2012 MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Awards

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- The 2012 MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Awards were announced Saturday, following the final session of the 2012 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center. St. Thomas, St. Olaf and Saint John's swept the top individual awards. MIAC Men's Swimmer-of-the-Year honors were claimed by Saint John's Josh Seaburg, who dazzled throughout the three-day event by winning an individual championship on each day. Seaburg claimed victories in the 500-yard freestyle, the 200-yard butterfly and the 400-yard individual medley. The Johnnie senior also led off SJU's third-place 800-yard freestyle relay team to make it four All-Confernece honors throughout the event.



MIAC Men's Diver-of-the-Year honors went to St. Olaf's Ian Straehley. The Oles' senior captured the MIAC title on the 3-meter diving board thanks to a spectacular final dive that cemented the title, and he also finished second on the 1-meter board to establish himself as the conference's top men's diver in 2012. Straehley's 3-meter score met the 2011 NCAA Selection Standard.

The team race was decided by just three points, with St. Thomas edging St. Olaf by three points in the final event to capture the team title, and both teams' coaches were honored for such a close, hard-fought performance. Tommies' head coach Tom Hodgson and St. Olaf coaches Dave and Bob Hauck were recognized as MIAC Men's Swimming Co-Coaches-of-the-Year, and St. Thomas' Mark Dusabeck was voted the MIAC Diving Coach-of-the-Year for his work with men's 1-meter champ Nick Johnson and MIAC Women's Diver-of-the-Year Jennifer Easton.

In addition to the individual awards, the members of the 2012 All-MIAC Sportsmanship Team were also announced and honored Saturday, and are listed below. This marks the sixth-straight season an All-Sportsmanship team was recognized as part of a conference-wide sportsmanship initiative. The members of the All-MIAC Sportsmanship team are selected by their coaches and teammates as individuals who demonstrated ideals of positive sportsmanship both on and off the field of competition.

Throughout the 2012 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships, the top eight finishers in each event were recognized with a podium awards ceremony shortly after the conclusion of each race. The top three finishers in each event received MIAC All-Conference honors, and were awarded with a medal to recognize their achievement. The 2012 MIAC All-Conference honorees are listed below, by finish and event.
