Millie Suk, Augsburg

Augsburg College junior forward Millie Suk (Rochester, Minn./Mayo) scored a goal and added two assists in two key conference wins for the Auggies which kept their playoff hopes alive. Against Hamline, Suk scored the game winning goal in overtime and picked up one assist in the 2-1 victory. In the Carleton game, she assisted on the games only goal. Suk now has nine goals and six assists entering the final week of conference play.

Morgan Bain, Concordia

Concordia College sophomore forward Morgan Bain (Hugo, Minn./White Bear Lake HS) scored three goals in Concordia's two conference games and in the process broke the school record for most goals in a season. Bain now has 20 goals overall and 15 in conference games. She needs two more goals in the team's two remaining MIAC games to break the conference mark for goals and points in a single season. On Tuesday in Concordia's 3-1 win over St. Thomas, Bain scored a pair of goals. Her two goals helped the Cobbers beat the Tommies for the first time in 12 years. In Saturday's 2-1 overtime win over Augsburg she scored the first goal of the game for the Cobbers. That goal broke the school record of 19 goals in a season, which was last set in 1993. With the win, Concordia clinched a spot in the MIAC playoffs for the second consecutive season.
