2011 MIAC Softball Awards

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The University of St. Thomas softball team proved to be the class of Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) in 2011, and that was reflected when the conference released its 2011 MIAC Softball Awards Tuesday, May 17. The league champ Tommies were honored with the Player-, Pitcher- and Coach-of-the-Year to headline the Awards.



St. Thomas junior **Kayla Boward** (Ostego, Minn./Elk River) was named the 2011 MIAC Player-of-the-Year for her outstanding season, particularly against conference foes. Overall, Boward hit .466 with 37 runs, 38 RBI, 13 doubles, a .647 slugging percentage, a .537 on-base percentage and she fielded at a .929 clip. However, Boward's conference numbers were even better as she led the league with a .567 batting average in MIAC games. She added 19 runs, 22 RBI, 10 doubles and two home runs to her impressive stat line in conference play while leading the Tommies to a perfect 22-0 MIAC record.

Boward's teammate, senior **Cassie Smith** (Elma, Iowa/New Hampton), was also a big reason for UST's conference title, and she was honored as the 2011 MIAC Pitcher-of-the-Year. Overall, Smith went 13-1 with a 2.36 ERA. She had five complete games, four complete-game shutouts and three shared shutouts. Smith allowed just 32 earned runs with 73 hits, 41 walks and 76 strikeouts in 95 innings, and opposing hitters managed just a .203 average against her in 2011. Like her team, Smith was unbeaten in conference play, going 8-0 with a miniscule 1.32 ERA. In 47.2 innings she allowed just nine earned runs on 27 hits and 16 walks with 46 strikeouts.

As a result of his team's success, St. Thomas' **John Tschida** was voted the 2011 MIAC Coach-of-the-Year for the ninth time in his career and fifth time while leading the Tommies. Tschida led UST to a perfect 22-0 record in conference play to claim its second-straight MIAC title and ninth in the past 11 years. St. Thomas added the 2011 MIAC Softball Playoff title last weekend by going 3-0 to win the event for the eighth-straight season, improving to a perfect 24-0 in the history of the event. Tschida's team had a 31-game winning streak this season, and was a perfect 25-0 against MIAC opponents. St. Thomas finished 42-6 overall and reached the Region championship, where it was eliminated in a 4-3 loss to fourth-ranked Luther College. This is Tschida's first MIAC Coach-of-the-Year honor since 2007 after winning the award four years in a row from 2004-2007. He also won the MIAC's coaching award four times from 1995 to 1999 while he was the head coach at Saint Mary's University.

The MIAC's other individual honor went to Carleton College freshman **Jenny Ramey** (Cottage Grove, Minn./New Life Academy), who played like a seasoned veteran in her first season with the Knights. Overall, Ramey hit .463 with 39 runs, 56 hits, four triples, five home runs, 15 stolen bases, a .678 slugging percentage and a .515 on-base percentage. She was her team's leader in all of those categories. In conference play, Ramey's .508 batting average ranked third in the league to go along with 22 runs, nine RBI, 33 hits and four home runs.

The league-champion Tommies and second-place Gustavus Adolphus College had the most All-Conference selections, with four apiece. Saint Mary's and Hamline University each placed three players on the 23-member team and Bethel University had two players honored. Augsburg College, Carleton College, Concordia College, Macalester College, College of Saint Benedict, St. Catherine University and St. Olaf College each had on representative on the team.

Eight of the 23 players were returning All-Conference selections. This was the third year in a row Bethel's **Kelly Berg** and Gustavus' **Lisa Klass** earned All-MIAC honors, and it was also the third selection for Saint Mary's **Katy Gannon**, who was also named All-Conference in 2008 and 2010. Augsburg's **Jessa Hinz**, Concordia's **Kesley Jones**, Hamline's **Heidi Larsen** and St. Thomas' **Sydney Marquardt** were all repeat selections from last year's squad, and Saint Mary's **Mallory Betzold** returned to the All-MIAC team after receiving the honor in 2009.

As part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC announced the fifth annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for softball. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
