2013 MIAC Baseball Preview and Preseason Coaches' Poll

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- If the last two seasons are any indication, the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) is in for another great spring on the baseball diamond in 2013. Though a familiar team has reigned atop the standings for a decade, each of the last two seasons have also included remarkable Cinderella stories and a thrilling postseason tournament with enough upsets and drama to even make March Madness a little jealous.



Last season, St. Thomas continued a 10-year run with at least a share of the MIAC regular season championship.

The Tommies rolled to the 2012 title by five games with a near-perfect 19-1 league record, and since 2003 St. Thomas has eight outright championships and two shared titles. St. Olaf's three-year run as champs from 2000-2002 marks the last time a team other than St. Thomas has hoisted the hardware, and UST Head Coach **Chris Olean** has led his squad to the title in each of his four seasons at the helm. St. Thomas topped it off with a trip to the NCAA Division III World Series, where it finished third.

As the Tommies pulled away for the title, several other significant storylines developed throughout the rest of the standings. **Jerry Haugen's** Saint John's team not only emerged as St. Thomas' top contender and the No. 2 Playoff seed with a 14-6 MIAC campaign, but the Johnnies played their best ball of the year in the postseason, winning the 2012 MIAC Baseball Playoff championship and joining the Tommies in the 2012 NCAA Division III Baseball Tournament.

Meanwhile, Bethel had a great season under first-year Head Coach Brian Raabe, and MIAC MVP **Matt Rowley** led the Royals to an 11-9 conference record and a trip to the conference Playoffs. **Nick Winecke's** Saint Mary's team provided the true Cinderella story of the 2012 season. The Cardinals were picked to finish dead last in the 2012 MIAC Baseball Preseason Coaches' Poll, but surprised everyone with a 10-10 conference record and earned a postseason bid thanks to tiebreaker criteria over 10-10 Augsburg. SMU then opened the MIAC Playoffs with a bang, upsetting top-seeded Saint Thomas and proving throughout the tournament that it belonged.

Keith Bateman's Auggie team just missed a trip to the postseason behind some great young arms, and finished tied with Saint Mary's for fourth in the standings. Concordia and Macalester were also in Playoff contention into the final weekend, finishing just a game behind SMU and Augsburg at 9-11 each. This came a year after the Scots' magical run to earn a share of the MIAC title for the first time in 50 years.

Hamline was just another game behind the Cobbers and Macalester at 8-12 overall, and Gustavus and Carleton both went 7-13 in league play, with St. Olaf finishing 6-14 to round out the standings. The depth and parity in the league was certainly reflected in the teams' records, as just five games separated the final nine spots in the standings.

With the first pitch of the 2013 season less than a week away, it will be interesting to see if recent history can repeat itself. Will St. Thomas make it 11 years on top, or can Saint John's or another challenger rise up to take the title? Will Saint Mary's continue its stunning surge? Is there another unlikely Cinderella candidate lurking at the bottom of the standings ready to make a move into the postseason? Thankfully for MIAC fans, all those questions will be answered on the diamond in the coming months.

Tommies and Johnnies top title contenders

The St. Thomas-Saint John's rivalry has been well documented in other sports, and in 2013 the MIAC coaches predict the two adversaries will again be the chief competitors for the league's baseball title. St. Thomas was tabbed as the favorite to take home its 11th-straight championship in the 2013 MIAC Baseball Preseason Coaches' Poll, with the Johnnies close behind. UST received nine of 11 first-place votes and 99 points to headline the poll, while SJU received the other two first-place votes and 92 points to lay claim to top contender status.

After the top two, there's a bit of a divide, but Bethel was a solid choice among the coaches in third place. The Royals received 77 points to slot in at No. 3. Augsburg and Concordia were predicted to battle for the final spot in the four-team Playoff field, with the Auggies taking No. 4 with 68 points, and the Cobbers claiming No. 5 with 61 points.

