

Six Cobbers Named Grid All-MIAC

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. (AP) — Unbeaten, untied Concordia led the balloting in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference all-star team announced Monday night by coaches of the eight league schools.

The Cobbers, MIAC champions, placed six men on the all-conference team. Gustavus Adolphus and Hamline each had five, St. John's four, Macalester two, and Augsburg, Minnesota-Duluth and St. Thomas one each.
