2015 MIAC MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS PREVIEW

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- In recent years, the St. Olaf College men's cross country team has ascended to tremendous heights highlighted by a national championship, a national runner-up finish, and three consecutive Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships. Saturday, the Oles aim for an impressive fourth-straight conference title while the other 10 teams all try to dethrone the conference's recent king at the 2015 MIAC Men's Cross Country Championships at Como Golf Course in St. Paul, Minn.



Last year, St. Olaf was downright dominant en route to a third-straight MIAC championship with a miniscule score of 16 points as the Oles swept the top four individual spots and five of the top six places to win by 56 points. St. Olaf's score was the lowest recorded at the MIAC championships since Macalester scored 15 in back-to-back years in 1963 and 1964. The three-time defending champs are trying to become just the seventh team to win the MIAC title four (or more) straight times, and the first since Saint John's won four-straight from 1996 to 1999.

The Oles enter Saturday's 2015 championship race with aspirations of winning a fourth-straight title, and they carry a No. 1 Central Region ranking and a No. 4 national ranking into the conference meet. However, things will look a little different for St. Olaf this time around. Three-time MIAC individual champ Grant Wintheiser has graduated, along with fellow stars Jake Brown and Phillip Meyer, but Head Coach Phil Lundin still has plenty of talent back in Northfield. All-American senior stars Jake Campbell and Paul Escher are back to lead the way in 2015, and fellow senior Calvin Lehr and junior Joe Coffey give the Oles a strong, veteran nucleus to try and continue their reign.

The two teams with the biggest designs on knocking St. Olaf off its perch are the teams that finished second and third a year ago - Carleton (second, 72 points) and St. Thomas (third, 105 points). The Tommies are ranked 33rd in the nation and fifth in the Central Region, with the Knights right behind at No. 6 in the region rankings. Carleton will be led by senior star Hart Hornor who was the only non-St. Olaf runner in the top five last year, and he'll be joined by fellow All-MIAC teammates Jerry Cook-Gallardo and Jonah Barry. St. Thomas has All-MIAC seniors Jacob Gerhartz and Dylan Baumann back to lead the way in 2015 as UST will also try to topple St. Olaf.

Saint John's was fourth a year ago with 120 points and is currently ranked seventh in the Central Region, and the Johnnies hope to contend for another top-four finish in 2015. Saint John's has star senior Thomas Feichtinger back, who was seventh in the MIAC meet and a national qualifier last year, and he'll be joined by junior Ryan Bugler and senior Jake Burr. Hamline was just 12 points behind SJU a year ago in fifth, and the Pipers are also eyeing another top-five finish on Saturday. The Pipers will be led by senior Nathan Rock, who was 15th a year ago, and junior James Logan.

Gustavus has had a strong season with a No. 8 ranking in the Central Region after finishing sixth at the MIAC Championships last year with 155 points. Junior Thomas Knobbe returns after All-MIAC honors and a spot in the NCAA Championships in 2014, and he'll be joined by senior Paul Nordquist who has been the team's top runner this season. Saint Mary's also has an NCAA qualifier back in junior Jovan Newsum, who was an All-MIAC Honorable Mention runner in 2014, and Austin O'Hare and Sherman Moga are also back for the Cardinals who were seventh at the MIAC meet with 191 points a year ago.

Macalester has a pair of upperclassmen atop its otherwise young lineup as junior Lachlan Hinwood and senior Alex Ropes hope to lead the Scots upward to build on 2014's eight-place finish (201 points). Augsburg took ninth a year ago (225 points) and is looking for improvement under second-year Head Coach Meghan Peyton. She'll lean on top runners Abdullahi Salan and Mohamed Mohamed to lead the Auggies up the standings.

Bethel was 10th a year ago with 279 points, but the Royals have two key additions in 2015 - new Head Coach Joe Stephens and the return of senior star Matt Berens, who was an All-American in 2013 and missed 2014 with an injury. Concordia finished 11th a year ago (292 points) and will look to its top two runners all season - sophomore Brandon Quibell and senior Race Heitkamp - to spark some improvement at Saturday's 2015 championship race.

The women's 6k championship race will begin Saturday's meet at 2:15 p.m. and the men's 8k race will follow at 3:15 p.m. Once the results are tabulated and deemed final, a short awards ceremony will follow the conclusion of the men's race on the hillside near the clubhouse. The top 15 runners in each race will be honored as All-Conference selections, with runners finishing in places 16-to-25 receiving All-Conference Honorable Mention. The two team champions will also be honored and awarded their championship plaque.

Spectators are encouraged to attend the event and admission is free. All spectators are reminded to stay out of the runners' way on the course, and no dogs, bikes or artificial noisemakers are allowed on the course.

The MIAC has a <u>home page</u> for the event, which will be the first place to find results, recaps, photos and more online following the conclusion of the championships. The page also includes course maps for both the men's and women's races, directions to Como Park Golf Course and other helpful links. St. Olaf College is serving as the host institution for this year's championship and athletic training services will be provided by MIAC partner Twin Cities Orthopedic.

In addition to the preview, the MIAC also released a <u>promotional video</u> Wednesday to promote the big race. Fans can stay connected throughout the 2015 MIAC Cross Country Championships on social media through the MIAC's <u>Facebook</u> page, <u>Instagram</u> account or on <u>Twitter</u> using the hashtag #MIACXC.
