2014 MIAC Men's Soccer Conference Preview

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The 2014 men's soccer season is just one day away for the 11 teams in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) and they'll all enter the new campaign attempting to answer a very difficult question: can anyone unseat defending champion Gustavus?

A year ago, the conference was extremely competitive from the almost-top to the bottom, with the regular-season champion Gusties standing all atop the standings. Gustavus had a historic 2013 season, as Head Coach



Mike Middleton's club completed a perfect 10-0 romp through the conference to capture the title en route to a 14-4-1 overall record and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

However, last year's challengers all return hungry for another chance at Gustavus, especially after Saint John's stunned the top-seeded Gusties in the MIAC Playoff semifinals. Carleton edged out cross-town rival St. Olaf in the other postseason semifinal, then the Knights took down the Johnnies in the title game to capture the conference's Playoff crown and join the Gusties in the national tournament.

The two Northfield schools - Carleton (15-3-3) and St. Olaf (14-4-1) - used that semifinal game as a rubber match after they finished with identical 7-2-1 conference records to tie for second place. The Johnnies (9-7-3) were 6-2-2 in league play to earn their postseason bid and finish fourth. St. Thomas (10-4-4, 4-3-3 MIAC) and Augsburg (10-7-1, 5-5 MIAC) tied for fifth with 15 points in the standings, and Macalester (8-8-2, 4-4-2 MIAC) was just a point behind that duo in seventh.

The final four teams in the standings were separated by just four points as Hamline (6-10-1, 2-7-1 MIAC) came in eighth with seven points, Bethel (5-13, 2-8 MIAC) and Concordia (5-12-1, 2-8 MIAC) each had six points in conference play, and Saint Mary's (4-13-1, 1-9 MIAC) rounded out the standings with three points.

In all, seven of the MIAC's 11 teams finished .500 or better - both overall and in conference play, and nearly half the league (5-of-11) finished with double-digit victories. With many of the league's top stars back in 2014, Gustavus could have a host of challengers gunning for their spot at the top, and much of the league enters the season hopeful to contend for a Playoff spot or the title.

Speaking of the MIAC Playoffs, the field has expanded from four to six teams, so two more teams will get to join in the postseason fun in 2014. The tournament will still be a high-seed host, single-elimination format, with the top two seeds receiving a bye to the semifinals. Seeds 3-6 will square off in the quarterfinals on Tuesday, Nov. 4, with the winners advancing to semifinal matches the following day, Wednesday, Nov. 5. The two semifinal winners will meet on Saturday, Nov. 8 with the postseason title - and an automatic bid to the national tournament - on the line.

GUSTIES TOP CROWDED COACHES' POLL

Heading into the 2014 season, the MIAC coaches still think the Gusties are the favorite to claim the conference title, but they expect several other teams to also contend and potentially even unseat the defending champs. Gustavus finished first in the 2014 MIAC Men's Soccer Preseason Coaches' Poll with seven of the 11 first-place votes and 90 total points, but three other teams also received first-place votes and weren't far behind the Gusties in the predictions.

Defending MIAC Playoff champ Carleton received two first-place votes and trailed the Gusties by just four total points, as their score of 86 ranked them second in the 2014 Preseason Poll. St. Thomas was another six points behind the Knights with one first-place vote and 80 points, and St. Olaf received the other first-place vote and finished fourth with 68 points. Fresh off its run to the MIAC Playoff title game, Saint John's grabbed the final spot in the top five with 65 points, and the coaches expect Augsburg to grab the final spot in the expanded Playoffs, as the Auggies came in sixth with 57 points.

Macalester was just five points behind Augsburg in the poll, as the Scots finished seventh with 52 points. The coaches expect the next trio of teams to be extremely competitive, as just five points separated Concordia (34), Bethel (30) and Hamline (29), and Saint Mary's received 14 points to round out the poll.

ALL QUIET ON COACHING FRONT

For the second-straight season it has been all quiet on the MIAC men's soccer coaching front after a flurry of changes preceded the 2012 campaign. That season, Concordia's Ben Schneweis, Hamline's Alex Morawiecki, Macalester's Gregg Olson and St. Thomas' Jon Lowery all took over at their current schools, but no coaching changes have been made since, which speaks to the sustained level of play and improvement in the league in recent years.

St. Olaf's Kurt Anderson is entering his 26th season at the helm with the Oles, and he remains the dean of the MIAC coaches. Bob Carlson is entering his 18th season at Carleton and Greg Holker (11th season) recently surpassed a decade at Augsburg to rank as the next longest-tenured coaches in the league. Gustavus' Mike Middleton and Saint John's John Haws are both entering their fifth seasons at their respective schools, and this is season No. 4 for Bethel's Jeremy Iwaszkowiec and Saint Mary's Pete Watkins.

WHO TO WATCH FOR

Gustavus wasn't just picked first in the coaches' poll on the strength of what they accomplished a year ago ... they have a ton coming back to defend their championship, starting with MIAC Player-of-the-Year and All-American forward Zach Brown. Fellow seniors and All-Region performers David Lilly (midfielder) and Brett Ylonen (goalkeeper) also return for Middleton's squad, meaning there is serious talent and championship pedigree back in St. Peter in 2014.

