Johnnies sweep top honors as MIAC announces 2018 Football Awards

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. – The 2018 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) football season concluded earlier this month and on Tuesday, the Conference recognized the top performers from another outstanding campaign with the announcement of the 2018 MIAC Football Awards.

Saint John's quarterback **Jackson Erdmann** was selected Jim Christopherson MIAC Player of the Year by Conference coaches for his record-breaking season for the Johnnies, while SJU teammate **Nathan Brinker** earned the Mike Stam award as the top interior lineman in the Conference. MIAC Football coaches also selected Saint John's head coach **Gary Fasching** as the 2018 John Gagliardi Coach of the Year.

In addition to individual honors, the MIAC also announced First Team, Second Team, and honorable mention All-Conference selections, as well as the members of the 13th annual MIAC All-Sportsmanship Team.

Erdmann (Jr. | Rosemount, Minn.) was an integral part of Saint John's undefeated regular season, completing 65.1 percent of his passes for 1,942 yards and 23 touchdowns against just four interceptions in eight MIAC contests this year. Erdmann ended the regular season ranked second in all of NCAA Division III in both passing efficiency (195.8) and passing touchdowns (34) in overall games. He set a school record with 470 passing yards against



then-No. 3-ranked St. Thomas in the annual Johnnie-Tommie rivalry game in October, and closed out the year with another program-high, tossing seven scoring strikes against regionally-ranked Thomas More in the non-conference regular season finale. He is now the 20th Johnnie since 1953 to receive MIAC Player of the Year honors and the first SJU recipient since running back Sam Sura in 2014. The last Saint John's quarterback to win the award was Kurt Ramler in 1996.

Brinker (Sr. | Avon, Minn. | Holdingford) continued to cement his legacy as one of the MIAC's most disruptive interior linemen ever as a senior in 2018. The three-time First Team All-Conference pick logged 13.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, four batted passes, and a pair of forced fumbles in eight MIAC games this fall. He led the Conference in tackles for loss, marking his third consecutive season with double-digit takedowns behind the line of scrimmage, and his 6.5 sacks ranked second only to teammate **Ted Kalina**'s 8.5 in Conference play. Brinker is now the eighth Johnnie win the Mike Stam Award and the first since Kyle Schroeder in 2010.

Fasching became a three-time recipient of the award named for his predecessor, having been honored by his peers in 2014, 2017, and 2018. The sixth-year head coach guided the Johnnies to an undefeated regular season for the 21st time in team history, as well as the program's 33rd MIAC football championship. Fasching has also led the Johnnies to five consecutive NCAA Playoff berths, one shy of John Gagliardi's MIAC record of six in a row. A former MIAC student-athlete himself, Fasching was a three-year starter at linebacker for Gagliardi's Johnnies before spending 17 years as an assistant on the legendary coach's SJU staff. The MIAC Coach of the Year Award was renamed in honor of Gagliardi - college football's all-time wins leader - in 2013. Gagliardi passed away on October 7, 2018 at the age of 91.

Thirty-seven players were honored as First Team All-Conference selections, with an additional 26 players garnering Second Team accolades. The First Team squad featured 21 seniors, 11 juniors, and five sophomores, while the Second Team included 14 seniors, seven juniors, four sophomores, and one freshman. St. Thomas led the Conference with 12 First Team selections, followed by MIAC Champion Saint John's with 10. Regular season runner-up Bethel had five First Team honorees, while Gustavus had four, and Augsburg, Concordia, and St. Olaf each had two players selected to the 2018 First Team.

Five players joined elite company in becoming three-time All-Conference honorees. Saint John's defensive lineman **Nathan Brinker**, St. Thomas linebacker **Adam Brant**, and Bethel safety **Dawson Brown** all received First Team honors for the third time in as many seasons, while Augsburg wide receiver **Nick Heenie** (Second Team in 2016, First Team in 2017) and Hamline defensive lineman **Mitchell Maday** (First Team in 2016, Second Team in 2017) both received their third straight All-MIAC nods. Only 93 individuals have been named First or Second Team All-Conference three times in the <u>recorded history of MIAC football</u>.

As part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC also announced the 13th annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for football. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
