

Two Cobbers Selected On Players All-MIAC

Bob Youso, senior center, and Jim Christopherson, junior half-back, have been named on the 1958 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference's players all-conference football team.

Youso makes his home in Moorhead. Christopherson is from Vin-
ning, Minn.

Fred Nelson of Glendive, Mont., an end, and Roger Gilbertson of Lake Park, Minn., a quarterback,

both seniors, were named on the second team.

Concordia, runnerup to unbeaten Gustavus Adolphus in the conference race, in which the Cobbers were the defending champions, was voted the sportsmanship award.

Each squad in the conference selected an all-opponent team. From these the points were awarded, with Bob Swiggum, Gustavus quarterback from St. Cloud, Minn., and Duane Deutz, St. John's junior halfback from Marshall, Minn., unanimous choices.

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Concordia players who earned honorable mention include Carl Grandstrand, a tackle, and Bill Greenan and Arlo Brunsberg, backs.

Jack Westin and Rollie Hanks of Gustavus and Dave Boyle of St. John's were selected for the end positions on the first team. Rog Ludwig and Sev Youso of St. John's were named as tackles. Sev Youso and Bob Youso, the center selection, are cousins.

The guards include Dick Rood of Gustavus and Felix Mannella of St. John's. With Swiggum, Christopherson and Deutz in the backfield is Dick Robinson of Augsburg.

Erwin Gloss of Macalester was teamed at end with Nelson on the second team. Bill Beck of Gustavus and Walt Dziedzic of St. Thomas were picked for the tackle posts.

Three guards were selected. They are Larry Boyle of Hamline, Brian Nichols of Macalester and Dick Gurtek of St. Thomas. Bill Rill of Gustavus was the center selection.

In addition to Gilbertson in the backfield, Dean Brown and Dick Johnson of Gustavus and Tom Irving of St. John's were picked.
