# MIAC announces 2019-20 Men's Basketball Awards

**BLOOMINGTON, Minn.** – With the 2019-20 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) men's basketball season in the books, the conference honored the year's top performers with the announcement of the annual MIAC Men's Basketball Awards on Tuesday.

Augsburg guard <u>Booker Coplin</u> and Saint John's wing <u>Jubie Alade</u> shared Joe Hutton Player of the Year honors, while St. Thomas senior forward <u>Elijah Hannah</u> was named MIAC Sixth Man of the Year and his head coach, <u>Johnny Tauer</u>, was selected the MIAC Coach of the Year.

Alade (Sr. | Plymouth, Minn. | Robbinsdale Armstrong) started all 20 conference games for the Johnnies this season, averaging 18.3 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. The senior wing eclipsed 20 points six times



against five different MIAC opponents during the regular season and led the league in both three-point percentage (53.6) and free throw percentage (89.6) in conference contests. Alade is the third Johnnies in the last 30 seasons to be named MIAC Player of the Year, joining Travis Weiss (1994) and Troy Bigalke (2000-01).

Coplin (Sr. | Shakopee, Minn.) earned his second straight MIAC Player of the Year honor after leading the conference in scoring for the second year in a row with an average of 24.1 points per league game. Coplin paced the MIAC in field goals (163), three-point field goals (52), free throws (105), and points (483) in his final season as an Auggie. He went for at least 20 points against 11 different MIAC squads this season and scored at least 30 three times in league play, with all three performances coming in the final month of the regular season. Coplin is one of only five players since 1990 to receive MIAC Men's Basketball Player of the Year honors more than once and he is the first to repeat as a Player of the Year honoree since St. Thomas' Isaac Rosefelt in 2006-07.

Hannah (Sr. | Apple Valley, Minn. | Minneapolis Roosevelt) averaged 18.6 minutes per game off the bench for the MIAC regular-season cochampion Tommies. The 6-foot-3 senior made the most of those minutes, posting at least 10 points in 14 of his 20 league games while shooting just over 55 percent on the year. St. Thomas is now 22-2 in games over the last two seasons when Hannah scores in double figures. Hannah is the 11th different Tommie to be named MIAC Sixth Man of the Year since 1989, joining a list that includes last year's winner, **Burt Hedstrom**, as well as current Tommie coach **Johnny Tauer**, who won the award as a player at St. Thomas in 1992.

Tauer was honored by his peers with MIAC Coach of the Year recognition for the fifth time in his career after leading the Tommies to a 23-2 regular season and 19-1 record in conference play. The ninth-year head coach guided the Tommies to a share of their 14th regular-season championship in the last 15 years. Tauer's previous Coach of the Year honors came in 2013, 2015, 2016, and 2019.

In addition to individual awards, MIAC coaches also voted on and selected All-Conference Teams, as well as the All-Defensive and All-First-Year Teams. Alade, Coplin, and Carleton's **Kent Hanson** all became three-time All-MIAC honorees, while eight players - Augsburg's **Matt Carik**, Bethel's **Jack Jenson**, Macalester's **Jackson Henningfield**, Saint John's **Zach Hanson** and **Lucas Walford**, Saint Mary's **Eli Cave**, St. Olaf's **Dominic Bledsoe**, and St. Thomas' **Anders Nelson**, each received All-Conference honors for the second time. Bledsoe, Coplin, and Walford were also repeat-selections to the All-Defensive Team.

As part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC also announced the 14th annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for men's basketball. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
