
Nick Ward, Augsburg

The mark is also an NCAA provisional time, which ranks Ward 16th nationally.

Mike Hutton, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas first-year **Mike Hutton** (Apple Valley, Minn.) won the 800 meter run in a time of 1:52.53 at the Meet of Saints on Thursday, April 9 at St. Thomas. Hutton's time is the fastest this season in the MIAC, fifth best in Division III this year, 11th fastest in St. Thomas history, and is a NCAA provisional qualifying time. St. Thomas All-American Brian Sames was right behind Hutton to finish second in 1:53.09.

Tom Ballinger, Carleton

Carleton College senior Tom Ballinger (Wenatchee, Wash.) won the 400m Hurdles on Saturday at the Hamline Invitational with an NCAA provisional qualifying time of 53.75 placing him third on the National list. This marks the fourth consecutive year that Ballinger, a two-time All-American, has hit the NCAA qualifying standard in the 400m Hurdles. Ballinger is currently ranked among the top five in the MIAC in the 110m Hurdles, the 400m Hurdles, the 400m, and is a member of Carleton's 4x400m Relay.

John Schantzen, St. Olaf

St. Olaf College junior **John Schantzen** (Lake Elmo, Minn./Stillwater) won the shot put event at the Meet of Saints on Thursday, April 9 at St. Thomas with a personal best toss of 16.55 meters. Schantzen's throw is currently the best throw in the MIAC this season and ranks him third in Division III.

Derall King, Hamline

Hamline University sophomore **Derall King** (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) hit an NCAA provisional shot put mark in his first outdoor meet of the season at the Hamline Invite on Saturday. King's put of 16.30 meters (53-5 3/4) not only hit the NCAA provisional distance but also ranks him first in the MIAC and it was the second-best throw in Division III this season. He finished second in the event to an unattached competitor.
