quarterback is Macalester senior Ron Stolski. Stolski beat out Gustavus' Paul Thompson because of his splendid job in guiding his club to within one game of the championship.

Of the running backs, Brunsberg and Richardson were the best among the breakaway threats while Skoog was unequalled when it came to cracking the middle. Brunsberg (half-back) and Skoog (end) also excelled on defense.
