2003-04 MIAC Men's Basketball Athletes of the Week

March 1, 2004

Gustavus Adolphus College freshman post **Phil Sowden** (Brooklyn Park, Minn./ Park Center HS) averaged 18.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game to help the Gusties defeat Bethel 76-59 in the MIAC Playoff semifinals and Macalester 75-69 in the MIAC Championship. On Thursday against Bethel, Sowden was nine-of-ten from the field and three-of-five from the free throw line for a career high 22 points. On Saturday against Macalester, Sowden contributed 15 points and seven rebounds including several key baskets in the final minutes of the game to assure the Gusties of the victory. He played 30 minutes or more in both games. Sowden, who has started every game for the Gusties this season, is averaging 9.3 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. The Gusties, who will open NCAA Tournament play on Saturday, are currently 22-5 overall. Gustavus Adolphus College senior forward **Tim Brown** (Bloomington, Minn./ Jefferson) averaged 21.5 points per game to help Gustavus defeat MIAC playoff qualifiers Bethel (65-49) and Carleton (66-46) last week. The Gusties won the MIAC regular season title with a record of 18-2. Brown was 9-for-9 from the field and 4-for-4 from three point range for 22 points against Bethel and 8-for-12 from the field and 5-of-6 from three-point range for 21 points against Carleton. Brown made an amazing 17-21 (.809) shots from the field and 9-10 (.910) from three-point range during the week. He also scored his 1,000th career point on Saturday against Carleton. University of St. Thomas senior center **Nick Schader** (Shoreview, Minn./Totino-Grace HS) made a game-winning shot and a game-tying shot that forced overtime and made 21-of-27 from the field (78%) to help the Tommies clinch an MIAC playoff berth for the 16th time in 17 seasons. In Wednesday's overtime loss to Macalester, Schader had a career-high 31 points and had 11 rebounds and made a basket with: 01 to play to force overtime. In Saturday's 63-61 win at Carleton, his putback with 29 seconds left broke a 61-61 tie and proved to be a game winner. Counting his first two seasons at Waldorf College, Schader has 1,231 points and 653 rebounds on his college career. The Tommies are 11-12 overall and 9-9 in the MIAC with two games left in the regular season. Two-game totals: 43 points, 15 rebounds, 21-27 FG, 1-1 Ft, 2 asst, 2 TO, 2 blocks, 1 steal.

February 9, 2004

Concordia College senior guard **Josh Downey** (Bigfork, Mont.) averaged 18.6 points per game, shot 60.0% from the field and 64.7% from 3-point range in helping Concordia to a 3-0 record this past week. With the three victories, the Cobbers clinched a berth in the MIAC postseason playoff for the first time since the 200-01 season. On Monday against Bethel, Downey scored 17 points and collected four rebounds. He was 6-for-10 from the field, 3-for-5 from beyond the arc and 2-for-2 from the free throw line. He was part of the record-setting performance by the Cobbers at the foul line. As a team, Concordia went 25-for-25 from the free throw line. That mark set an MIAC record and was three shots away from setting the NCAA DIII record. It is the most consecutive free throws in a game this season by any team in any division. At St. Thomas on Wednesday, Downey scored a team-high 16 points, had two assists and hauled in four assists. He was 5-for-10 from the field, 3-for-7 from 3-point range and 3-for-4 from the free throw line. In Concordia's third win of the week, a 21-point victory over Carleton, Downey scored a team-high 17 points and grabbed four rebounds. He was 6-for-10 from the floor, 3-for-5 from 3-point range and 2-for-2 from the line. Macalester College senior forward **Ben Van Thorre** (Minneapolis, Minn. / Washburn) averaged 25.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 5.5 assists while shooting 57% from the field and committing just one turnover in wins last week over Augsburg and Concordia. He had 20 points and six assists in Macalester's 86-81 win Wednesday at Augsburg. In his team's 86-75 win Saturday over Concordia, Van Thorre had 31 points, eight rebounds and five assists. His 31 points against the Cobbers brings his career total to 1,538 - just three short of setting a new school record. University of St. Thomas senior guard **Neal Anderson** (Eden Prairie, Minn.) scored a career-high 29 points in a crucial Tommie road win at Saint John's, averaged 23.5 ppg and made 15-of-17 at the foul line in the Tommies' 1-1 week. In Monday's 76-72 home loss to Bethel, he had 18 points and seven rebounds. In Wednesday's win in Collegeville, he scored eight points to fuel a 10-0 run to open the second half that built a 15-point lead in a 65-60 victory. Anderson didn't play basketball his last three years of high school or his first two years of college and is starting for the first time. On the season he's made 49-of-114 from 3-point range (43%). January 19, 2004

Macalester College junior guard **Erik Jackson** (Evergreen, Colo.) shot 59% from the field, 69% from three-point range and averaged 19.5 points in Macalester wins last week over St. Olaf and Hamline. He was 7-for-8 on second half three-pointers in the two games as the Scots turned slight halftime leads into decisive victories. Jackson had 20 points, 18 in the second half, in a 73-54 win over the Oles. He went 5-for-6 on treys and scored 19 points in Macalester's 84-67 win over the Pipers. Espenson, the first player off the bench for Gustavus scored 16 points in a 66-54 loss at Macalester, 20 points in a 70-61 win at home against St. Thomas and 32 points in a 66-58 win at Saint Mary's. He almost single-

handedly guided the Gusties past Saint Mary's as he was 10-11 from the field (including 4-of-5 from three-point range), and 8-of-10 from the free throw line, while also grabbing seven rebounds and blocking two shots. Espenson scored 22 of the Gusties' 32 points in the first half against the Cardinals. He is averaging 13.5 points and 4.5 rebounds per game for the Gusties who are currently 8-4 overall and 6-1 in the MIAC. In the Royals 77-62 win over Augsburg, Jones tallied 22 points (7-14 FG, 3-6 3pt FG, 6-8 FT) and 4 rebounds in 28 minutes. He also had 2 blocks and 2 steals. In a 77-68 win over St. Olaf, Jones had 18 points in 33 minutes (6-21 FG, 6-14 3pt FG) and 8 rebounds. He also had 3 blocks and 1 steal. In Bethel's 95-87 overtime win over SJU on Saturday, Jones had a game-high 27 points (11-20 FG, 5-9 3pt. FG, 0-2 FT), 4 rebounds, 2 blocks, and 3 steals in 40 minutes.
