The Knights also beat St. Olaf, 1-0, on Sunday, securing a tie for second in the MIAC regular-season standings for Carleton, which will host Macalester in the MIAC Playoff semifinals on Wednesday, Nov. 1, at 2 p.m. at Bell Field. Welch is third on the squad with three goals and nine points and the tally was her third game-winning goal of her career.
