2013 MIAC Softball Preview and Preseason Coaches' Poll

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The 2012 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) softball season had two significant storylines - the battle at the top for the conference title, and the parity throughout the remaining 10 teams. As the MIAC's softball teams prepare to throw out the first pitch of the 2013 season, it appears St. Thomas and Gustavus are prepared to contend once again, but a strong crop of challengers are eager to make it more than a two-team race this time around.



The Tommies and Gusties were both nearly perfect in their quest for the MIAC title a year ago. They split their head-to-head series, but the Tommies swept their other 10 conference foes, and one other loss by Gustavus (20-2) was enough to give 21-1 UST its third-straight title. St. Thomas also went 2-1 against Gustavus to claim the MIAC Playoff title as well, giving Gustavus a pair of second-place finishes in 2012.

There was a significant gap between that duo and the rest of the league, which demonstrated both how good the MIAC's top two teams were, and the parity throughout the rest of a very deep conference. Augsburg (13-9) and Saint Mary's (11-1) grabbed the final two playoff spots, with five other teams in contention for postseason bids deep into the season. In fact, just seven games separated the final 10 spots in the 2012 MIAC standings.

Bethel, Saint Benedict and St. Olaf were a game out of the Playoffs in a three-way tie for fifth at 10-12, with Hamline and a surprising Macalester squad just another game back at 9-13 in league play. St. Catherine was 7-15, and Carleton and Concordia each went 6-16 in the MIAC in 2012.

The 2013 season starts later this month, and the MIAC should feature incredible parity yet again. However, it's possible the gap between St. Thomas and Gustavus and the rest of the league has closed, which could make for an incredibly intriguing season of conference play, and a must-see MIAC Softball Playoff tournament in early May.

Familiar two at the top

History is destined to repeat itself, at least in the eyes of the MIAC softball coaches, if their Preseason Poll is any indication. A year ago, St. Thomas and Gustavus battled atop the standings and again in the MIAC Softball Playoff championship, with the Tommies taking both titles. In fact, either UST or Gustavus has claimed each of the last 11 MIAC titles, with UST winning in 2002, 2004-08 and 2010-12, and the Gusties claiming the 2003 and 2009 titles.

The two rivals are again predicted to lead the league, with St. Thomas receiving 121 and 11 first-place votes to finish unanimously in first, as coaches are not allowed to vote for their own team. The Gusties received the other first-place vote and 111 points to grab the No. 2 spot in the poll.

The coaches also expect the four-team MIAC Playoff field to have an identical feel in 2013, although they expect the race for third to be too close to call. Both Augsburg and Saint Mary's - MIAC Playoff teams a year ago - received 92 points each to finish in a tie for third. There was a 20-point gap in the poll between third and fifth, but the next three spots were separated by just 10 points, as Bethel (72), Saint Benedict (68) and Hamline (62) finished fifth, sixth and seventh, respectively.

St. Olaf received 55 points to come in eight place, six points ahead of No. 9 Macalester. St. Catherine rounded out the top 10 in the poll with 32 points, with Carleton (20 points) edging Concordia (18 points) by just two points in the final two spots in the preseason predictions.

What's new?

Two MIAC teams enter the 2013 season under the direction of new head coaches, but neither is a stranger to the dugouts and diamonds around the league. **Rachael Click** embarks on her first season as the new Saint Benedict head coach, returning to the MIAC after a decorated playing career at Gustavus from 2006-2009. The former MIAC Player-of-the-Year and All-American replaces **Denny Johnson** and his 522 career coaching victories, though he remains with the Blazers as an assistant to Click.

Concordia also has new leadership, as **Mike Reese** replaces **Megan Johnson** after spending six season as the pitching coach for the Cobber baseball team. Reese brings more than 30 years of baseball and softball experience to Concordia's dugout.

