2014 MIAC Baseball Season Preview

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) baseball teams begin the 2014 season hoping to carry over some of the positives of 2013, while leaving some of the negatives far, far behind. Last season was among the most competitive seasons - top to bottom - in conference history, but it also was one of the worst in terms of weather and playing conditions.

In fact, the weather created such havoc for the league that the entire conference schedule was re-drawn in mid-



April in an attempt to still salvage as many conference contests as possible, as the first three weeks of the regular season were marred by rain, snow, sleet and winter temperatures. In addition, the conference amended its postseason tournament for one year only, from a four-team double-elimination tournament to a six-team, single elimination event.

Despite the awful spring weather, the MIAC came incredibly close to finishing the entire schedule, which is a borderline miracle considering snow was still falling into early May. Only one conference doubleheader couldn't get completed, as nearly all 11 teams completed a full slate of games. The result was all-time high parity throughout the majority of the standings. Places No. 2 through No. 9 were separated by a whopping two games, with five teams in a .500 log jam in the middle of the pack.

St. Thomas was the exception, as the Tommies cruised to the title with a near-perfect 19-1 record (34-7 overall), winning the conference's regular-season crown by eight full games over the two runners-up, Augsburg (24-15 overall) and Concordia (19-15 overall), who tied for second with identical 11-9 records and joined UST in the MIAC Playoff field. St. Thomas added the MIAC Playoff title, defeating Concordia in the title game to cap an exciting do-or-die weekend of baseball at Minnetonka's Veterans Field.

Below the Auggies and Cobbers was a mash-up of five teams all tied for fourth with .500 records. Bethel (24-15 overall), Saint Mary's (19-17 overall) and Gustavus (13-22 overall) were all 10-10, and Saint John's (18-16 overall) and St. Olaf (20-15) were both 9-9. When the tiebreaker dust settled, Bethel, Saint Mary's and Saint John's joined the top three in the six-team, single-elimination MIAC Playoffs.

Hamline finished 9-11 in MIAC play and 24-14 overall and was in ninth place despite being just two games out of second. Carleton came in 10th with a 6-14 MIAC record and a 16-20 overall mark, and Macalester rounded out the 2013 standings with a 4-16 conference mark and an 11-28 overall record.

Due to 2013's weather issues, the first questions surrounding the upcoming 2014 season isn't baseball related ... it pertains to the forecast. Will 2014 be as cruel to the MIAC and upper Midwest as 2013 was? Will the teams complete all 20 conference games as well as their nonconference slates? Will the fields be ready for outdoor action in late March? The entire league is crossing its collective fingers that Mother Nature is much more merciful after one of the harshest springs in memory.

Beyond that, all eyes again drift towards St. Thomas atop the standings. Will Head Coach Chris Olean and his club extend its run of dominance? The Tommies have won or shared the MIAC title each season dating back to 2003. UST returns much of its nucleus from last season's title team, so it will enter as the favorite to win its 12th league title in a row, and 34th overall.

However, there will be an incredibly deep field of challengers. The eight teams that finished between 11-9 and 9-11 in conference play a year ago all enter 2014 with high hopes to emerge from that pack and become legitimate threats to the Tommies in the title race, and Carleton and Macalester also hope for improvement as well to give the MIAC another incredibly deep pool of teams. As soon as the snow gets out of the way, expect the MIAC baseball action to quickly heat up.

TOMMIES TABBED FAVORITES FOR TITLE NO. 12

With all the returning talent back on the St. Thomas roster, it's no surprise the MIAC coaches collectively predict they'll be at the top of the standings again for the 12th season in a row. Olean's club was the unanimous No. 1 pick in the 2014 MIAC Baseball Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving 100 points and 10 first-place votes. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

The coaches also expect the parity below UST to continue. Augsburg received the other first-place vote and 79 points to finish second in the poll, and Concordia was just three points behind the Auggies in third with a total of 76. However, the MIAC coaches couldn't settle on who the fourth and final MIAC Playoff team would be in 2014, as Bethel and Saint John's tied for fourth in the coaches' poll with identical totals of 65 points.

Saint Mary's - fresh off two-straight MIAC Playoff appearances - finished just five points behind the Royals and Johnnies with 60 points in sixth place. St. Olaf had 53 points in seventh, Hamline came in eighth with 41 and Gustavus' 32 points were good for eighth place. Carleton rounded out the top 10 with 20 points in the poll, and Macalester was tabbed 11th with 14 points.

END OF AN ERA

There has already been one major baseball news story in the MIAC this season: the announcement that it will be the final season for long-time Concordia Head Coach Bucky Burgau. The Cobbers' leader is entering his 36th and final season as the team's head coach, and a year ago he became the first MIAC coach to reach 400 victories.

Burgau won't completely vanish from Concordia baseball or the MIAC, however. He plans to continue as an assistant coach in 2015, and will turn the program's reins over to current assistant and former star Chris Coste. The Cobbers' next head coach was a three-time MIAC MVP and All-American, and he won a World Series as a member of the 2008 Philadelphia Phillies.

Burgau's announcement is the only major coaching news in the conference, with no other programs making a coaching change in the offseason. Saint John's Jerry Haugen is the dean of MIAC coaches by one year over Burgau, as he enters his 37th season in Collegeville. St. Olaf's Matt McDonald hits a coaching milestone this season, in his 20th season as the Oles' head coach.

