

Opening weekends don't get much bigger than the one Hamline's Brandon Zurn (Mahtomedi, Minn.) had at the 2015 MIAC Men's Hockey Showcase. The senior forward scored five goals and added two





Zurn a got off to a great start with a goal and an assist in Saturday's overtime tie with Gustavus. Though the game went down as a tie in the standings, the two teams held a shootout following overtime, with Zurn delivering the winning goal for the Pipers.

However, Saturday just turned out to be the appetizer to Sunday's main course, as Zurn scored four goals and added an assist in an 8-5 win over Saint Mary's. He had three power-play goals and one short-handed goals en route to the hat trick in a rematch of last year's MIAC Playoff championship game. Thus far this season, Zurn's five goals and seven points lead all MIAC skaters.

Thanks to the big opening weekend on the MIAC's big stage, Hamline is off to a 1-0-1 start to the 2015 season and the Pipers are currently receiving votes in the D3hockey.com Top 15 national poll. This weekend, Zurn and company hope to stay hot as conference play begins with a home-and-home series with St. Olaf. The Pipers head to Northfield for Friday's 7:30 p.m. game, then will host the Oles at Oscar Johnson Arena in St. Paul Saturday at 7 p.m.

Marah Shields, Saint Mary's Milford, Mich. / Honeybaked

Saint Mary's Marah Shields certainly knows how to make an entrance. The Cardinals' junior goalie starred in her 2015-16 season debut, as she was greeted by 81 shots from a feisty UW-Superior team. She stood up to the barrage admirably, making a school-record 79 saves, which is No. 6 on the Division III all-time singlegame saves leader board. For her historic performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Shields Monday with the first MIAC Women's Hockey Athlete-of-the-Week awards.

Shields' remarkable effort in goal didn't receive any offensive support, and the two goals she allowed in 81 shots were the difference in a 2-0 loss to the Yellowjackets. The Cardinal junior made 33 saves in the second period alone, and she already had a new school record (55 saves) by the second intermission. Shields kept

UW-Superior off the board until the final period, and finished with a .975 save percentage in her season debut. After one weekend of play, Shields leads the MIAC in total saves by more than 30, even though she played just one game, and her .975 save percentage also ranks No. 1 in the league.

The Cardinals won Friday's game and finished the opening weekend with an even record of 1-1. The team and Shields will receive a much needed break this weekend as they rest up and prepare for the start of conference play. Saint Mary's returns to the ice for a big home-and-home series with Bethel to open MIAC play. The Cardinals host the Royals on Friday, Nov. 13, at 7 p.m., then return the favor Saturday, Nov. 14, with a 3 p.m. game at the Schwan Super Rink in Blaine, Minn.






MIAC Men's Hockey Athlete-of-the-Week

Alex Reichle, Concordia Wildwood, Mo. / Eureka

The Concordia men's hockey team started off MIAC play in style with a rare road sweep of Saint John's over the weekend in St. Cloud, Minn.
Sophomore goalie Alex Reichle (Wildwood, Mo./Eureka) had a huge





percentage. He stopped 69 of 72 shots while leading the Cobbers to just their second-ever sweep of the Johnnies at the Herb Brooks National Hockey Center. For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Reichle Monday with the MIAC Men's Hockey Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Reichle allowed a goal in the second minute of Friday's game, but was a wall the rest of the way, stopping all of Saint John's remaining 32 shots to help his team earn a 3-1 victory that was aided by a late empty-net goal. Saturday, Reichle stopped the first 21 shots he faced to help Concordia build a 2-0 lead, and he stopped 16 of 17 shots in the third period to give the Cobbers the 3-2 win. Thus far in 2015, Reichle leads the MIAC with three wins, he ranks second with a .935 save percentage and third in goals against average (2.00).

Thanks to the sweep, Concordia is off to a perfect 2-0 start in conference play and leads the standings with six points. The team also improved to 3-1 overall. Reichle and the Cobbers will try to stay hot this weekend in their home debut as they host a pair of Wisconsin schools in nonconference action. UW-Stevens Point visits Moorhead on Friday for an 8 p.m. game, and UW-Eau Claire will visit Concordia Saturday for a 7 p.m. contest, both at the Moorhead Sports Center.

Westmark led the way with a three-point weekend with two goals and an assist, including one goal that forced overtime. For her performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Westmark Monday with the MIAC Women's Hockey Athlete-of-the-Week awards.

Westmark started off with an assist and two shots Friday as her team lost its season opener 5-4 at 11th-ranked UWSP. She was even better a night later, scoring two goals and getting off six shots. 