The next four teams in the poll, all who could also contend for a postseason bid, were only separated by 10 total points. Last year's surprise team, Saint Mary's, finds itself five spots higher in this year's poll at No. 6 with 47 points. St. Olaf is just two points behind the Cardinal in seventh with 45, and Hamline received 40 points to finish eighth. Macalester joined that close grouping at No. 9 with a total of 37 points.

Gustavus claimed the No. 10 spot in the poll with 27 points and Carleton rounded out the rankings at No. 11 with 12 points. However, those teams only need to look at the 2011 Macalester team and the 2012 Saint Mary's squad for inspiration, as both teams were slotted near the bottom of the poll, only to make a Playoff push that season.

What's new?

There's a lot of continuity in the MIAC again this year with only one head coaching change, and this time around, it involves a coach who was already entrenched with his current program. Last spring, Hamline Head Baseball Coach **Jason Verdugo** was named the Pipers' new athletic director. After a semester with his new role under his belt, Verdugo decided to focus his energy on running Hamline's athletic department, and recently he promoted longtime assistant **Jim Weyandt** as his successor on the diamond.

Weyandt is a 2003 Hamline grad who enjoyed a four-year career with the Pipers, and has served as an assistant under Verdugo in a number of capacities, including first-base coach, infield coach and director of baseball operations.

The MIAC coaching group is now a group featuring both long-term veterans and some talented young coaches still in the early part of their head coaching careers. Six of the 11 coaches have at least 10 years in their current position, including SJU's Haugen (36th season) and

Concordia's **Bucky Burgau** (35th season). Meanwhile Weyandt joins Raabe (second season), Olean and Winecke (both fourth season) in the league's new wave of coaching talent.

Also new in 2013 will be a new all-turf field in Collegeville. Construction began on a new baseball and soccer complex on the Saint John's campus following last season, and starting this season, the Johnnies will have a new home field on campus, right next to the site of their former stadium.

Who's back?

Adding to the anticipation for the 2013 MIAC season is the return of the league's top three individual award winners from a year ago, as well as 19 of the 27 All-MIAC selections and six of the 10 All-MIAC Defensive Team honorees. That begins with a pair of versatile players in Bethel's Rowley, who was the Max Molock Most Valuable Player, and St. Thomas' **Dylan Thomas**, who was the Mike Augustin Pitcher-of-the-Year, although those awards could've been flipped, as both players excelled both on the mound and in the batter's box. Gustavus' **Grant Soderberg**, the MIAC Rookie-of-the-Year, is also back after a great debut season.

Reigning MIAC Coach-of-the-Year Olean has many reasons to be optimistic about his 2013 Tommies. Thomas was an All-American, and went 8-0 with a 0.98 ERA over his last 11 appearances, and he'll be joined by fellow All-MIAC and All-American pitcher **Steve Maher**, who was 13-2 with a 2.77 ERA. All-MIAC OF **Tim Kuzniar** (.340 BA) also returns, as does All-MIAC OF **Ben Podibinski** and 2011 Rookie-of-the-Year and 2012 All-Defensive Team catcher **J.D. Dorgan**.

Saint John's returns nearly as much star power. Haugen welcomes back versatile star **Connor Cline**, who was All-MIAC and All-Region and hit .331 while posting a 7-5 record with a 2.97 ERA. All-American **Joey Long** is also back at second base and closer after racking up 10 saves and a 2.22 ERA in 2012. Shortstop **Max Forster** is also back, along with his .322 batting average, along with All-MIAC selection **Dylan Graves**.

Bethel's hopes certainly start with the return of Rowley, who earned numerous postseason honors following his remarkable junior season. The Royals' star was the league's MVP, an All-Defensive Team selection, an All-American, and All-Region in the outfield and as a pitcher. Another pitcher/outfielder - **David Freed** - also returns after hitting .348 a year ago, as does outfielder **Jesse Nickols** (.304, 6 HR). Augsburg returns a ton of talented underclassmen, led by All-MIAC and All-Region shortstop **Adam Carl** (.361 BA, 30 RBI) and sophomore pitchers **Ryan Mestnik** and **Tanner Oakes**, who both had sub-3.00 ERAs in their rookie campaigns.