WHO'S BACK?

St. Thomas graduated two-time MIAC Pitcher-of-the-Year Dylan Thomas, but Olean's club is still the prohibitive favorite thanks to all the talent coming back. MIAC MVP Tim Kuzniar returns to the Tommie outfield, and All-Region catcher J.D. Dorgan is also back behind the plate. The pitching rotation is again loaded even with the loss of Thomas, as All-American starter Steve Maher returns, and Colin Wendinger enters 2014 with an active streak of 30 consecutive scoreless innings.

The 2014 Auggies could be one of Head Coach Keith Bateman's best teams after a run to the MIAC Playoff semifinals a year ago. Two-time All-MIAC shortstop Adam Carl and standout centerfielder Gary Mariscal are both back for Augsburg, and junior hurler Ryan Mestnik and his 10-4 career record will again be at the front of the Auggies' rotation.

Burgau's final team should be a good one, after reaching the MIAC Playoff title game a year ago in dramatic fashion. Junior outfielder Devin Johnson returns after a breakout All-MIAC season in 2013, and lefty Jackson Meland will be back on the mound after also earning All-Conference honors a year ago.

Bethel has to replace graduated star pitcher/hitter Matt Rowley but Head Coach Brian Raabe's team is eyeing another trip to the MIAC Playoffs. Cousins Mike and Luke Schultz both hit over .300 in 2013 and combined for 51 RBI, and Joe Zorn returns on the mound. Saint John's also hopes to return to the postseason, despite the graduation of Connor Cline, Joey Long and Ryan Spengler. Outfielders Dylan Graves and Aaron Pfaff return for Haugen's squad, and Luke Larson and his .330 batting average are back at the hot corner.

Saint Mary's has some pitching talent to replace, but Head Coach Nick Winecke has a tremendous lineup back in Winona. Infielders Kevin Gannon and David Barry and outfielder Willie Doll all are back, and all three hit over .300 last season. St. Olaf just missed a trip to the postseason in 2013, and hopes are high in Northfield for McDonald's 20th season on the bench. The Oles will again be led by Jack Schechinger, Nick Kulla and Chris Paradise.

Hamline loses All-MIAC performers Jordan Buck and Mark Radmacher, but Head Coach Jim Weyandt will have a solid rotation in his second season. Pitchers Matt Eickman and Rannon Arch lead the Piper returners, along with outfielder Dan Moro and his .323 batting average. Gustavus is another team that should be rich in pitching, as Head Coach Mike Middleton welcomes back All-Conference hurlers Grant Soderberg and Christopher Kelly in 2014 as the Gusties aim for postseason contention.

Carleton returns most of its squad, and hopes are high for Head Coach Aaron Rushing's lineup in 2014. Division III and MIAC Rookie-of-the-Year Hayden Tsutsui is back after hitting .462 as a freshman, and seniors David Stillerman and Jeff Dsida both hit over .340 last year.

Macalester returns All-MIAC third baseman Colin Carpenter, and Head Coach Matt Parrington will also have a talented outfield in 2014 with Ross Bronfenbrenner and Nick Sia both back in the lineup as the Scots eye upward movement in the standings.

CIRCLE THESE DATES

Augsburg got the 2014 season started on Feb. 14-15 with three nonconference games in Arkansas, and Carleton and Concordia will throw their first pitches this weekend. The full conference will be in action by early March. Conference play begins on Saturday, March 29, and each team will play 20 MIAC games - a doubleheader against each of the 10 teams - with the regular season concluding on Sunday, May 4. The 2014 MIAC Baseball Playoffs will be a four-team, double-elimination tournament May 9-11 at Minnetonka's Veterans Field.

The top three teams in the coaches' poll will all square off in the final weeks of the regular season which should add to the season's drama and intrigue. Augsburg travels up to Moorhead for a doubleheader at Concordia on April 16. The Cobbers head to St. Paul three days later to face St. Thomas on April 19, and the regular season will conclude when the Tommies travel across town to face the Auggies on May 4.

There are plenty of other intriguing matchups spread out throughout the season, starting when Playoff hopefuls Gustavus and Hamline square off on opening day - March 29 - on the Pipers' home field. Carleton and Macalester match up in a series of teams hoping for upward mobility on the Scots' home field on April 5. April 8 will feature a showdown of 2014 Playoff teams when Bethel travels to Saint John's and Saint Mary's will head to St. Olaf on April 30 for a late-season doubleheader that could carry huge postseason implications.

- 3.01: Last year the Royals' pitching staff led the league in both strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.01) and fewest walks allowed per nine innings (2.21). Perhaps even more impressive, BU finished No. 6 and No. 7 nationwide in those categories, respectively.

Did You Know?

• Bethel's ability to closeout games during the 2013 season was incredible. The Royals were an unbeaten 20-0 when leading after the fifth inning. This trend will be tested with additional nine-inning matchups in 2014.

Off the Field

• Bethel's baseball program has become a family affair, as the Royals roster in and among itself has three sets of brothers (Anderson's, Hangartner's, Sealock's). Moreover, two players have brothers on the football team (Marquardt, Nueville) and two players on the team are cousins (Schultz). Freshman Lars Anderson is the fourth Anderson son to don a Bethel uniform on the baseball diamond, as he'll be alongside brother Nik and cousin Mitch Frederickson in 2014.