With Johnson's transition to his new role, that means there is also a change to the league's longest-tenured coaches. St. Catherine Head Coach **Madge Makowske** is now the dean of MIAC coaches as she enters her 18th season on the bench. Carleton's **Amy Erickson** isn't far behind, as she starts her 16th season with the Knights.

Who's back?

Who's back in the MIAC in 2013? In a word ... everyone. Amazingly, only three of the 38 All-MIAC First Team and Honorable Mention selections were seniors a year ago, and among the numerous returning All-Conference selections are the league's top three award winners. St. Thomas returns both the MIAC Player-of-the-Year in senior **Kimmy Hassel** and MIAC Pitcher-of-the-Year in sophomore **Kendra Bowe**, and MIAC Rookie-of-the-Year **Sarah Rozell** returns to the Gustavus lineup for her sophomore season.

If the Tommies look loaded again for reigning MIAC Coach-of-the-Year **John Tschida**, it's because they are. In addition to Hassel, who hit .487 with 41 RBI, and Bowe, who was 22-3 with a 1.33 ERA, St. Thomas didn't have a single senior among its five total All-MIAC selections, which included catcher **Emily Gregory** and shortstop **Jenna Hoffman**.

Gustavus returns just as much firepower, despite the loss of star second baseman **Lisa Klass**. Rozell was 11-0 with an 0.80 ERA in MIAC play a year ago while also hitting .317. Two-time All-MIAC selection **Kate Rentschler** (17-4, 1.98 ERA, .329 batting average) and All-MIAC outfielder **Brittany Benke** (.333 average, 25 runs) also return for Head Coach Jeff Annis in 2013.

Augsburg will try to replace graduated star pitcher **Kylee Persing**, but also has a talented core back, led by All-MIAC shortstop **Allyson Ruedy**, who hit .377 with 30 RBI. Senior **Bri Dorale** - a 2010 All-MIAC pick - also returns and can play second or in the outfield for the Auggies. Saint Mary's welcomes back an All-MIAC trio, featuring First-Team selections **Erin Stenseth** and **Alex Raske** and Honorable Mention selection **Hailey Ohl**. All three hit better than .340 a year ago and combined to score 81 runs.

Bethel's hopes to return to the MIAC Playoffs are bolstered by an All-Conference duo. Outfielder **Rachel Gilbert** was tremendous as a junior, hitting .418 with 22 RBI, and infielder **Kalyn Sorenson** batted .311 and drove in 23 runs. Saint Benedict also has a pair of All-MIAC First Team juniors back in the lineup in outfielder **Lexi Alm** (.438 batting average, .786 slugging percentage) and pitcher **Rachel Nelson** (11-9, 1.78 ERA). Hamline will again be led by All-MIAC outfielder **Bethany Hine**, who hit .379 in 2012, and Honorable Mention outfielder **Laura Randall**, who hit .369 a year ago.

St. Olaf welcomes back All-MIAC Honorable Mention selections Jess Green (9-9, 2.58 ERA) and **Amy Prok** as well as **Christiana Miller** and her team-high .319 average. The middle of the Macalester order will again be bolstered by junior two-time All-MIAC outfielder **Cleo Nagy**, who is already the school's career leader in home runs with 13. All-MIAC Honorable Mention pitcher and utility player **Miranda Stokes** will also lend her versatility to the Scots again in 2013. Nagy and Stokes combined for 17 homers a year ago.

St. Catherine has one of the league's top hitters back in the outfield, as All-MIAC junior Alyssa Luedtke and her .487 average and 63 hits return to the Wildcats lineup. **Jenna (Brady) Ratliff** also returns for Makowske's crew after All-MIAC Honorable Mention honors as a sophomore. Carleton brings back All-MIAC pick **Chelsea Yost**, who will both hit (.365) and pitch (3-3, 3.89 ERA) for the Knights, with 2011 MIAC Rookie-of-the-Year **Jenny Ramey** back at shortstop for her third season. Concordia has senior slugger **Kaia Sele** - an All-MIAC pick - back at first base this season, and she needs just two more hits to become the school's all-time leader in that category. Honorable Mention selection **Joelle Link** (OF/P) also returns for the Cobbers' in Reese's debut season.

