

Kelly Ping, Concordia

Week of: 2005-11-02

Concordia College senior forward Kelly Ping (Bozeman, Mont.) scored a game-winning goal and added two assists last week as Concordia clinched a spot in the MIAC playoffs for the third consecutive season. Ping scored the game-winning goal against St. Kates on Wednesday which helped secure the postseason spot for Concordia. In Saturdays 4-1 win over St. Bens, she dished out two assists to bring her league-leading total to 13. Her second assist also helped her pass Morgan Bain for the overall lead in total points during the regular season. Ping led the conference in scoring with 37 points while Bain was second with 36.

Millie Suk, Augsburg

Augsburg College senior forward Millie Suk (Rochester, Minn. / Mayo) became Augsburg's all-time leading scorer during the past week, as Augsburg went 1-0-2 to remain in the hunt for an MIAC postseason playoff berth for the second straight year. Suk scored both of Augsburg's goals in a 2-0 win over St. Benedict last Tuesday, then scored the lone Auggie goal in a 1-1 tie with UMAC leader St. Scholastica on Wednesday. Suk now has 93 career points (38 goals, 17 assists), passing Kara Seibel (1991, 93-95) for the school's career points record. Seibel had 88 points (31 goals, 26 assists) in her career. Suk's career goals total is also a school record. So far this season, Suk has nine goals and six assists for 24 points.

Louisa Bigelow, Macalester

Macalester College senior goalkeeper Louisa Bigelow (Evanston, Ill. / Evanston Township) gave up just one goal in a pair of crucial MIAC games last week, leading Macalester into first place in the MIAC standings with a 1-0 win at Saint Benedict and 5-1 victory at Concordia. Bigelow registered six saves in Macalesters overtime win over the Blazers and made 10 saves against the Cobbers as the Scots move into first place with a 7-0-1 league record. Bigelow has a 0.40 goals against average in five MIAC starts.

Morgan Bain, Concordia

Concordia College junior forward Morgan Bain (White Bear Lake, Minn.) scored three goals and added an assist in the Cobbers two victories last week. She scored all three goals and added the assist in Concordias 4-0 win over Bethel on Saturday. The two victories helped the Cobbers stay on top of the MIAC with an unblemished mark of 7-0-0. Concordia has now won 10 straight games in 2005 and 13 consecutive conference games in a streak that dates back to Sept. 29, 2004. With the seven points, she becomes only the third player in Concordia womens soccer to reach the 100-point plateau. Bain, in true goal-scorer fashion, eclipsed the mark by scoring her fourth hat trick of her career and first of the season. She now has 27 points in Concordias first 11 games this season and 103 for her career. She currently leads the MIAC in points (22), points per game (3.14), goals (9) and goals per game (1.40) in conference games this season.

Amy Ravenhorst, Concordia

Concordia College junior midfielder Amy Ravenhorst (Hollandale, Minn./Albert Lea) scored two game-winning goals in the Cobbers two victories during the week. She also added an assist as Concordia set a program record for most consecutive victories. The Cobbers have now won eight straight games and remain undefeated in conference play. On Wednesday against Hamline, she scored at 8:08 to give Concordia an early lead and help the Cobbers post a 3-0 win on the road. On Saturday, she scored the pivotal goal of the game when she headed home a goal at 1:21 of the opening period to put Concordia in the lead 1-0. She is currently third on the team in scoring with four goals and six assists for 14 points. She is also tied for third in the MIAC in points in conference games (9) and is tied for second in assists (3).

Amanda Broadbent, Saint Benedict

College of Saint Benedict senior goalkeeper Amanda Broadbent (Arvada, Colo.) has 3 shutouts in a row. This past week she recorded her 4th shutout at Gustavus on Saturday, Sept 24th with the Blazers winning the game 1-0. Her total record is now 5-1-1 with a GAA of 1.00. Amanda has many key saves in every game that she played. Against Gustavus she made 13 saves, one point blank reaction off a service. She helped the defense keep the ball out of the net in six Gustavus corner kicks. In 2004, Amanda was second in the MIAC with a GAA of .91 playing in 16 games and allowing only 15 goals for the season including 5 shutouts.
