Katie Schenfeld, Gustavus

St. Paul, Minn. -- The Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) announced the 2009-10 MIAC Women's Golf Awards today, May 10, 2010. Leading the award winners is MIAC Player of the Year Katie Schenfeld of Gustavus Adolphus College.

Also receiving honors were: Gustavus' Kali Griggs (MIAC Senior of the Year), Carleton's Hope Keaney (MIAC Rookie of the Year) and Gustavus' Scott Moe (MIAC Coach of the Year).



As part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC announced the fourth annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for women's golf. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.

MIAC Player of the Year - Katie Schenfeld, Gustavus Adolphus College

Schenfeld (Jr., Indianola, Iowa) has the lowest stroke average in the MIAC at 78.2 for the 2009-10 season. She has won four tournaments this season (Division III Midwest Classic, MIAC Championships, Augustana Invitational, St. Thomas Invitational). Schenfeld won the MIAC title by four strokes with a three-day total of 236.

MIAC Senior of the Year - Kali Griggs, Gustavus Adolphus College

Griggs (Sr., Burnsville, Minn./Visitation) has the lowest average of any MIAC senior with her 79.6 scoring average. She recorded four top-five finishes this season including a tie for first at the Division III Midwest Classic. Griggs placed fifth at the MIAC Championships with a three-day total of 245.

MIAC Rookie of the Year - Hope Keaney, Carleton College

Keaney (Fy., San Anselmo, Calif./Marin Catholic) tallied eight top-20 finishes in ten starts, including a pair of runner-up finishes. She was the top rookie finisher at the MIAC Championships with a three-round total of 260. Keaney finishes her first collegiate season with a 85.6 average over 22 rounds.

MIAC Coach of the Year - Scott Moe, Gustavus Adolphus College

Gustavus Adolphus College head coach Scott Moe led Gustavus to the program's second straight MIAC Championship in October. Moe's Gusties dominated the three-day event winning by 46 strokes. Moe had four players finish in the top seven at the championships and earn All-MIAC honors. Gustavus will begin their quest for a NCAA Championship tomorrow at Howey-in-the-Hills, Fla.