Circle these dates

Though temperatures have routinely been below zero and snow continues to fall in Minnesota, the first softball games of the 2013 season are a little more than two weeks away. Augsburg and St. Catherine both open with indoor games at the Vadnais Heights (Minn.) dome, and the rest of the league takes the field when the calendar flips to March.

The first MIAC contests of the season are set to start March 27, and the league's 12 teams will engage in 22 conference games over exactly one month. The final regular-season MIAC doubleheaders are scheduled for April 27, with plenty of intriguing dates crammed into those four weeks. The top two teams in the Coaches' Poll will meet for a MIAC doubleheader on April 13, with St. Thomas hosting Gustavus for a 1 p.m. twin bill that could decide the league title and Playoff positioning.

Augsburg and Saint Mary's - the league's other two postseason squads from a year ago - will open MIAC play against one another, with the Cardinals visiting the Auggies on March 28 at 4 p.m. The other top Playoff contenders will square off in crucial April doubleheaders, with Saint Benedict heading to Bethel on April 6 at 1 p.m., and Hamline hosting St. Olaf on April 18 at 3:30 p.m.

Macalester will host St. Catherine on April 4 at 3:30 p.m. in a good St. Paul cross-town rivalry, as both teams try to climb the MIAC ladder higher in 2012. Carleton and Concordia also meet early in the season - April 2 at Carleton at 3:30 p.m. - in an important MIAC twin bill for two teams trying to show marked improvement from a year ago.

The top four teams will advance to the 2013 MIAC Softball Playoffs, which will be hosted by Gustavus at Caswell Park in Mankato, Minn., on May 3-4. There are four games scheduled for Friday, May 3, with two games - and a third, if necessary, set for Saturday, May 4 as the league determines its postseason champ with a double elimination tournament. The winner will receive the MIAC's automatic bid to the 2013 NCAA Division III Softball Tournament.

Did You Know?

Augsburg's Bri Dorale enters her senior season with 57 stolen bases in 64 attempts, the third-best total in school history. Augsburg's Tully
Kaiser (1996-98, 2000) holds the school record with 108 stolen bases, the second-most total of any MIAC player (Carrie Embree of St.
Thomas, 2004-07, had 109 stolen bases in her career).

- 201: Throughout the 2012 campaign, Bethel scored the third most runs among all conference teams. The Royals crossed home plate 201 times, but a league-leading 103 errors and 63 stolen bases against kept Bethel one game away from advancing to the postseason. This stat alone gives BU great optimism in 2013.
- 87: The Royals showed exceptional patience at the plate a year ago, as BU recorded 87 walks in 1,111 plate appearances, ranking third among all teams conference-wide. Paving the way for Bethel was Rachel Gilbert, who led the league in individual walks with 22 free passes in 40 games played.
- 31: Bethel's softball squad, together with Hamline, recorded the most hits in a game by both teams throughout the 2012 season, as the Royals and Pipers recorded 31 hits collectively on April 29, 2012. BU outhit Hamline 17-14, but failed to capture the victory in a 13-9 defeat.

Did You Know?

• The Royals have big shoes to fill on the pitching mound in 2013, as Genna Bock and Anja Erlandson collectively pitched 226.1 innings last year—of a total 265.2 innings pitched. With both graduating, Bethel will have to find enough arms to take on over 85 percent of the pitching responsibilities from a year ago.

• Rachel Gilbert was not only dynamic on the field last year, but also in the classroom and in the community. 2012 welcomed an All-MIAC and NFCA All-Region Third Team award for the Becker, Minn., native, but it also embraced Gilbert as an MIAC Academic All-Conference player and a member of the 2012 MIAC All-Sportsmanship team. Gilbert was one of four softball players to receive the MIAC academic accolade, as Genna Bock, Cristina Masten, and Megan Matson also captured the top honor.
