2015-16 MIAC Men's Hockey Season Preview

BLOOMINGTON, Minn. -- As last season proved, anything can happen in men's hockey in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC).

The 2014-15 season concluded with a pair of teams - Hamline and Saint Mary's - dueling in the MIAC Men's Hockey Playoff championship game, which was won by the Pipers. Prior to the season, Hamline were picked to finish last in the Preseason Coaches' Poll, with the Cardinals checking in at No. 7. The dramatic rise of those two programs was a great story in its own right, but it



also demonstrated the parity and level of play in the only Division III conference in the "State of Hockey."

What wasn't surprising was another regular-season MIAC championship for St. Thomas, marking the fourth-straight season the Tommies have won or shared the regular-season crown. Head Coach Jeff Boeser's squad was a unanimous pick in the coaches' poll, and UST went 10-3-3 (16-6-4 overall) to edge Saint Mary's (15-10-2, 9-5-2 MIAC) by three points (34 to 31) atop the standings.

Joining the Tommies, Pipers and Cardinals in the MIAC Playoffs were Concordia (13-9-4, 8-5-3 MIAC, 28 points) and Augsburg (12-14, 9-7 MIAC, 27 points). Hamline finished fifth in the regular season with 25 points (14-11-4, 7-6-3 MIAC), and then won three-straight road games in the MIAC Playoffs to claim the postseason title and a trip to the NCAA tournament.

As usual, the five MIAC Playoff bids weren't secured until the season's final day, as two other teams couldn't have been much closer to joining the field. Both Saint John's (11-9-5, 7-7-2 MIAC) and Gustavus (8-9-8, 5-5-6 MIAC) finished in a tie for sixth place at 24 points, just one point out of the final Playoff spot. St. Olaf (6-16-3, 4-10-2 MIAC, 16 points) and Bethel (4-19-2, 2-13-1 MIAC, 7 points) rounded out the final standings a year ago.

As the puck gets set to drop on the new season, the rise of Saint Mary's and Hamline a year ago gives hope to each and every team in the MIAC. Each year the talent level seems to rise on all nine campuses, and the standings continue to get a little tighter. When the ice shavings settle in February, it won't be surprising at all to see seven, eight, or even nine teams all still in the mix for a trip to the conference postseason tournament.

TOMMIES 'DRIVE FOR FIVE' TOPS COACHES' POLL

St. Thomas enters the 2015-16 looking to claim the conference title for the fifth-straight season, and the MIAC coaches think that's a strong possibility. The Tommies were again a unanimous pick to win the conference title with eight first-place votes and 64 points atop the 2015-16 MIAC Men's Hockey Preseason Coaches' Poll. Coaches cannot vote for their own team in the poll.

Last season's MIAC Playoff finalists occupied the next two spots, as the league's coaches expect them to build on their momentum. Saint Mary's slotted in at No. 2 with the other first-place vote and 51 points, while Hamline received 48 points to finish a close third in the rankings. Saint John's received 41 points to grab the No. 4 spot.

The battle for the fifth and final Playoff spot saw three teams separated by just one point a year ago, and coaches expect another insanely close competition in 2015-16. Augsburg and Concordia each received 33 points to tie for fifth place in the coaches poll, and Gustavus received 30 points to finish in a close seventh. St. Olaf (16) and Bethel (eight) rounded out the final two spots in the coaches' predictions.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

St. Thomas enters its quest for a fifth-straight MIAC title ranked No. 15 in the nation by D3hockey.com. The Tommies lose star goalie Drew Fielding and All-Americans Michael Krieg and Alex Altenbernd, but also have plenty of talent coming back. Senior captains John Kritland (defenseman) and Wilie Faust (forward) and alternate captain Steve Sorenesen (defenseman) will anchor another deep, talented St. Thomas squad.

Saint Mary's has a hole to fill on the blue line with the graduation of AllI-MIAC defenseman Bob Marx, but the Cardinals have most of its stars back from last seasons' meteoric rise. Junior forward Martin Gruse returns as one of the league's top scorers, and fellow juniors Bob Kinne (forward) and Mike Mezzano (defenseman) are both back as well to give Saint Mary's a stellar returning nucleus.

