Pitcher -Carleton College junior Brian Sharkey (RHP, Bow, N.H. / St. Paul's School) notched a pair of complete-game victories this week to lead Carleton to its first MIAC sweep since 2003 as the Knights won three of their final four MIAC games of the season.
