


Mike Butterworth, Gustavus

Week of: 2007-11-06



Gustavus Adolphus College senior forward **Mike Butterworth** (Katy, Texas/Robert Service) scored a goal in each of Gustavus' MIAC playoff victories and helped the Gusties claim their second straight conference tournament title. The Gusties have now won four of the past five league playoff championships. With the win against St. Olaf in the championship game, Gustavus also earned their fifth consecutive bid to the NCAA Tournament. In the team's 2-1 victory over St. Thomas in the semifinals, Butterworth scored the game-winning goal with just 1:20 left to go in the second half. The goal came 1:57 after the Tommies had tied the game at 1-1. For Butterworth it was his 13th goal of the year. In the championship game against the Oles, Butterworth scored the team's second goal to cap the 2-0 win. For the season he leads the team in goals and overall points and led the MIAC in points and overall goals scored. Entering the NCAA Tournament he has 14 goals and three assists for 31 points.

Brian TenHoor, Carleton

Carleton College junior forward **Brian TenHoor** (Eden Prairie, Minn./Minnehaha Academy) played an important role on both Carleton (14-1-3, 8-0-2 MIAC) second-half goals as they Knights secured their first MIAC regular-season title with a 2-1 victory over rival St. Olaf College on Saturday. His play perfectly setup Carleton's first goal. Only 79 seconds later, TenHoor found the back of the net with what became the game-winning and title-clinching goal.

Andrew Clement, Hamline

Hamline University senior goalkeeper **Andrew Clement** (Victoria, Minn./Minnetonka) turned aside five shots in helping Hamline gain a 0-0 double overtime tie with league-leading Carleton on Saturday. It marked the first time all season that the Knights have been held scoreless in an MIAC game. Carleton entered the game with a 7-0-1 conference mark and had scored 25 goals in their first eight league games of the season. Clement was part of the Piper defense that held the Knights off the scoreboard and limited the team to only five shots on goal. Earlier in the week, Clement played 45 minutes and stopped five shots in the Pipers' 4-1 win over St. Scholastica. The Saints came into the game with a 15-2-0 overall record. For the year, Clement has played in 12 games, posted four shutouts and has a goals against average of 1.30.

Eric Tettegah, Macalester

Macalester College first-year forward **Eric Tettegah** (Brooklyn Park, Minn./Breck) scored two of his team's three goals during the week as Macalester posted a pair of conference wins to stay in the hunt for a spot in the MIAC playoffs. Tettegah scored the game-winning goal in the team's 1-0 win over Concordia on Wednesday and then added the second goal of the game in the Scots' 2-0 win over Saint Mary's. The goal against the Cobbers came at 83:32 and was Tettegah's first collegiate goal. He was able to strip the Concordia defender and then hammer a shot past the goalie to secure the win for Macalester. In the game, Tettegah had a team-high three shots.

Against Saint Mary's, he came off the bench to score his second goal in as many games at the 83:44 mark. That goal helped secure head coach Ian Barker's 50th collegiate victory.

Robert Carlton, Carleton

Carleton College sophomore defender **Robert Carlton** (Madison, Wis./Memorial) helped the first-place Knights secure a pair of shutouts this week with his play along the back line. He also scored his first goal of the season in the nationally-ranked Knights' 6-0 win at Bethel University on Saturday.

Matt Klein, Concordia

Concordia College senior midfielder **Matt Klein** (Fergus Falls, Minn.) scored the game-winning goal in Concordia's historic victory over Saint Mary's on Saturday. Klein's goal in the second half against the Cardinals helped the Cobbers end a 35-game conference winless streak - a streak that dated back to Oct. 25, 2003 and totaled 3,200 playing minutes and 1,433 calendar days. Klein also helped the Cobber defense record only its second conference shutout in the past four seasons. Klein's goal was his second goal in consecutive games and brings his season point total to five. He entered the season with only five goals in his first three years and has two in 2007.

Joe Voeller, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas senior forward **Joe Voeller** (White Bear Lake, Minn./Hill-Murray) had a goal and two assists in Saturday's 3-0 road win over 2006 MIAC playoff qualifier Augsburg that kept the Tommies unbeaten in conference play. He assisted on a goal in the third minute, scored a goal in the 35th minute, then assisted on a goal in the 48th minute. He was scoreless in Sunday's 3-1 loss to 7-1 UW-Whitewater. Voeller has a team-best four goals and three assists in the Tommies' 5-3-1 start, including six games vs. regionally- or nationally-ranked teams.

Bobby Phillips, Carleton

Carleton College junior forward **Bobby Phillips** (Vadnais Heights, Minn./Mounds View) scored all three goals to lead the Knights to a 3-1 victory over Macalester in the conference opener for both teams on Wednesday, September 12. He scored his first goal 3:34 into the game off a pass from Paul Pedtke. A pass over the top of the Scots defense by Peter Grassman set up Phillips with a one-on-one situation with the Macalester keeper, and Phillips knocked the ball into the left side of the net for a 2-0 advantage in the 49th minute.

After the Scots drew within a goal, Phillips put the game out of reach in the 78th minute. He was taken down inside the 18-yard box and pounded the penalty kick home to complete his second career hat trick. Although he didn't score, Phillips was at the point of attack in Carleton's 2-1 overtime victory over Saint John's on Saturday.