Concordia will look to a pair of returning All-MIAC selections to lead Burgau's bunch to the MIAC Playoffs. Junior outfielder **Michael Olson** and sophomore shortstop **Braden Rahman** were both All-Conference selections a year ago, and Olson was also an All-Defensive Team pick. Saint Mary's has a ton of talent back from its surprising MIAC Playoff run a year ago, particularly on the right side of the infield. **Kevin Gannon** and **Jon Schlemmer** were both All-MIAC picks splitting first base and DH duties, while 2B **Paul LaNasa** also earned an All-Conference nod in 2012.

St. Olaf should be strong defensively again this season, with All-Defensive Team selections **Nick Kulla** back at 2B, and **Chris Paradise** back in the OF. Catcher **Jack Schchinger** also returns for Matt McDonald's club after hitting .317 a year ago. First-year Coach Weyandt has a pair of All-MIAC players to lean on in his first season at Hamline - P/3B **Dan Ellefson** and DH-OF **Jordan Buck**, as well as SS **Jordan Rubbelke**. Both Buck and Rubbelke hit .333 a year ago. Macalester graduated a trio of stars, but 2011 All-MIAC SS **Jimmy Belfont** is back along with OF **Ross Brofenbrenner** (.319 BA) and Division I transfer **Nick Mar**, who hit .303 as a utility man a year ago.

Gustavus hopes Soderberg can build on his strong rookie season, in which he went 3-5 with a 2.73 ERA with five complete games. All-MIAC selection **Drew Block** is also back for the Gusties after hitting .352 and leading the team in seven offensive categories. Carleton will have a pair of talented juniors anchoring its lineup in catcher **Jeff Dsida** (.350 BA, 5 triples) and OF **Ray Young** (.330 BA), with **Anderson Cole** anchoring the pitching staff once again.

Circle these dates

It might not look like baseball season outside in Minnesota, but thanks to indoor opportunities provided by the Metrodome, and trips to snow-less states, first pitch is less than a week away. Carleton starts the MIAC season with a dome doubleheader against Crown on Feb. 12, and most of the MIAC teams will open their 2013 campaigns before the calendar flips to March. Conference play kicks off on March 30, and between that date and May 5 all 11 teams will play 20 MIAC games to determine the league champ, and the four MIAC Playoff bids.

Throughout those five weeks, there will be a number of dates MIAC fans will want to mark on the calendar. The top two teams in the coaches poll will continue a spirited rivalry on April 9 when St. Thomas heads to Collegeville to face the Johnnies in a 2:30 p.m. doubleheader that will have huge conference implications. The league's other two 2012 Playoff teams - Bethel and Saint Mary's - will square off on the Royals' home field on March 30 at 1 p.m.

Augsburg will travel north to Moorhead on April 23 to face Concordia in a 2:30 p.m. MIAC doubleheader that showcases two teams hoping to re-join the postseason field in 2013. Two St. Paul rivals also hope to be in the Playoff chase when Hamline hosts Macalester at Midway Stadium on the same date - April 23 - at 2:30 p.m.

There will be a pair of exciting MIAC doubleheaders to watch in Northfield in early April. Carleton hosts Gustavus on April 6 in a 2:30 p.m. conference twin bill that features two teams both hoping to be the big surprise of the MIAC in 2013. And just a week later - on April 13 - the Knights host cross-town rival St. Olaf in a 1 p.m. MIAC doubleheader that not only showcases one of the league's top rivalries, but also a pair of teams looking for upward movement this season.

All that action will build towards the 2013 MIAC Baseball Playoffs, which returns to Minnetonka's Veterans Field for the third-straight season. Hamline will be the host school at the three-day tournament, which will run May 10-12. The four-team, double-elimination Playoff features two first-round games on Friday, May 10, with three games schedules for Saturday, May 11, and either one or two championship

games, depending on how the double-elimination format plays out, on Sunday, May 12. The postseason champ will receive the MIAC's automatic bid to the 2013 NCAA Division III Baseball Playoffs.

