

2014 MIAC WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD CONFERENCE PREVIEW

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- A year ago, the University of St. Thomas women's track team swept the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field championships, which was nothing new considering the Tommies have won 26 of 29 indoor titles and 29 of 32 outdoor titles in an impressive run of success. But, as the 2014 track and field season rapidly approaches, UST's top contenders around the league enter the new season with hope of ending their reign.



Head Coach Joe Sweeney and his St. Thomas team have certainly been a track and field dynasty over the past three-plus decades. This year, they'll look for their 15th-straight indoor conference crown, and will try to extend their outdoor championship streak to an even 10. The leading contenders to take down the Tommies are 2013's indoor runner-up St. Olaf and outdoor runner-up Concordia, as well as Saint Benedict, Gustavus and cross country-champ Carleton. Bethel and Hamline could also be in the mix near the top of the standings, and Augsburg, Saint Mary's and St. Catherine also aspire to ascend the conference standings in 2014.

The Tommies grabbed their 14th-straight indoor title a year ago on St. Olaf's track by scoring 180 points and nearly outscoring the rest of the field by triple digits. The host Oles came in second with 83 points to lead a crowded group of evenly-matched teams. Saint Benedict was third at 81, just two points back of St. Olaf, and Gustavus (75), Carleton (74) and Bethel (73) made for a close contest for spots two through six. Concordia (58) edged Macalester (52) and Hamline (51) for seventh, and Augsburg wasn't far behind that trio in 10th with 45 points. Saint Mary's (7) and St. Catherine (0) rounded out the final two spots.

In addition, the MIAC Indoor meet had numerous records fall a year ago. St. Thomas' Taylor Berg set a new meet record in the 1,000-meter run (2:52.37). St. Olaf's Emma Lee thrilled the home crowd with a record in the 5,000-meter run (17:14.31). Hamline's Becky Culp set a new shot put record (47-3.5) and Gustavus' Allyson Voss soared to new heights in the pole vault (12-4.5).

The outdoor meet was a little closer in 2013, thought it ended with the Tommies celebrating on their home track. UST claimed its ninth-straight title with 140.5 point and a 28.5-point victory over runner-up Concordia (112). The Oles were just eight points behind the Cobbers with 104, and the Blazers also hit triple digits with an even 100. Hamline finished out the top five with 93.5 points. Gustavus (83) came in sixth, Carleton was seventh (73) and Bethel (47.5) beat out Macalester (47) for eighth by a half-point. Augsburg (39.5), St. Catherine (13.5) and Saint Mary's (6) rounded out the rest of the standings.

Culp and Voss both worked their way into the record books at the MIAC Outdoor Championship as well. Culp added the outdoor shot put record to her stellar season (47-10) and Voss grabbed the outdoor pole vault record as well (12-5.5), besting the old mark by a quarter-inch.

With the 2014 season set to start, the top question remains whether or not St. Thomas will win titles No. 15 and No. 10 in a row and continue their dominance. Or will one of the contenders rise up and find a way to take down UST? Last season was filled with individual highlights and record-breaking performances as well, and with a lot of talent back the record book could be in danger of changing once again.

WHAT'S NEW?

It was an offseason of change for many of the MIAC track and field programs, resulting in one new head coach and a pair of interim assignments. Saint Mary's welcomes new coach Niels Anderson, who replaces the departed Shawn McMahon. Anderson comes to SMU from nearby La Crosse, Wis., after a successful stint coaching the La Crosse Central high school squads.

There were also mid-season changes at Augsburg and Macalester, with a pair of longtime coaches moving on and assistants stepping in to lead in the interim. Both Dennis Barker and Augsburg and Martin Peper at Macalester recently announced their resignations after long, successful tenures at their respective posts. Peper and Barker had both spent 20 seasons with their respective teams. At Macalester, head cross country coaches Betsy Emerson and Matt Haugen have stepped in to lead the track programs, and former assistant Jarred Sampson has taken over for the Auggies, so even though their roles are new, these coaches will be familiar faces around the MIAC track facilities.

St. Thomas' Joe Sweeney is the longest-tenured coach in the conference as he begins his 34th season leading the Tommies. Carleton's Donna Ricks and Hamline's Shawn Johnson-Hipp are both beginning their 21st seasons at their respective schools, and Concordia's Marv Roeske enters his 19th season with the Cobbers.

WHO'S BACK?

St. Thomas has to say goodbye to Berg who ended her outstanding career in record-setting and All-American fashion last spring, but Sweeney's team has tons of talent coming back. Senior Emily Van Heel is one of the league's most decorated sprinters and jumpers, twin

sprinters Erika and Angela Tipp also return and distance runner Erin Statz also helps the hopes remain sky-high in St. Paul.

The Oles - after finishing second (indoor) and third (outdoor) - also return tons of talent. Junior Dani Larson has been among the MIAC's best athletes in her first two seasons and leads Head Coach Andrea Gelle's squad. Junior distance runner Jorden Johnson and senior middle-distance runner Moriah Novacinski also bolster St. Olaf's hopes, as does 2013 MIAC cross country champ, first-year runner Noelle Olson.

