
Record-breaking Wilkinson headlines MIAC Men's Cross Country awards

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. – The Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) announced its men's cross country awards on Thursday. Carleton junior **Matt Wilkinson** was named MIAC Athlete of the Year, while his coach, **Dave Ricks**, received Coach of the Year honors. The MIAC also announced its All-Conference, Honorable Mention, and All-MIAC Sportsmanship Teams.

Wilkinson (Jr. | Greenwood, Minn. | Minnetonka) was named MIAC Athlete of the Year after taking individual honors at last Saturday's MIAC Championships. The junior finished in 24:37.4 - the fastest 8K time in MIAC Championship history by nearly seven seconds. He is the third consecutive Knight to win the MIAC individual title and Athlete of the Year honors in men's cross country.



Ricks was honored by his peers with Coach of the Year distinction for the third consecutive cross country season. Under his guidance, the Knights put three runners in the top-10 and all five scorers inside the top-20 of last weekend's MIAC Championship race. Ricks has previously received MIAC Coach of the Year accolades for cross country in 2017 and 2018, and indoor and outdoor track and field in 2018.

In addition to the top individual honors, the MIAC Men's Cross Country All-Conference and Honorable Mention squads were also recognized. The top 15 finishers in Saturday's MIAC Championship race received All-Conference honors, while finishers 16-25 received Honorable Mention. Carleton, St. Olaf, and St. Thomas each had three runners on the All-Conference Team, while Bethel, Gustavus, and Hamline all had a pair. The 15-runner All-Conference Team was comprised of six seniors, six juniors, and three sophomores. Carleton's **Cameron Meikle** became just the 10th runner in MIAC men's cross country history to earn four straight All-Conference honors, while fellow Knights **Matt Wilkinson** and **Lucas Mueller** joined Gustavus' **Andrew Stumbo** and St. Thomas' **Karl Wachter** as three-time honorees. Bethel's **Ezekiel Lelinga**, Hamline's **Frank Gustafson**, and St. Olaf's **Sam Primozich** and **Elliot Kadrofske** all earned All-Conference accolades for the second time.

As part of a Conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC also announced the 14th annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for Men's Cross Country. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
