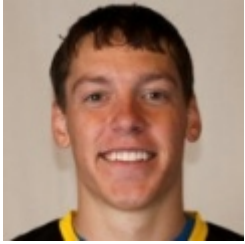


Mark Mullaney, Macalester

Macalester College junior goalkeeper **Mark Mullaney** (Plymouth, Minn./Robbinsdale Armstrong) put in an outstanding performance in Macalester's MIAC Playoff Championship win over Carleton on Saturday. Registering seven big saves to post the team's seventh shutout of the season, Mullaney dealt with everything that got through the Macalester back line. All seven of Mullaney's saves came in the second half. Mullaney also posted MIAC wins over St Thomas and Hamline in the latter half of October while sharing keeping duties with Matt Weyer.

Mads Schmidt, Concordia

Rodding, Denmark / Rodding

Concordia College senior goalie **Mads Schmidt** (Rodding, Denmark) helped Concordia finish the season without allowing a goal in its final eight games. The Cobbers played to a 0-0 double overtime draw against St. Thomas on Tuesday and then blanked Saint John's 4-0 in the season finale on Saturday. Concordia finished the year by not allowing a goal in 758:38, the third longest streak in MIAC men's soccer history. The two shutouts last week helped Schmidt lower his overall goals against average to 0.77 and a 0.88 mark in conference play. Against the Tommies, he made nine saves and had a pair of game-saving, point-blank saves. He followed that performance by stopping five shots against Saint John's to keep the shutout streak intact until next season.

Mark Adams, Gustavus

Gustavus Adolphus College sophomore forward **Mark Adams** (Waukee, Iowa) scored three goals in the Gusties 4-3 win over Bethel on Friday in Arden Hills. Adams scored the gamewinner with just six minutes remaining in regulation play (84th minute) with a shot that glanced off the right post and into the net. Adams gave the Gusties a 1-0 lead with a goal in the eighth minute. He then scored his second goal in the 58th minute to give the Gusties a 3-2 lead, however the Royals struck right back and tied the score at 3-3 with a goal in the 60th minute. Just as it appeared that Gustavus was heading to its eighth overtime match of the season, Adams scored the game-winner in the 84th minute.

Wes Elfman, Carleton

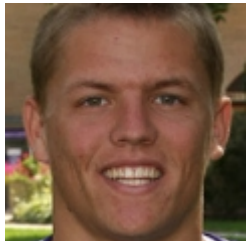
Madison, Wis. / Edgewood

Carleton College junior forward **Wes Elfman** (Madison, Wis./Edgewood) scored the Knights' game-winning goal in dramatic fashion with :11.9 seconds left in the second overtime on Wednesday against St. Thomas. With time, and daylight, running out, Tim Wills made a diagonal pass perfectly leading Elfman on his run where he slotted his third game winner of the season as the Knights prevailed 1-0 over the Tommies. Elfman also scored the second goal in Carleton's 2-0 win over Augsburg on Saturday. With that win, Carleton clinched a share of their third-straight MIAC Regular Season Title and a #1 seed in the MIAC Playoffs.

Mike Hutton, St. Thomas

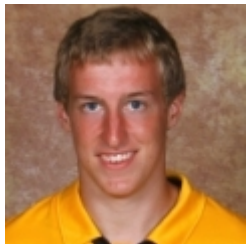
Apple Valley, Minn. / Apple Valley

Hutton had two goals and two assists to hand St. Olaf its first four-goal MIAC loss since 2002. Hutton has 49 points (21 goals, seven assists) in 26 career games. UST is 18-7-1 over the last two years with Hutton in the lineup, and 1-3-1 when he's been out.

Riley McGlynn, Concordia

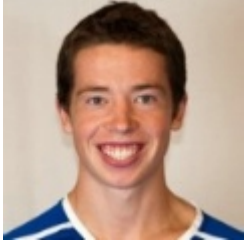
Hampstead, N.C. / Bozeman (Mont.)

Concordia College sophomore forward **Riley McGlynn** (Hampstead, N.C./Bozeman (Mont.)) scored four goals in the Cobbers' two conference wins last week. His goals helped Concordia move to 3-3-0 in conference play and jump into fourth place in the league standings. It is the first time since 2001 that the Cobbers have won three straight MIAC games. McGlynn had a goal in Concordia's 2-1 win over previously conference unbeaten Bethel on Wednesday and then had the game-winning goal and a hat trick in the team's 4-0 win over Saint Mary's on Saturday. For the week, he also had 10 shots and seven shots on goal in the team's two games. Against the Royals, McGlynn scored the first goal of the game that gave Concordia the momentum in the first half. On Saturday against the Cardinals he started the scoring with a goal in third minute of play and then put the game out of reach with a pair of scores in the second period. For the season McGlynn has a team-leading eight goals for 16 overall points. He currently leads the MIAC in goals scored in conference play with six. He is also tied for second in overall points with 12.

Stephen Murphy-Logue, Macalester

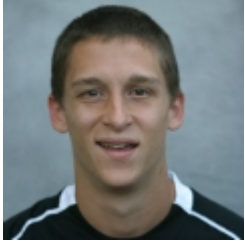
Anchorage, Alaska / West

Macalester College junior midfielder **Stephen Murphy-Logue** (Anchorage, Alaska/West) assisted on the Scots' game-winning goal with just 1:48 left in regulation as Macalester toppled Augsburg 1-0 on Wednesday (September 23) as the Scots improved to 2-0 in MIAC play. On Saturday at Grinnell, Murphy-Logue put Macalester on the board with a penalty kick after the Pioneers took an early lead. He then netted the game-clinching goal near the end of the second half as the Scots claimed their fourth win in a row.

Bret VanderStreek, Gustavus

Gustavus Adolphus College senior forward **Bret VanderStreek** (Pella, Iowa) scored two goals in the Gusties 2-1 victory over Carleton on Wednesday and the opening goal in Gustavus' 3-2 win over Concordia on Sunday. In Wednesday's key win over the defending MIAC Champion, VanderStreek scored both goals in nearly identical fashion. He received a pass from the midfield while he was breaking through the middle of the field at the top of the penalty box and then beat one defender before sliding the ball past the goalkeeper just inside the post. VanderStreek's first goal came in the 43rd minute, while his second goal came in the 54th minute. Gustavus is currently 2-0 in the MIAC and 4-1-2 overall.
