2011 MIAC Baseball Awards

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- Though the weather wasn't always cooperative, the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) enjoyed another terrific season in 2011 with a conference race that came down to the final day and numerous outstanding individual performances. Those performance were honored Monday, May 16, as the MIAC announced its 2011 Baseball Awards, headlined by MIAC MVP **Tayler Rahm** of St. Thomas.



Rahm, a senior outfielder for the regular season co-champion Tommies, was selected as the 2011 MIAC Max Molock Most Valuable Player for his outstanding play this season. Overall, Rahm hit .305 with 29 runs, a team-leading 35 RBI and 10 doubles to go along with his .984 fielding percentage. He was even better in MIAC play, leading UST to a 16-4 conference record, with a .429 batting average, 17 runs, 21 RBI, 27 hits and six doubles. Rahm also earned his second-straight All-MIAC honor.

St. Olaf College pitcher **Ben Hughes** was named the 2011 MIAC Mike Augustin Pitcher-of-the-Year thanks to his dominant season on the mound. Hughes overpowered hitters all year en route to a 7-1 record with a 2.50 ERA. He had three complete games, two shutouts, 16 earned runs, 19 walks and an incredible 83 strikeouts in just 57.2 innings pitched while limiting opposing hitters to a .198 batting average. In MIAC play, Hughes was just as good with a 5-1 record, a 1.40 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 38.2 innings.

St. Thomas freshman catcher **J.D. Dorgan** was another big reason the Tommies captured a share of the league title with a breakout season both at and behind the plate, resulting in his selection as the 2011 MIAC Rookie-of-the-Year. The first-year star led St. Thomas with a .390 batting average, five home runs, two triples and a .636 slugging percentage while adding 31 RBI, 10 doubles and a .985 fielding percentage to his stat line. In MIAC games, Dorgan hit .393 with 17 RBI and 13 runs scored for UST.

Macalester College head coach **Matt Parrington** was selected as the 2011 MIAC Jim Dimick Coach-of-the-Year award. Parrington's club was picked to finish eighth in the Preseason Coaches' Poll, but the Scots became the talk of the league as they rolled to a 16-4 conference record (26-14 overall) and claimed a share of their first MIAC regular season title in 61 years. Macalester secured a berth and the No. 2 seed in the 2011 MIAC Baseball Playoffs, and enjoyed an 11-game winning streak from April 12 to May 3. The Scots' 16 conference wins was an eight-win improvement over their 2010 total.

The two regular-season co-champions led the way with 11 combined selections. Macalester placed six players on the 27-member All-MIAC team, while St. Thomas had five players honored. MIAC Playoff champion Hamline was next with four selections, Saint John's and Augsburg each had three players chosen, St. Olaf had two selections and Concordia, Saint Mary's, Bethel and Gustavus had one player selected apiece. Rahm headlined a group of five players who earned All-MIAC honors for the second-straight season. Two of Rahm's teammates - senior **Kris Edwards** and junior **Charles Bruchu** - were also repeat All-Conference selections, as were Macalester junior **Mitch Glasser** and Saint John's senior **Brett Kramer**.

For the second year in a row, the MIAC coaches selected an All-Defensive Team. The 10-player team consists of one player at each position, a starting pitcher, and a relief pitcher. Award winners were selected for their arm strength and range as well as all defensive statistics. Macalester had three players honored for their defense, Hamline and Concordia each had two selections and St. Thomas, Augsburg and Saint John's each placed one player on the team. St. Thomas' **Matt McQuillan** and Saint John's **Brian Skluzacek** were both repeat selections from last year's squad.

As part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC announced the fifth annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for baseball. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