This season's MIAC Playoffs will be played May 10-12 at Veterans Field in Minnetonka, Minn., for the third season in a row. Hamline University will be the tournament host. There will be two first-round games held Friday, May 10, with three games on Saturday's schedule and either one or two game Sunday depending on how the double-elimination tournament plays out. The winner will receive the MIAC's automatic bid to the 2013 NCAA Division III Baseball Tournament.

Augsburg started the season 21-8 in its first 29 games, its best start since going 24-5 in the 1987 MIAC championship season.
- 0: Hits allowed by Augsburg pitcher Tanner Oakes in a seven-inning no-hitter in his second collegiate appearance and first collegiate start, a 2-0 win over Mayville State (N.D.) at the Metrodome on March 9. It's the first no-hitter in head coach Keith Bateman's tenure at Augsburg.
- 173.1: Innings pitched by Augsburg's starting trio of Ryan Mestnik, Tanner Oakes and Eren Cur. The trio pitched 64.6 percent of Augsburg's 268.1 pitching innings in 2012, starting 30 of the team's 39 games and earning 18 of the team's 24 wins. Mestnik went 8-2 with a 2.30 ERA in 58.2 innings of work, Oakes went 5-3 with a 2.93 ERA in 58.1 innings of work, and Cur went 5-1 with a 3.51 ERA in 56 innings of work. The trio combined to strike out 77 batters while walking only 31 in 2012.

Did You Know?

• In addition to his ABCA All-Midwest Region and All-MIAC accolades at shortstop for the Augsburg baseball team, Adam Carl is also one of the top tight ends in the country in football. In 2012, Carl was named a D3football.com All-America first-team selection, in addition to earning D3football.com All-West Region first-team honors, Beyond Sports College Network All-America honorable-mention honors and All-MIAC first-team honors. He was an All-MIAC first-team and D3football.com All-West Region second team selection in 2011.

- .427: 2012 MIAC MVP Matt Rowley was exceptional in the field and at the plate a season ago, as he led the league in batting average with a mark of .427 and finished in the Top 5 in innings pitched (80.0) and strikeouts pitched (61). Rowley also finished second in slugging percentage (.636), second in on-base percentage (.494), and second in total hits (61).
- 10: Bethel University finished the 2012 conference schedule 11-9, however, the Royals had 10 league games decided by one run. In those 10 contests, BU finished 4-6. That record, along with the fact that Bethel led the MIAC in errors and double plays hit into gives the Royals significant optimism for 2013.
- 6: Graduated closer Buddy Flaherty had a dynamic season in 2012, as his six saves and 5-1 record in 37.1 innings pitched were among the best nationwide. In addition, Flaherty posted a 1.21 ERA, while striking out 16. In 2012 alone, the All-MIAC pitcher stamped his place in the Bethel record book with the most appearances in a single season (22), second-most saves in a season (6), and least earned runs in a season (5), while also posting the third most saves in a career (7).

Did You Know?

• Former Bethel University catcher Jay Slick signed a professional contract with the River City Rascals in O'Fallon, Missouri for the 2013 season with a club option for 2014. The 2012 BU graduate and three-time All-Conference player finished his career for the Royals among the top of many hitting categories, including a .386 batting average (3rd), .498 on-base percentage (t-1st), 96 walks (1st), 182 hits (4th), 135 runs (4th), 125 RBI (4th), and 274 total bases (4th).

Off the Field

• In late January, Bethel's Matt Rowley was announced as a semi-finalist for the Coach Wooden Citizenship Cup. Nearly 100 student-athletes are nominated each year and Rowley was one of five Division III contestants selected in the final 20. Others in the Top 20 included Matt Barkley (USC), Michael Clay (Oregon), and Brigetta Barrett (Arizona). The multi-sport, multi-division Cup is awarded each year to the athlete who exemplifies the highest standard of character on and off the field, and makes the greatest difference in the lives of others. Past winners include Tim Tebow, Zak Boggs, Quinton Carter, and Aleca Hughes.
