

# 2006 MIAC Women's Track and Field Awards

Hamline University senior Keidra Anderson (Minocqua, Wis./Lakeland) was selected MIAC Women's Outstanding Track Athlete as she won both the 5,000m and 10,000m races at the 2006 MIAC Outdoor Championships. Anderson set a NCAA provisional time in the 5,000 with her time of 17:36.51 and won the 10,000 with a 37:43.39. She won the 5,000 by 33 seconds and the 10,000 by 49 seconds.

Saint Mary's University senior Ashley Luehmann (Lewiston, Minn.) was selected MIAC Women's Outstanding Field Athlete for performance at the 2006 MIAC Outdoor Championships. Luehmann won the discus, posting a winning throw of 126-3 (38.49m). She also placed second in the javelin with a school-record and NCAA provisional-qualifying mark of 133-5 (40.68m) and added a third in the shot put with a toss of 42-7 1/2 (12.99m).

Concordia College senior Angie Pfeiffer (Colman, S.D./Colman-Egan) earned the honor of MIAC Women's Outstanding Track Performance at the 2006 MIAC Outdoor Championships. Pfeiffer won the 400 meter dash with a time of 56.26 seconds, winning the event by a full second. She set a new meet and stadium record with her run and set a NCAA provisional qualifying time.

Gustavus Adolphus College freshman Lisa Brown (Lake Crystal, Minn) received the honor of MIAC Women's Outstanding Field Performance at the 2006 MIAC Outdoor Championships. Brown won the Javelin throw with a school and meet record mark of 136-11 (41.74m) which also was good for a NCAA qualifying distance.

## Coaches of the Year

Steve Mathre of the University of St. Thomas and Tom Thorkelson of Gustavus Adolphus College were selected men's and women's MIAC Outdoor Coaches of the Year, respectively. Mathre guided the Tommie Men to there 21st MIAC Outdoor team championship in 24 years. The Gustavus women, led by Thorkelson, finished second at the 2006 MIAC Championships.
