St. Olaf's Graf and St. Catherine duo headline 2017 MIAC Softball Awards

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. -- The 2017 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) softball season was full of surprises, parity and plenty of unforgettable games and moments. Wednesday, the top performers from the season were honored with the announcement of the 2017 MIAC Softball Awards.

St. Olaf's first year pitcher Julie Graff (Sammamish, Wash. / Eastlake) was not only named the Rookie-of-the-Year, but also the Pitcher-of-the-Year in recognition for her outstanding season. St. Catherine duo sophomore Jenna George (Ellsworth, Wis.) was honored with the Player-of-the-Year award and her coach, Colleen Powers was honored by her peers with the Coach-of-the-Year award. The conference also announced the 2017 MIAC All-Conference Team, the All-Conference Honorable Mention Team and the All-MIAC Sportsmanship Team.

Julie Graff made her MIAC debut with an outstanding season receiving both the 2017 Rookie-of-the-Year and Pitcher-of-the-Year. Julie Graf had one of the best seasons in St. Olaf's history. As a National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) First Team All-Region selection, she posted a 0.73 ERA to go with school records for strikeouts (272), wins (22) and complete games (21). She was 22-5 and allowed one or less earned run in all but five of her 31 appearances. She was the MIAC's Pitcher of the Week four times and had two five-game stretches where she did not allow a run. She also led the MIAC in most statistical categories, including strikeouts by more than one hundred.



Graf kept St. Olaf in the hunt for a playoff spot down the stretch as she pitched in each of the team's final 14 conference games. Her best day was a double shutout of Gustavus on April 23 when she allowed just three hits in 14 innings, walking three while striking out a combined 28.

George earned the MIAC's highest honor after a career season both in the field and at the plate. The sophomore third baseman led the team and the MIAC in multiple offensive categories during the regular season, including slugging percentage (.851), on base percentage RBI (50), and home runs (10) and finished the season ranked second in the MIAC in overall batting average (.465). George was dangerously good in conference play, as she led the MIAC in slugging percentage (.891), total bases (57), home runs (7) and RBI (33) versus conference opponents.

George received multiple accolades during the 2017 softball season thanks to her outstanding play. She was named MIAC Athlete-of-the-Week three times during the regular season, HERO's Division III Player-of-the-Week, and was the first player from St. Kate's nominated for the NFCA Division III Player-of-the-Year award. George also made the 2017 MIAC All-Tournament team after going 3-7 at the plate with three runs, two RBI and three walks. George also cemented her place in the Wildcat record books, as she broke three school records and tied one in just her second season with the program. George broke St. Kate's school record for single season slugging percentage (.851), RBI (50), and walks (24) and tied the school record for single season home runs (10).

Powers earned her second consecutive Coach-of-the-Year honor after leading the Wildcats to their best finish in the MIAC standings in program history. With Powers at the helm, the Wildcats posted a 28-11 overall record during the regular season and went 17-5 in MIAC play to finish in second place in the conference standings. She also guided the Wildcats to their first ever MIAC Playoff and NCAA Regional Championships despite losing 2016 MIAC Softball Player-of-the-Year Robyn Rohr to graduation.

Powers also reached several milestones during the 2017 season, as she earned the 100th victory of her career with St. Kate's 3-1 win over Hamline in the MIAC Playoffs. Since taking over the program in 2014, Powers has only posted one losing record and has turned the Wildcats into not only one of the top programs in the MIAC but the nation as well. In four years, Powers has a career record of 106-58 and a 52-34 record in MIAC play.

The conference honored a 36-player All-Conference Team and a 12-player All-Conference Honorable Mention Team. As part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC also announced the 11th-annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for baseball. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
