


MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week

Mike Lanz, St. Thomas Maple Grove, Minn. / Maple Grove

St. Thomas star swimmer Mike Lanz (Maple Grove, Minn.) had a five-for-five performance to lead the Tommies to a team victory at the Macalester Roger Ahlman Invite last week. The senior

finished first in all five events he swam - three individual and two relay - to lead his team to a first-place finish



Individually, Lanz was victorious in the 50-yard freestyle (21.87), 100-yard butterfly and 200-yard butterfly (50.70). He also led the Tommies' 200-yard medley relay and 400-yard freestyle relay teams to victory to give him five wins in five events. His time in the 100-fly ranks fourth in Division III this season, and his time in the 200-fly ranks ninth in the nation. Lanz is seeking a third-straight MIAC Men's Swimmer-of-the-Year award, after winning the honor at each of the last two MIAC Championships.

Lanz and the Tommies have a pair of big events coming up to close out the 2015 portion of the schedule. St. Thomas will travel to Saint John's for a dual meet with its arch rivals on Saturday at 1 p.m. Then, the team will swim at the prestigious Jean Freeman Invite at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center on Dec. 4-5.

The St. Thomas women's swimming and diving team and star junior Emma Paulson (Wayzata, Minn.) had a week to remember, winning a pair of events in St. Paul. The team finished first at both its home Andregg Invite and Macalester's Roger Ahlman Invite, with Paulson swimming to five individual victories and helping three relay teams also finish first, with a pair of meet-record swims at the Andregg Invite. For her performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Paulson Tuesday with the MIAC Women's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week.

UST was first in the three-team field at the Andregg Invite behind three Paulson victories, as she won the 100-yard freestyle (51.73) and 200-yard individual medley (2:13.47) and also led the 200-yard medley relay (1:54.02) team to victory. The 200-free and 200-IM were both meet-record times. She was even

better Saturday at Macalester, as she won the 50-yard freestyle (23.88), the 100-free (52.44) and the 100-yard backstroke (56.80) while also helping a pair of relay teams also swim to victory. This season, Paulson's times rank second in the nation in both the 100-free and 100-back and third in the 50-free.

The Gustavus men's swimming diving team had a busy and successful week, with a second-place finish in front of its home fans at the Grace Goblirsch Invite, and the team also hosted the Gustie Sprint Invite. Rookie swimmer Tanner Sonnek (North Mankato, Minn./Mankato West) led the way with a pair of top two individual finishes, and a pair of top two relay swims as well. For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Sonnek Monday with the MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week award.



Sonnek helped the Gusties to their second-place finish at the Goblirsch Invite with a big individual victory in the 100-yard breaststroke. He finished the race in 59.70 to earn the win, and he also helped the 200-yard medley relay team finish second with a time of 1:39.88. Sonnek also was fifth in the 100-fly and the 200-free relay, and seventh in the 100-free. At the Sprint Invite, he helped the 200-breast relay team finish second with a time of 1:52.52, and he helped the 400-yard medley relay team also finish second with a time of 3:46.36. This season, Sonnek has the MIAC's top time in the 200-breast, and the third-best in the 100-breast.

Josephson's individual victory was impressive, as his winning time in the 200-fly was 2:00.38. He out-distanced the runner-up from Division II St. Cloud State by more than three seconds, and he was nearly five seconds ahead of the nearest Division III finisher. His time ranks No. 1 in the MIAC this season. He also helped the 200-free relay team win with a time of 1:26.44. Josephson also added a fourth place finish in the 500-yard freestyle (5:06.80) and he helped the 200-yard medley relay team finish eighth (1:40.80) and he was 15th out of 30 swimmers in the 50-yard freestyle (23.38).

Wetzel's individual accomplishments included first-place finishes in the 200-yard backstroke with a time of 2:06.00 and the 500-yard freestyle with a time of 5:21.81. In the 200-back she beat the runner-up from

Division II St. Cloud State by nearly four seconds, and she was nearly 10 seconds better than the closest Division III swimmer. She knocked off a trio of D-II swimmers for her win in the 500-free. she also led off on a second-place finish in the 200-yard medley relay (1:55.84) and swam anchor on the fourth-place 200-yard freestyle relay team (1:42.91) that posted the second-best D-III time in the meet. She also added a ninth-place finish in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:14.18).