Hamline starts the season receiving votes in the D3hockey.com poll and hopeful to defend its remarkable MIAC Playoff title. Like Saint Mary's, the team loses its anchor on defense as Joe Rubbelke graduated, but the Pipers' top-three scorers are all back for their senior season. Brandon Zurn, Charlie Adams and Kevin Novakovich combined for 89 points a year ago, and are primed for more big numbers in their encore.

Saint John's just missed out on a trip to the Playoffs a year ago and will be looking for scoring following the graduation of John Haeg and Phil Johnson, but SJU's hopes start with the return of star goalie Saxton Soley for his senior year. Forwards Kevin Becker and Andrew Commers also return to lead the Johnnie offense in 2015-16. Augsburg should have no problem finding the net in its quest to return to the MIAC Playoffs, as All-MIAC forwards Mack Ohnsted and Corbin Chapman both return. Senior defenseman Lucas Hendrickson is also back as the team tries to replace All-MIAC blue liner Zach Dick.

Concordia graduated two-time All-MIAC scoring star Andrew Deters, but the Cobbers have talent back across the board as they aim for another postseason bid as well. Three-time All-MIAC forward Jordie Bancroft is back to write the final chapter to his stellar career, and defenseman Charlie Aus and forward Garrett Hendrickson were both All-MIAC Honorable Mention picks last season. Gustavus was another team that just missed out on a trip to the postseason and will have to replace standout goalie John McLean, but a trio of sophomores - defensemen Jake Bushey and Drew Aspinwall and forward Sam Majka - are expected to take a big step forward to lead the Gusties in their second seasons.

St. Olaf also has a goalie to replace following Steve Papciak's graduation, but the Oles are set up front with a trio of talented, upperclass forwards all returning in junior Steven Sherman and seniors Nick March and Peter Lindblad. Bethel hopes to ascend up the standings in 2015-16 and has the pieces in place to move up the ranks, as All-MIAC senior wing Mitch Hughes returns to lead a nucleus that includes All-MIAC Honorable Mention defenseman Tony Larson and senior forward Travis Payne.

CIRCLE THESE DATES

Fans don't have much longer to wait, with three huge dates circled on the 2015-16 men's hockey calendar right off the bat. The MIAC Men's Hockey Showcase will once again begin the season in its second year at the Schwan Super Rink in Blaine, Minn. The Showcase has proven to be an outstanding event that celebrates hockey in the MIAC and puts all nine teams on display in an exciting season-opening event.

The Showcase will begin Friday (Oct. 30) with three games at 6:30 p.m., 7 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., and will follow the same schedule on Saturday (Oct. 31). The event will conclude Sunday with games at 2:30 p.m., 3 p.m. and 3:30 p.m., as all nine teams will play two games that will count as nonconference contests in the standings to open the season in style. There will be live stats for all games for fans who can't make it to Blaine, and the MIAC Men's Hockey Showcase home page will be updated throughout the event with scores, stats, photos, recaps and more.

The following two weekends will include a mix of nonconference and conference games, with MIAC play beginning in full on the weekend of Nov. 20-21. Following a break in late December for finals and the holidays, nonconference games will resume in January, with conference play starting up again on Jan. 22-23, and running through the season's final weekend (Feb. 19-20). The MIAC Men's Hockey Playoffs will follow with the quarterfinal game scheduled for Thursday, Feb. 25, semifinals on Saturday, Feb. 27, and the championship set for Saturday, March 5.

UW-Eau Claire won the 2013 national title, while UW-Stevens Point has lost each of the last two championship games and Oswego State finished runner-up in 2012 and 2013 after winning the title in 2007.

• The Cardinals played seven overtime games last season—including their first double-overtime game in the last two decades. Saint Mary's went to a shootout vs. both St. Thomas and Saint John's, while beating Concordia (twice) and Hamline, and dropping 2-1 and 3-2 OT decisions to Gustavus and nationally ranked UW-Stevens Point, respectively.
