

Britt Reiersgord, Concordia

Week of: 2007-11-06



Concordia College junior goalkeeper **Britt Reiersgord** (Edina, Minn.) posted back-to-back shutouts in the MIAC Tournament and helped Concordia win their second consecutive conference playoff title. The Cobbers also claimed their second straight MIAC regular season championship and will now play in their second straight NCAA Tournament. In Concordia's 2-0 win over Macalester in the semifinals, Reiersgord made only one save but continually stopped the Scots' attack by corralling crosses and cutting off through balls past the Cobber defense. Against St. Ben's in the MIAC title game, Reiersgord made a season-high nine saves and came up with several in-close saves when the game was on the line to preserve the team's 2-0 win. She now has nine shutouts on the year and has recorded 15 of the team's 16 wins. She led the MIAC in goals against average and tied for the conference lead in shutouts.

Katie Gardner, Hamline

Hamline University first-year goalkeeper **Katie Gardner** (Minneapolis/Washburn) lead Hamline to three consecutive shutout wins to end the season, including shutouts of conference rivals St. Olaf and St. Kate's. In those two games, she faced 19 shots and made 10 saves. She also finished the season with a shutout streak of 277 consecutive minutes. Gardner's play over the second half of the season lead Hamline to their first winning season in program history, including program records for wins (10) and conference wins (4).

Alison Tourville, Saint Benedict

College of Saint Benedict sophomore midfielder **Alison Tourville** (Plymouth, Minn./Armstrong) scored two goals in 59 seconds on Saturday to secure the 3-1 Blazer victory over Saint Mary's. Tourville has now three goals and one assist for the season. This win guaranteed a playoff berth for the Blazers who are now 13-3 overall and 8-1 in the MIAC.

Jessie Tschetter, Bethel

Bethel University senior midfielder **Jessie Tschetter** (Sioux Falls, S.D./O'Gorman) scored a pair of game-winning goals and had a team-high 13 shots during Bethel's three-game unbeaten stretch last week. The Royals went 2-0-1 with wins over conference foe Gustavus and non-conference opponent UW-River Falls. The two wins helps Bethel get to seven overall victories on the year, which equals all of last year's total and is the most for the team since the 2003 season. In Bethel's first game of the week, a 1-1 double overtime tie with St. Olaf, Tschetter had seven shots which is the second most for her this season. On Thursday against River Falls, Tschetter scored her 11th goal of the season at 59:41 to give the Royals the 1-0 victory. She completed the week by scoring the team's first goal in their big 2-0 win over Gustavus on Saturday. It was the first win for Bethel over the Gusties since the 2002 season. The goal against Gustavus was her 12th of the season which ties her for the conference lead.

Megan Milligan, Carleton

Carleton College first-year midfielder **Megan Milligan** (Las Cruces, N.M.) sparked Carleton to a perfect 3-0 week that has the Knights back in contention for a MIAC playoff berth. The midfielder factored in a pair of late, game-winning goals, beginning with an 89th minute score in the 2-1 victory over St. Thomas on Wednesday. Milligan then assisted on the game winner in the 88th minute on Saturday against Bethel. She wrapped up the week with an unassisted goal in Carleton's 7-0 triumph over UW-Platteville on Sunday afternoon.

Rachel Lewis, Concordia

Concordia College senior forward **Rachel Lewis** (Lakeville, Minn.) scored both the game-winning goals in the team's 2-1 win over St. Kate's and 3-0 victory over Saint Mary's. She has been a major factor in the team's four-game winning streak that has pushed the Cobbers into second place in the MIAC standings. For the season, Lewis has five goals for 10 points and is currently tied for the MIAC lead in game-winning goals. She is also tied for second in the MIAC in points in league games with eight.

Grace King, Macalester

Macalester College junior forward **Grace King** (Northampton, Mass.) scored three important goals for the Scots last week. On Tuesday, King scored the game-winning goal in overtime against St Scholastica who was 6-1-1 entering the game. She then notched two goals and an assist in the Scots' 3-1 win over previously undefeated in conference St Olaf. King now has nine goals and five assists on the season and is tied for the conference lead in points per game and is tied for second in overall points.

Erin Flynn, Saint Benedict

In St. Benedict's first two MIAC conference games of the season, junior captain **Erin Flynn** (Woodbury, Minn./Stillwater HS) scored two goals and helped the Blazers post a pair of wins against teams predicted to finish in the top five of the league in the MIAC Coaches' Preseason poll. On Tuesday against St. Thomas, Flynn drove in the game-winning goal in the second half. She followed that up by

scoring one of the team's two goals against Carleton on Saturday. Against the Knights, she placed a free kick in the back of the net to help St. Ben's secure the win. She has now scored a goal in the past four games for the Blazers. Flynn was also one of the keys to the Blazer defense in the two MIAC shutout victories by marking out key forwards of the opponents.
