An opening-round 81 prevented him from contending for individual medalist honors at the MIAC Championships last season, although he rebounded to post a 1-over par 73 the final day, finishing sixth. Andrew Liesch came on strong in the fall and could give the Knights a strong second man in the rotation. Ellinger has 13 players on the 2001 roster, and hopes that some depth will emerge from these players to support Stangl and Liesch.

Alex Loesch (Jr., Kimball, MN / St. Cloud Cathedral) was Mac's top scorer at the St. John's Invitational and also returns to the Macalester lineup. Macalester begins the fall season Sept. 9-10 at the Augsburg Invitational. The Scots then play in the St. John's Invitational, the Carleton Invitational, and the Golf on the River Tournament at Mississippi Dunes before closing out the conference meet at Bunker Hills Oct. 5-6.