Klug's picture-perfect weekend started with a 27-save shutout of the Blazers on Friday night as the Cobbers rolled to a 5-0 victory. She was even better a day later in a closer game, as she made 29 saves and shut out Saint Ben's again in Saturday's 3-0 victory to finish off the sweep. Klug became the first Concordia goalie to

post back-to-back shutouts since 2012-13. Klug's big weekend improved her record to 2-1 in goal with a 1.68 goals against average and a .944 save percentage. She ranks in the top five in all goalie statistical categories in overall games, and she leads the conference in MIAC games only with her 56 saves, 1.000 save percentage, 0.00 goals against average, two wins and two shutouts.

Thanks to the two wins, the Cobbers improved to 2-2 overall and they're one of two teams - along with Augsburg - to start the season with a conference sweep. Concordia and the Auggies each have four points to share first place in the MIAC. Saxton Soley (Elk Mound, Wis. / Eau Claire Memorial) in the two big wins, as he made 67 saves with a .944 save percentage and a 2.00 goals against average against the high-powered Piper offense. For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Soley Monday with the MIAC men's Hockey Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Soley's big weekend started with a 30-save, one-goal performance in Friday's 2-1 home win over Hamline, as he limited a team averaging more than four goals per game to just the lone tally. He kept SJU in the game, which ended with the Johnnies scoring the game-winner with just 30 seconds left in regulation. Soley followed that up by stopping 37 of 40 shots Saturday to help his team score a one-goal win again (4-3) as he notched his 40th career victory. Soley's career record is now 40-24-8. This season, Soley's 241 saves lead the MIAC, his .920 save percentage ranks third in the league and his 2.52 goals against average ranks fifth.

Thanks to the sweep, Saint John's got its first two wins of the season and improved to 2-4-2 overall and evened its MIAC record at 2-2. The Johnnies now have six points, and are in a tie for third place in the MIAC standings. The team hopes its success continues with a big holiday-week trip to New York coming up. Friday, Soley and company play at Utica College in Utica, N.Y., at 6 p.m., and they'll take on Oswego State in Utica Saturday at 3 p.m.

If Concordia goalie Andrea Klug's (West Fargo, N.D.) play in the crease gets any hotter, she's going to start melting the ice. The Cobber junior continued her shutout streak to help the team earn another MIAC sweep - this time over St. Catherine - over the weekend. Klug made 42 total saves in 119:46 of ice time without allowing a goal, and she now has stopped 100-straight shots over 250 minutes in her streak of four-straight shutouts. For her performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Klug with her second-straight MIAC Women's Hockey Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Klug continued her red-hot play by leading Concordia to a 1-0 victory Friday and a 3-0 win Saturday, both at home, over the Wildcats. She stopped 12 shots in 59:46 Friday, and was outstanding on Saturday with 30 saves, including several against seven St. Kate's power plays and a 5-on-3 situation. The four-straight

shutouts are a Cobber program record, and her 30 saves Saturday were the most in a single game during her remarkable streak. This season, Klug is 4-1 with 127 saves, a .962 save percentage and a 1.00 goals against average to rank in the top four in the MIAC in each category. In conference play, she's the league leader in wins (four), saves (98), save percentage (1.000) and goals against average (0.00). Klug is second in the nation in shutouts, and ranked in the top 15 in Division III in goals against average, save percentage and winning percentage.

Thanks to Klug's continued excellence, Concordia is now 4-2 overall with a four-game winning streak, and the team is off to its first-ever 4-0 start in conference play. The Cobbers have eight points to sit alone atop the MIAC standings. The team - and Klug - will try to keep the streak alive this weekend with another home series. Concordia hosts Marian (Wis.) 



For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Reichle Monday with the MIAC Men's Hockey Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Reichle's big weekend started with 27 saves and three goals allowed in Friday's 6-3 win over SMU. However, he saved his best for the weekend finale, as he stopped all 19 shots he faced to shut out the powerful Cardinal offense in a 2-0 Concordia victory. it was the first time in 28 games that Saint Mary's had failed to score at least one goal. This season, Reichle ranks in the top five in the MIAC in wins (five), saves (213), save percentage (.906) and goals against average (2.87) overall, and he leads the MIAC with a 1.50 GAA, a .950 save percentage and a perfect 1.000 win percentage in conference play.

Thanks to the huge sweep, the Cobbers are off to a perfect 4-0 start in conference play and are 5-3 overall. Concordia has 12 points in the MIAC standings, and trails only St. Thomas, which has played two more games. It's the first time the Cobbers have started 4-0 in the MIAC since 1999-2000.
