Paige Bromen, St. Olaf

St. Olaf College sophomore Paige Bromen (Stillwater, Minn.) fired rounds of 79-77-156, to earn runner-up medalist honors at the MWCGA Championship. Bromen's two day total of 156 is a new school record for 36-holes and her final round 77 tied the school record set by Martha Nause in 1976 for an 18-hole score. Her scores helped St. Olaf shoot a school record 342 the second day to finish third, the best finish for the Oles in the MWCGA Championship.

Maureen Hardwick, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas senior Maureen Hardwick (Warroad, Minn.) posted back-to-back rounds of six-over par 78 to earn medalist honors at the Carleton Invitational, besting UW-Eau Claire's Maggie Loney and Buena Vista's Jennifer Stork by one shot each. It marked Hardwick's third career victory and sixth career top-two finish. Her two-day total of 156 was a new tournament record and helped the third-ranked Tommies win the event with a team score of 657. It marked UST's fifth team victory of the season.

Kelli Groff, Gustavus

Gustavus Adolphus College senior Kelli Groff (Bloomington, Minn.) fired rounds of 74-79--153 to win the 11-team Wartburg Invitational in a field that consisted of third-ranked St. Thomas, fourth-ranked Gustavus, 10th-ranked Wartburg, 18th-ranked Buena Vista and 22nd-ranked Loras. Her scores helped the Gusties take the team title with a two-day total of 644, six shots clear of tournament host Wartburg. It marked Groff's second win of the season and lowered her stroke average to 79.30.

Maureen Hardwick, St. Thomas

Week of: 2005-10-11

University of St. Thomas senior Maureen Hardwick (Warroad, Minn.) helped led the Tommies to their fifth consecutive MIAC Women's Golf Championship. Hardwick shot a 76-85=161 and won medalist honors by two strokes. Hardwick had her fourth top-five career MIAC finish. She had placed first, fourth and second in her three previous MIAC Championship meets.

Kerry Shea, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas senior Kerry Shea (Owatonna, Minn.) fired a school-record one-over par 73 to win the St. Benedict Invitational at GreyStone Golf Club in Sauk Centre, Minn. Her two-day total of 150 led the Tommies to a school-record 629 total as the Tommies won the event. Shea's finish led a Tommie sweep of the top-three individual slots. Shea's 73 on Sunday is believed to be a Tommie school record for low round -- Katie Glorvigen had a round of 74 last spring. The Tommies, ranked eighth in the latest NGCA/Division III coaches poll, and are the four-time defending MIAC champions heading into this weekend's conference championship.

Kelli Groff, Gustavus

Gustavus Adolphus College senior Kelli Groff (Bloomington, Minn. / Jefferson) has earned the MIAC women's golfer of the week award, for the second time this season. The defending MIAC champion fired a 36-hole total of two-over par 146 to win the Division III Midwest Classic, held at Victory Links at the National Youth Golf Center in Blaine, Minn. The 36-hole score is a Gustavus school record, as was her final round of even-par 72, which broke the previous record she set in the first round of two-over par 74. Groff's performance helped the Gusties win the 10-team event with a school-record 36-hole total of 624, including a final-round 311, an 18-hole school record score.

Kassie Wells, Carleton

Carleton College junior Kassie Wells (Rochester, Minn./Century) notched her second collegiate win and set a new Carleton scoring record with a three-over par 75 at the Luther Women's Invitational on Monday. Wells fired a one-under par 35 on her second nine holes and carded a school-record five birdies, including consecutive birdies to end the round. She eclipsed the previous school scoring record held by herself

and Emily Skinner at 77, while her three-over par set a new record in relation to par that was previously at five-over par and held by Wells, Skinner and Kelly Lewis. The round followed a record-tying 77 in last week's Concordia Invitational.

Maureen Hardwick, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas senior Maureen Hardwick (Warroad, Minn.) fired a final-round four-over par 76 at the Concordia Invitaitonal this past weekend, leading the Tommies to a third place finish and first among MIAC schools. Hardwick tallied a 12-over par 156 to tie for third individually. It marked the second straight week the senior has finished third, as she was third in last week's UW-Eau Claire Invite. Hardwick has posted a scoring average of 81 this fall.

Kelli Groff, Gustavus

Gustavus Adolphus College senior Kelli Groff (Bloomington, Minn. / Jefferson), the defending MIAC champion, opened her 2005-06 season by firing rounds of 78 and 77 to finish second in the UW-Eau Claire BluGold Invitational. Groff's finish came against one of the best fields in Division III golf, as the tourney featured three teams that qualified for the 2005 NCAA Championships and eight teams ranked in the final 2004-05 NCAA/Golfstat top 25. She led the Gusties to a second-place team finish as well.
