Headed by three repeaters from last year, eight players were named today to the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference 1967-68 all-loop team chosen by the conference

ence coaches.



The repeaters are Mark Miller, St. Thomas captain; Bob Laney, Concordia captain and conference scoring champion, and Tom Keenan, captain of the St. Mary's team and runnerup in the individual scoring race.

Conference champion Gustavus Adolphus and Macalester, one of three teams which tied for runnerup honors, placed two players each on the team. St. Thomas, St. Mary's, St. John's and Concordia each had one player selected.


The team consists of six seniors, a junior and one sophomore and averages 6-4 in height. Tallest player chosen is Carl Johnson, the Gusties' 6-10 sophomore center, who led the conference in rebounds with an average of 13.1 per game. He was also second in the conference in field goal accuracy and fifth in scoring.

Laney, Concordia's all-time scoring champ, won the scoring title with a 25.3 points per game average and was the loop's top field goal shooter with a .545 average. Laney and Johnson were placed at center on the eight-man team.

Teaming with Miller and Keenan in the front court was Gary Oberfeld, Macalester co-captain, who was fifth in field goal accuracy and fourth in rebounds. Keenan wound up with a 24.6 scoring average, the best by a St. Mary's player in more than a decade.

The one junior is Paul Bernabei, brilliant back-court ace for St. John's, who was named to one of the guard posts along with Steve Kagol, Gustavus captain, and Bob Caine, the other Macalester co-captain.