Alvarez starred in his 2015 debut at the Pipers' home pool in St. Paul, with a first-place finish all four times he dove into the water. He won the 100-yard breaststroke with a time of 1:02.69, finished first in the 100-yard butterfly with a time of 53:12 and was also the winner in the 200-yard freestyle with his time of 1:49.09. Alvarez also helped the Johnnies' 200-yard medley relay team finish first with a time of 1:40.94. As a team, SJU won 11 of the 13 events for a total of 452.5 point to finish first among a four-team field of MIAC schools.

Saint John's will take this weekend off following its successful start to the 2015-16 season to gear up for its big home debut the following weekend. Alvarez and company will host the rival University of St. Thomas for a dual meet on Nov. 21 at 12 p.m. in Collegeville, Minn. The Saint Benedict women's swimming and diving team and first-year swimmer Ashley Groebner (Inver Grove Heights, Minn./Simley) certainly made a splash in their season debut. The Blazers swam to a team victory at the Hamline Invitational, with Groebner contributing an individual first-place finish and helping a relay team to a win as well in her first-ever collegiate meet. For her performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Groebner Tuesday with the MIAC Women's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Groebner's big debut was highlighted by the two victories, starting with her individual win in the 100-yard breaststroke. She finished the race in 1:10.44, which was just 0.2 seconds off her lifetime best and currently among the top four times in the MIAC this season. She swam a new lifetime best (32 seconds) in the 50-yard

breaststroke to help Saint Ben's win the 200-yard medley relay race in 1:55.22. Groebner also added a sixth-place finish (2:28.03) in the 200-yard individual medley, and helped the 200-yard freestyle relay team finish eighth (1:53.08). Overall, the Blazers finished with 419 points to finish first in the team standings by 208 points to lead a field of six MIAC teams.

Saint Benedict has another busy week ahead, starting Tuesday afternoon at 4:30 p.m. The team will take place in the annual Ted Mullin Hour of Power, which honors the late Carleton swimmer and raises money and awareness for Sarcoma research. 



The Carleton men's swimming and diving team and junior swimmer Alex Mathson (Verona, Wis.) certainly had a Happy New Year. The Knights impressed in their 2016 debut, scoring a 182-106





For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Mathson Tuesday with the MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week.

Mathson starred in his three individual events. In his season 200-yard individual medley debut he trailed heading into the final leg, but surged ahead to win by more than a second with a time of 2:02.59. His time of 10:22.99 was good for a 17-second margin of victory in the 1,000-yard freestyle, and his winning time in the 500-yard freestyle (4:59.84) was his best in a non-tapered meet and resulted in more than a five-second cushion over the runner-up. He also helped Carleton's second 200-yard freestyle relay team finish third with a time of 1:33.73. Mathson has the third-fastest 500-free time and sixth-best time in the 1,000-free in the conference this season. He's also fourth in the 1,650-free, 10th in the 200-IM and 11th in the 200-free.

The Knights and their standout junior hope for the strong start to 2016 continue this weekend with a big trip to Iowa. Carleton will head to Decorah, Iowa, for Saturday's Luther College Sprint Invite at the Norse Swimming Pool. The meet will begin at noon. The team will host its first competition of the new year the following weekend when Saint John's visits Carleton for a dual meet on Jan. 23.

Schnaith starred in her two individual events, winning the 100-yard backstroke with a time of 1:01.13 and the 100-yard freestyle with a time of 54.58. She also helped St. Olaf's 200-yard medley relay team finish first with a winning time of 1:50.52, and she was a member of the first-place 200-yard freestyle squad with

a time of 1:42.28. This season, Schnaith ranks in the top 10 in the MIAC in five different events: she's fourth in the 200-back, sixth in the 100-free, ninth in the 100-back and 10th in both the 50- and 200-free.