Carleton will try to use its postseason run as a springboard to its championship hopes in 2014 behind a strong crop of returners as well, starting with dynamic scorer Brandon McGarrity, who is just a junior and already has 30 goals and 68 points in his career. Senior goalkeeper Keenan Smith and his 0.50 goals against average are also back, as is senior defender Devin Tomson-Moylan.

- St. Thomas graduated 2012 MIAC Player-of-the-Year Nick Rapisarda, but brings back the MIAC's goals leader from a year ago in junior forward Miles Stockman-Willis to carry the offensive torch. The Tommies also have experience back in the net, as senior goalkeeper Mitchell Wolff will again be between the pipes.
- St. Olaf graduated a pair of All-MIAC and All-Region players in Stephen Johnson and Mackenzie Lund, but has a pair of All-Conference players back in forward Kevin Skrip and midfielder Claudio Barboza. Sophomore goalkeeper Ben Braman is back after going 14-4-1 in net as a rookie. Saint John's graduated one of its most decorated players in program history forward Michael Coborn but Haws brings back talented forwards David Wee and Zane Hinselman and midfielder Alex Niederloh to try and help the Johnnies continue the momentum they started in the 2013 MIAC Playoffs.

All-MIAC goalkeeper Clayton Lynch graduated so Augsburg will need to replacement to step in at a key position in 2014, but Holker brings back plenty of talent - especially in the middle - as All-MIAC Honorable Mention selections Ben Henry (forward), Tanner McCarthy (midfielder) and Scott Clinton (midfielder) all return. Macalester lost two-time All-MIAC midfielder Robin Forslund, but All-Conference defender Cole Erickson returns at the Scots' team captain, and the team has high hopes for sophomore midfielder Alan Schembri-Wismayer to build on his tremendous rookie campaign).

Concordia hopes to continue its upward trajectory in 2014 behind midfielder Sage Thornbrugh, who was third in the MIAC in assists, as well as fellow sophomore goalkeeper Ben Glogoza and junior midfielder Dami Adegunle. Bethel graduated All-MIAC defender Cody Walkup, but is excited about the core coming back led by Matthew Pisarski (midfielder), Danny Jaderholm (forward) and Ryan Ness (midfielder/forward).

Hamline has plenty of senior leadership back at key spots to think the Pipers could be a team ready for a rise in the standings, as senior forwards Tyler Tallaksen and Michael Ramirez and goalkeeper Derrick Mora are all back to lead Morawiecki's club in 2014. In Winona, Watkins welcomes back a talented core of Fernando Camacho, Matt Graber and Ryan Geidner that hope to have Saint Mary's headed in the right direction this fall.

CIRCLE THESE DATES

The season officially starts Friday with eight of the MIAC's 11 teams all in action in nonconference play, and the other three all being their 2014 campaign either Saturday or Sunday. The first two weeks of the season will serve as a tune-up for the 10-game MIAC schedule, which begins with a full slate of games on Wednesday, Sept. 17. The final day of the regular season will be Saturday, Nov. 1, with the new-look MIAC Playoffs to follow on Nov. 4, 5 and 8.

Fans don't have to wait long for a marquee matchup, as the 2013 MIAC regular-season and Playoff champions square off to open conference play when Carleton visits Gustavus on Sept. 17 at 4 p.m. The Gusties and Johnnies will meet in a rematch of their MIAC Playoff semifinal game just 10 days later when Gustavus visits Saint John's on Sept. 27 at 1 p.m., and Saint John's will visit Carleton in a rematch of the Playoff title game on Oct. 4 at 4 p.m.

St. Olaf and St. Thomas both received first-place votes in the preseason poll and hope to contend in 2014, so their head-to-head matchup on Oct. 25 in St. Paul at 1 p.m. could carry major championship and postseason implications. Augsburg and Macalester also have high hopes in 2014, and their Twin Cities showdown on Sept. 27 at 7 p.m. on the Auggies' home field will be appointment viewing for MIAC soccer fans.

2014 MIAC Men's Soccer Playoffs

The 2014 MIAC Playoffs will have a new look, as the field has expanded from four to six teams. It will still be a single-elimination, high-seed host format, with two more teams included beginning this fall. The top two seeds will receive byes to the semifinals, while teams seeded No. 3-6 will square off in the quarterfinals. The two quarterfinal games will take place Tuesday, Nov. 4, the two semifinal games will be follow on Wednesday, Nov. 5, and the championship is set for Saturday, Nov. 8. The winner will receive the MIAC's automatic bid to the 2014 NCAA Division III Men's Soccer Tournament.

This run of success is the second-best in MIAC history as Gustavus won 8 titles (4 regular-season, 4 playoffs) over five seasons from 2003-07. Macalester won 6 crowns (all regular-season titles) over seven seasons from 1997-2003.

• For the second consecutive year, Neil Bartholomay '14 was named to the NSCAA Scholar All-America second team, one of four repeat selections to receive Scholar All-America status last season. • SJU earned a National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Award for the fifth consecutive season in 2013. A total of 269 men's soccer teams in all NCAA and NAIA divisions posted team GPAs of 3.00 or higher on a 4.00 scale to earn NSCAA Team Academic Award honors. The Johnnies recorded a team GPA of 3.27, up from 3.24 each of the last two seasons. For a team to be

considered for the NSCAA Team Academic Award, it must have a composite team grade-point average of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) for all team members who appear on the official NCAA roster forms for the fall season.
