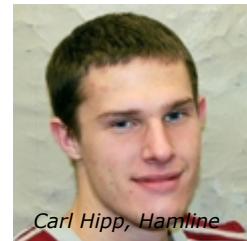


Hamline's Hipp headlines 2010-11 MIAC Men's Basketball Awards

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) announced the 2010-11 MIAC Men's Basketball Awards today, Feb. 28, 2011. Hamline University center Carl Hipp was named the 2010-11 MIAC Joe Hutton Player-of-the-Year. Hipp led the MIAC in scoring (17.6 ppg), rebounding (10.9 rpg) and blocked shots (2.0 bpg) while helping the Pipers finish third in the conference standings and earn a berth in the postseason.



It's fitting Hipp is the Joe Hutton Award recipient in 2010-11, as Hamline honored Hutton and nine other Piper standouts this season by dedicating a Row of Honor in Hutton Arena. Hipp's Player-of-the-Year honor, All-Conference honor and All-Defensive Team selection cap a stellar career that includes All-MIAC honors in 2010 and 2011, three consecutive years on the All-Defensive Team (2009-2011), an All-Conference Honorable Mention honor in 2009 and a spot on the All-First Year Team in 2008.

Carleton College junior forward Caleb Rosenow was selected as the MIAC Sixth Man-of-the-Year. Rosenow helped the Knights earn a share of the 2010-11 MIAC regular season championship and the No. 1 seed in the MIAC Playoffs. His contributions off the bench included 9.5 ppg, 4.6 rpg, 21 assists, 14 steals and an impressive .569 field goal percentage.

Carleton head coach Guy Kalland was chosen as the 2010-11 MIAC Coach-of-the-Year. Kalland (383-309) led the Knights to a share of the regular season conference title with an 18-7 overall record and a 17-3 conference mark in his 27th year at Carleton's head coach. It is his second Coach-of-the-Year honor, with the other coming in 2006. This was the Knights' 10th straight playoff appearance and 19th overall under Kalland, as well as their 19th winning season in his 27 years. This is Kalland's second MIAC regular season title after also sharing the crown with St. Thomas in 2005-06, and his third overall, counting the Knights' 2010 MIAC Playoff Championship.

Kalland's club led the MIAC in scoring defense, surrendering just 59.9 points per game in 2010-11. Their plus-6.1 scoring margin was second in the league, and their defense was also the best in the conference in opponent field goal percentage (.415) and opponent 3-point percentage (.296).

Regular season co-champions Carleton and St. Thomas each had two players named to the All-MIAC team, and Hamline, St. Olaf, Concordia and Saint Mary's had two players apiece on the team as well. The 15-person team also included players from Gustavus, Augsburg and Saint John's. The All-Conference team featured seven seniors, seven juniors and one sophomore.

St. John's Aaron Burtzel and Concordia's John Fraase are both three-time All-Conference selections, while Hipp, Carleton's Jeremy Sutherland and Seth Jonker and St. Thomas' Tyler Nicolai and Alex Healy are also repeat selections from the 2010 team. Saint Mary's Will Wright also earned his second All-Conference honor after being named to the team in 2009.

The MIAC also recognize an All-Defensive Team, which features all five players that were honored on last year's defensive squad, as well as an All-First Year Team and an All-Conference Honorable Mention squad.

As part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC also announced the fifth annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for men's basketball. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
