MIAC announces 2019 Men's Hockey Awards

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. – On the heels of one of the most dramatic finishes in Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) men's hockey history, the conference announced its annual awards on Monday afternoon.

Augsburg senior goalie **Nick Schmit** was selected the 2019 MIAC Player of the Year, while his coach **Chris Brown** was honored by his peers as MIAC Coach of the Year.

Schmit (Fargo, N.D. | North) started 15 conference games for the MIAC champion Auggies this season, posting a goals-allowed average of 1.75 and a save percentage of .932 with a 12-1-2 record against league opponents. Overall, the senior ranks third in the country in winning percentage at 0.833 on the season and was essential to the Auggies clinching their fourth straight trip to the NCAA Division III Men's Hockey Tournament over the weekend, posting a career-high 57 saves in the MIAC Playoff Championship game. Schmit is the eighth Auggie ever to be named MIAC Player of the Year and the program's first since Aaron Johnson in 2007. He is also the first goalie to win the award since St. Thomas' Drew Fielding in 2015.

Brown was named MIAC Coach of the Year for the third time in his 13 seasons at Augsburg after guiding Augsburg to its 10th regular season conference title in program history and second championship in the last



four seasons. Under Brown's tutelage, the Auggies also became the first team in MIAC history to win four straight playoff championships, claiming their fourth in a row in a dramatic four-overtime thriller on Saturday. Brown was previously honored with Coach of the Year recognition following the 2006-07 and 2015-16 seasons.

In addition to individual awards, MIAC coaches also voted on All-Conference, Honorable Mention and All-Rookie Teams. Of the 20 men honored with All-Conference accolades, 12 were first-time selections, while Augsburg's **Luke Dietsch** and **Chandler Madry**, Concordia's **Tanner Okeson**, Saint John's **Brady Heppner** and **Andrew Lindgren**, Saint Mary's **Kyle Meeh**, St. Olaf's **Tuukka Totro**, and St. Thomas' **Brett Gravelle** were all recognized as All-MIAC for the second consecutive season.

As part of a Conference-wide sportsmanship initiative, the MIAC also announced the 13th annual All-MIAC Sportsmanship team for men's hockey. Members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrate ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.