Concordia Head Coach Marv Roeske returns after a sabbatical to lead the Cobbers again in 2014. A year ago, thrower Cherae Reeves starred for Concordia, and runner Morgan Christian earned a pair of All-MIAC Indoor honors, and the team received outstanding contributions from jumpers Hilary Thompson and Chelsea Klemetson.

Head Coach Robin Balder-Lanoue brings back a talented, experienced squad at Saint Benedict, led by All-MIAC thrower Sam Imholte. Seniors Mandy Witschen (multi-events/hurdles) and Kelsie Larson (distance) will also lead the Blazers this season as they hope to be in title contention.

Gustavus said goodbye to record-setting pole vaulter Voss, but Head Coach Dale Bahr brings back a talented tandem of juniors in distance runner Rebecca Hare and thrower Elizabeth Weiers. Carleton will be led by a pair of super sophomores - Amelia Campbell and Ruth Steinke - and junior Colette Celichowski also returns for Head Coach Donna Ricks.

Hamline will have to replace record-setting throwers Culp and Shawny Kramer, but Marolyn Saulsberry, Hope Hertz and Hannah Toedter are all back to lead the Pipers for Johnson-Hipp. Bethel also brings back some of its top talent in Head Coach Andrew Rock's second season. Versatile Rachel Kalk, sprinter Courtney Fregeauand and sprinter/jumper Steph Skoog will combine to make the Royals quite formidable in 2014.

Macalester has plenty of talent back as Emerson and Haugen take the reins. Georgia Cloepfil should be a threat in the multi-events after earning MIAC Soccer MVP honors in the fall. Sprinter Irene Gibson returns as one of the conference's best, and distance runner Anna Schmitz also has high hopes. Augsburg will be led by distance star Lauren Rice and a pair of sophomore sprinters - Kai Mason and Molly Allen - as Sampson takes over the head coaching duties this season.

Shannon Houlihan will be in her second season as St. Catherine's head coach, and she welcomes back jumper Sarah Manning, thrower Jordan Priebe and hurdler Brittany Moore to again lead the Wildcats. In his first season at Saint Mary's, Anderson will rely on distance runner Katie Stolz, thrower Maya Booker and sprinter Laura Schommer to lead the Cardinals in 2014.

CIRCLE THESE DATES

The first two dates any MIAC track and field fans will want to mark on their calendar are March 6-8 and May 9-10. Those are the days the conference will come together to crown the MIAC Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field champions, respectively. The indoor meet will be cohosted by Saint John's and Saint Benedict at the Johnnies' indoor facility in Collegeville, Minn., while the outdoor meet will be hosted by St. Olaf in Northfield, Minn.

The first indoor event on a MIAC campus will open the season Saturday as Bethel hosts the Bethel Open. There will be plenty of great chances to catch MIAC teams in action on their home tracks at events like the St. Thomas Showcase (Jan. 24), the Carleton Open (Feb. 7), the Bethel University Invitational (Feb. 8), the Saint Ben's Quadrangular (Feb. 22) and the Macalester College Pre-MIAC Meet (Feb. 28). The outdoor schedule is still a work in progress, but will be available soon on the MIAC web site.

• Augsburg's track and field teams participated in their annual Run-a-Thon on Dec. 7-8, raising money for their annual spring break training and competition trip. Fifty Auggies ran in a 24-hour team relay around Murphy Square Park in the center of Augsburg's campus, completing a combined 212 miles of running in frigid conditions.

• Dennis Barker, who served as Augsburg's track and field/cross country head coach for 20 seasons, announced his resignation following the cross country campaign. In his track career, Barker coached 59 MIAC event champions (individuals and relays), along with 147 All-MIAC and 126 All-MIAC Honorable Mention honorees. He guided 47 entries to NCAA Division III national championship competition, with 16 earning All-America honors. In cross country, 35 Auggies earned either All-MIAC (17) or All-MIAC Honorable Mention (18) honors under Barker's coaching, with 20 athletes earning NCAA All-Region honors and six athletes qualifying for the NCAA Division III national championships, one earning All-American honors.

- 11.69: Rachel Kalk set a new school record in the triple jump competition last year at the UW-La Crosse Last Chance NCAA Qualifier with a mark of 11.69 meters, which propelled her into her first NCAA National Meet. Kalk jumped 11.40 meters in the 2013 NCAA Meet in La Crosse, Wis., which helped her finish No. 15 overall.
- 49.39: Bethel's quartet of relay runners were invited to the prestigious 2013 Drake Relays, where Krista McCright, Courtney Fregeau, Ashley Quick, and Rachel Kalk achieved a time of 49.39 seconds in the 4x100-meter dash.
- 10: The Royals finished sixth at the 2013 MIAC Indoor Track and Field meet, however, the team was just 10 points behind the second-place team. Coming into the final day in third place as a team, Steph Skoog led the squad with a first-place finish in the high jump.

Did You Know?

• The members on this year's Bethel University women's track and field roster have set 18 school records, including both indoor and outdoor seasons. In 2013 alone, six records were broken, including three in each season. Ashley Magelssen has individually or with a relay team set nine records in her career with the Royals.

• Between both the indoor and outdoor seasons, Bethel University's women's track and field squad received seven Academic All-Conference accolades following the 2013 campaigns. To be eligible, recipients had to maintain a 3.5 GPA and place in the Top 8 or an individual event or Top 3 in a relay event at the MIAC Championships.
