn.

The outdoor schedule is still a work in progress (but will be available soon on the MIAC web site), but there are several dates fans will want to identify for the indoor schedule, starting with Saturday as Bethel hosts the Bethel Open and St. Thomas competes at the Northwest Open to officially open the 2014 season. St. Thomas, Saint Mary's, Bethel, St. Olaf, Concordia and Macalester will all host indoor meets this spring, so there should be plenty of opportunity to catch the MIAC teams in action close to home.

• Augsburg's track and field teams participated in their annual Run-a-Thon on Dec. 7-8, raising money for their annual spring break training and competition trip. Fifty Auggies ran in a 24-hour team relay around Murphy Square Park in the center of Augsburg's campus, completing a combined 212 miles of running in frigid conditions.

• Dennis Barker, who served as Augsburg's track and field/cross country head coach for 20 seasons, announced his resignation following the cross country campaign. In his track career, Barker coached 59 MIAC event champions (individuals and relays), along with 147 All-MIAC and 126 All-MIAC Honorable Mention honorees. He guided 47 entries to NCAA Division III national championship competition, with 16 earning All-America honors. In cross country, 35 Auggies earned either All-MIAC (17) or All-MIAC Honorable Mention (18) honors under Barker's coaching, with 20 athletes earning NCAA All-Region honors and six athletes qualifying for the NCAA Division III national championships, one earning All-American honors.

- 4:12.07: Zach Haskins was crowned an All-American for the second time in his career at Bethel during the 2013 NCAA National Indoor Track and Field Meet at Naperville, Ill., with his time of 4:12.07. His mark helped him finish sixth overall and break the school record—a mark he had previously set.
- 400: Bethel owned the 400-meter hurdles event in 2013, as the Royals took home the top two spots in the race. Returning as seniors this year, Mark Rice edged teammate Anthony Puckett by just under two seconds, as Rice crossed the finish line at 53.92.
- 3: The Royals ended the 2013 MIAC Outdoor track and field meet with three first place finishes. In addition to Mark Rice's first-place finish in the 400-meter hurdles, Bethel swept the sprint relays—winning both the 4x100-meter and 4x200-meter. Key members to those teams were Nathan Sayler, Jordon Anderson, Zach Barringer, Ian Moore, Gavin Woodland, Rob LeMay, Mark Rice, and Matt Davis.

Did You Know?

• Throughout his career, Zach Haskins (1-mile, 1500m, DMR) has ran in five NCAA Division III national events. The senior, who is chasing his sixth and seventh appearance, competed in two national meets during his tenure with the Royals cross country squad and has ran in three—one indoor and two outdoor—national meets with the track and field squad. Haskins owns three No. 1 spots in Bethel University's indoor and outdoor record book.

- 87: The number of years it had been since a Gustavus athlete won the javelin at the MIAC Championships before Ryan Ness did so last season. After Earl Ecklund won the event in 1926, Ness was the Gustie to do so with his throw of 182-feet 10-inches last season.

Did You Know?

• The Gustavus men's indoor track and field team had two athletes earn All-America honors last season. It was the first time since the 2003 season that multiple Gusties earned such an honor at the same NCAA Indoor Championships. Luke Speltz (weight throw, shot put), Ryan Hoag (55m dash), and Jerry Washington (55m dash) all earned All-America accolades in 2003.

- 35: The 2014 track and field season is head coach Tim Miles' 35th at SJU. He has produced a winning track and field program that has finished among the MIAC's top two squads in 23 of the past 34 seasons, including MIAC championships in 1997, 1999, 2005, 2007 and 2011. Miles won MIAC Coach of the Year honors in 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2011. At the national level, Miles' athletes have put together 61 Division III All-America performances since 1980.
- 10: The Johnnies posted 10 All-MIAC (top three individually, champion relay team) performances at the 2013 MIAC Outdoor Championships last May, ending a three-year drought with single-digit totals. SJU recorded double digits each year from 2003-09 (conference-champion relay teams count as four): 2003 (11), 2004 (12), 2005 (19), 2006 (16), 2007 (16), 2008 (10) and 2009 (14).
- 1/2: The Johnnies have finished in the top two at the conference's outdoor meet in nine of the last 11 seasons, including three championships (2005, 2007 and 2011).

Did You Know?

• Feichtinger became the first SJU freshman to qualify for the NCAA Division III Championships since 1992 (Mike Cihlar '95) and the first in the program's history to earn All-America honors with an eighth-place finish in the 800 meters last spring.

• Feichtinger and the rest of the 2013 SJU track and field team earned U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches' Association (USTFCCCA) All-Academic recognition over the summer. Feichtinger is an English and history double-major with a 3.88 GPA. The 85 Johnnies on the roster combined for a cumulative team GPA of 3.24.

- 4: The SMU men's distance medley relay team Ryan Winegardner (Northfield, Minn.), Gabe Thiel (Elgin, Minn.), Jake Traxler (Le Center, Minn.) and Andrew Merkert (St. Paul, Minn.) etched their names in the school record books, posting a time of 10:47.59 to finish eighth overall at the MIAC Indoor Championships. It was the fourth straight year the Cardinals' DMR broke the school record with Traxler a member of all four record-setting relay teams.

Central teams to conference, regional and sectional championships, while also earning Mississippi Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors in 2010, 2011 and 2012, and District 3 Coach of the Year accolades in 2012.
