2013 MIAC Men's Outdoor Track and Field Championship Preview

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The University of St. Thomas enters the 2013 MIAC Outdoor Track and Field Championships as the favorite to repeat, and the Tommie men will try to add another conference title to their tremendous season in front of their home fans. St. Thomas will host the 2013 conference meet on its St. Paul, Minn., campus, Friday, May 10, and Saturday, May

St. Thomas captured the 2013 MIAC Indoor Track and Field team championship at St. Olaf in March, and now Head Coach Steve Mathre and his team will try to claim another outdoor title in front of their home fans. A year ago, UST won its MIAC-leading 30th overall outdoor title, and in 2012 the Tommies will try for two in a row, and five in the past six years. In fact, St. Thomas has won every title except five since 1983, and each of those five championships (1997, 1999, 2005, 2007, 2010) were claimed by UST rival Saint John's.

A year ago, the Tommies claimed the title by a 34-point margin over runner-up, Hamline, which finished second with a total of 153 points. Gustavus (118) and Saint John's (101) also broke 100 points a year ago, with Bethel (86) rounding out the top five. Carleton was sixth with 71 points, St. Olaf came in seventh (63) and Concordia (58) - which hosted the 2011 meet - was eighth. Augsburg (14), Macalester (4.0) and Saint Mary's (3.0) rounded out the final three spots in the standings.

UST again will be the favorite - especially with home-track advantage - but several other schools are looking for upward movement to challenge the Tommies' reign. St. Olaf and Bethel both joined St. Thomas in the top three in the 2013 Indoor Championships, and perennial contenders Hamline and Saint John's were also in the top five, and those five are again expected to jockey for position atop the standings at the 2013 Outdoor meet.

The top performers from the indoor season are also expected to be a huge factor this weekend outdoors as well. St. Thomas' Eyo Ekpo will close the books on his amazing MIAC career this weekend in front of his home fans after capturing his fourth-straight Indoor Outstanding Men's Field Athlete honor in March. The Tommie jumper also has a decorated outdoor career, earning Outstanding Field Athlete in 2010 and Outstanding Performance a year ago. Ekpo - an All-American - has 11 first-place finishes, four seconds and two thirds in six previous MIAC indoor/outdoor meets.

Teammate Cody Jerabek will anchor the defending champion in the sprinting events and has high expectations for the outdoor championships after winning Outstanding Performance-of-the-Meet honors at the 2013 indoor championships. Bethel runner Zach Haskins will try to add an outdoor award to his stellar season after the junior claimed Outstanding Men's Track Athlete honors indoors in March.

The defending champs - in addition to Ekpo and Jerabek - will count on thrower Bryan Thell, versatile athlete Aba Omot and sophomore **Doug Thoreson** to pile up points in their quest for another title. St. Thomas is already off to a good start after **Max Dunne** won the MIAC Outdoor decathlon title last weekend with three UST athletes finishing atop the standings.

St. Olaf will aim to continue its great season after winning the 2012 MIAC Cross Country title and finishing second in the MIAC in March under the direction Indoor Coach-of-the-Year Phil Lundin. Distance runners Grant Wintheiser and Brian Saksa lead the Oles, with sprinters Reggie Woods and James McFarlin adding to their depth. Haskins headlines a strong Bethel team under first-year Head Coach Andrew Rock. Runners Rob LeMay, Matt Berens and Gavin Woodland and thrower Bucky Dixon all boost the Royals' expectations for the 2013 outdoor meet.

Hamline lots a lot of excellence in the distance events, but Head Coach Paul Schmaedeke has far from an empty cupboard. Jumper Phil Rein and thrower Ben Dvorak will lead in the field events, with sophomore Freddie Galloway among the Piper stars on the track. Saint John's will try to recapture its recent championship magic of 2010 behind a strong lineup. Kevin Horton and Thomas Feichtinger lead the Johnnie runners, while jumper Tyler Martin and thrower Andrew Casascione will try to score big in the field.

Gustavus brings back one of the meet's true stars in Blair Riegel, the defending Outdoor Outstanding Field Athlete. Riegel won the long jump and helped GAC win the 4x100-meter relay a year ago with a second-place finish in the triple jump as well. Pole vault favorite **Josh** Owens and thrower Ryan Obele also bolster the Gustie expectations in the field events. Carleton got a fourth-place decathlon finish out of C.J. Dale last weekend, and defending steeplechase champ Marcus Huderle also leads the Knights. Carleton is counting on a big weekend out of runners Colby Seyferth, Bobby Davis and Noah Laack-Veeder as well.

Concordia has 2012 javelin champ Connor Johnson back as well as All-MIAC runner John Bye. Jumper Simon Erlandson and sprinter Ben Vickstrom add to the Cobbers' talent and depth at the 2013 outdoor meet. Distance runner Micheale Tesema and versatile athlete Michael Harley lead Augsburg into the MIAC meet. Macalester has 200-meter indoor champ Konnor Fleming and talented jumper Logan Hovie in the lineup, and Saint Mary's has a trio of distance runners - Aaron Haley, John Soucheray and Jake Traxler - leading its team into the conference championships.

The 2013 MIAC Indoor Track and Field Championships began with last weekend's multi-event competitions at Saint John's. The full event will begin Friday at St. Thomas with field events beginning at 3 p.m. and track events starting at 3:30 p.m. Saturday's action will start with the National Anthem at 11:50 a.m. The Day 2 field events start at 12 p.m. and the track events will begin at 1 p.m. The full schedule of

events is available online.

Saturday's final event begins at 4:35 p.m., and there will be a short awards ceremony following the conclusion of the meet to honor both team champions. The top three individuals in each event and the first-place relay team will automatically earn All-Conference honors, and the fourth- through sixth-place finishers in each open event and second- through sixth-place relay teams will all be named All-Conference Honorable Mention.

The MIAC has a Web page dedicated to the event, and complete results, recaps, and multimedia coverage of the championships will be available on that site throughout the event. There will be live results available for all events courtesy of <u>Apple Raceberry Jam</u> and fans can also find entries and heat sheets on the MIAC's event page as they become available.

Admission for the event is \$7 for adults and \$3 for students per day, with children ages 5 and under admitted free. MIAC passes will be honored. The MIAC would like to thank the University of St. Thomas, its coaches, and its staff, for its efforts as the host school. Stay tuned to St. Thomas' athletic web site for complete details and meet information.