He also won the 200-backstroke by three full seconds with a time of 1:58.48, and shaved a second off his 100-backstroke time to touch the wall in 53.39 for another first-place finish. Alvarez also swam on Saint John's second-place 200-medley relay team (1:39.17). This season, Alvarez is ranked in the top five in the MIAC in five different individual events. He's ranked first in the 100-IM, fourth in the 200-back, 100-fly and 200-fly and fifth in the 100-back.

Saint John's and its standout junior have just one more opportunity to prepare for the 2016 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships. Carleton College swimmer Stephen Grinich (McMinnville, Ore.) certainly celebrated "Senior Day" in style in his final home

meet as a Knight. Grinich was superb in a narrow dual loss to rival St. Olaf, winning all four of his events. His



two individual victories included season-best times, and he also helped Carleton win a pair of relay events. For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Grinich Tuesday with his third MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week award of the 2015-16 season.

Grinich's top highlight featured a season-best time of 21.06 to win the 50-yard freestyle, which also ranks as the top time in the MIAC in the event this season. He was nearly as good in the 100-yard butterfly, as he won with a time of 50.84 which ranks second in the conference in 2015-16. Grinich also helped Carleton's 200-yard freestyle relay team finish first with a time of 1:25.79, which was the fastest time swam by a MIAC team last weekend, and he also led the 200-yard medley relay team to a win (1:35.89). Grinich and company put a serious scare into the Oles in a 157-141 loss, which was the closest Carleton has been to its rivals in Andy Clark's 23 seasons coaching at the school.

The Knights and their standout senior have one more chance to get in the water and prepare for the 2016 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships, and fortunately they'll compete in the same pool as the conference meet. Carleton will attend the Minnesota Challenge Friday and Saturday at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center, then will return to the same site for the MIAC Championships on Feb. 18-20.

St. Catherine diver Jenna Nagy (Hutchinson, Minn.) is no stranger to success in the MIAC, and last weekend's tremendous performance indicates she's peaking again at the perfect time. Nagy won all four diving events at two different meets Friday and Saturday, recording a pair of NCAA Regional Zone qualifying scores and the top score in the MIAC this season in all four events. For her performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Nagy Tuesday with the MIAC Women's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Friday, Nagy won a pair of six-dive competitions in a dual against Macalester with the MIAC's top score on each board this season. Her scores of 250.70 on the 1-meter board and 223.70 on the 3-meter board were both the best in the meet by at least 32 points. A day later, she was again victorious in 11-dive

competitions on both boards while qualifying for the NCAA Diving Zone meet and recording the MIAC's top scores. She racked up 405.50 points on the 1-meter board, and an even 450.00 on the 3-meter board. To top it off, Nagy also swam in a pair of backstroke events Saturday without prior training this season, and finished third in the 100 (1:06.54) and fourth in the 200 (2:30.46). Nagy is the two-time reigning MIAC Diver-of-the-Year and the defending conference champ on both boards.

The Wildcats and their standout junior diver only have one more competition to prepare for the 2016 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships, which will be held Feb. 18-20 at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center. But before Nagy attempts to win her third-straight MIAC Diver-of-the-Year award, St. Catherine will compete at the Minnesota Challenge on Saturday, which will also be held at the U of M's pool in Minneapolis.

As a result, the MIAC sports information directors honored Grinich Tuesday with his fourth MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Athlete-of-the-Week award of the 2015-16 season, and his second-straight honor.

Grinich made quite a splash at the prestigious Minnesota Challenge in the same pool that will host the MIAC Championships later in February. He finished fourth in the 50-yard freestyle behind only three Division I swimmers, while recording the MIAC's top time this season (20.84). He also swam a season-best 47.50 in the 100-free to finish ninth, and he was also fourth in the 100-yard butterfly (51.17) to add another fourth place finish. Grinich led off Carleton's first-place effort in the 200-yard freestyle relay (1:23.92), and also swam on the fifth-place 200-yard medley relay team (1:36.18). This season, Grinich ranks first in the MIAC in the 50-free (20.84), third in the 100-fly (50.84) and sixth in the 100-free (47.50).
