There were very few good guards in the conference and the coaches shifted Hollingsworth, first team center; Midgarten and Sand, pivot men on the Concordia and St. Olaf teams to those positions, making it extremely difficult to select the men. Joe Jenkins needed only one more first team vote to win high honors.
