2000-01 MIAC MEN'S SWIMMING PREVIEW

The 2000-01 MIAC men's swimming and diving season kicks off with the MIAC Relays on October 28, 2000, hosted by the College of St. Catherine.

Gustavus Adolphus College placed first at last year's conference championship, upsetting favorite St. Olaf. The Oles won 20 consecutive titles from 1970 to 1999, and are expected to remain strong in 2000-01. The Gusties are also in the hunt for the 2001 championship after their surprise MIAC win last winter. This season's MIAC Championship will take place at the University Aquatic Center on the campus of the University of Minnesota, February 15-17, 2001.

Season Preview:

With a strong returning group of veterans, Carleton looks to break its string of recent fourth-place finishes at the MIAC Championships in 2000-01. "What we lack in depth we make up for in team chemistry, focus and enthusiasm in addition to our abilities, which will allow us to achieve top results at the end of the season," Clark remarked. Clark expects his team to be strong in the relays this season, as the Knights placed in the top four in every single relay in the 2000 MIAC Championships, except in the 800 freestyle relay where their first-place finish was disallowed after premature celebration. While the Knigths will lack a strong diving presence, he is hopeful that a strong group of newcomers can progress and offer solid contributions by the end of the season.

Season Preview:

After compiling an overall dual meet record of 7-0 and finishing first at the MIAC Championships during the 1999-00 season, the Gustavus men's swimming team is anticipating a season of continued success in 2000-01. Although the Gusties will miss graduated seniors Erik Lindstrom, Joe Majewski, Brian Smith, and James Wetherbee, Coach Carlson is excited about the talented class of first year students, including Sam Wigersma and sophomore transfer Chris Kramer, and believes this team will be able to contend for another MIAC title. The Gusties will start the season with a pair of important dual meets against conference rivals Carleton and St. Olaf which will set the stage for the season. The team will begin its taper in early February in preparation for the MIAC Championships which will be held at the University of Minnesota on February 15-17. After capturing its first title in 40 years, the Gusties are excited about the opportunity to claim back-to-back championships in the 2000-01 MIAC season.

The Saint John's University swimming and diving team enters the 2000-01 season coming off of a third place finish at last year's MIAC championship meet. The Johnnies will need to replace six seniors from last year's roster, including Soren Peterson, who was SJU's only NCAA championship participant in 2000. Peterson won the MIAC title in the 50-yard freestyle and finished in 26th place nationally. Coming into the season, SJU has over 25 people on its roster and are excited about the prospects for the season. The Johnnies return sophomore Luke Vestrum, who won MIAC titles in 2000 in the 200 backstroke and 200 IM. SJU will once again be coached by Bill Saxton. Saxton, in his third season in Collegeville, has led the Johnnies to two consecutive third place finishes at the MIAC meet.

Season Preview:

Eric Lindquist will be the first to admit that it takes a lot of patience to build a successful swimming and diving program. But the Saint Mary's University head coach is running out of patience, it's time for his teams to make a move out of the cellar of the MIAC.

"You are always looking to improve your numbers, to build that solid foundation," Lindquist said. "But there comes a time when you need to start focusing on quality and not so much just on quantity."

For the first time since Lindquist has been involved in the program, the Cardinals have both. Led by co-captains Shawn McCarthy (Crystal Lake, Ill.) and Luke Sassolino (Chicago, Ill.), the men's team is completely intact from a year ago, and the addition of four freshmen make the group deeper than it's ever been. "We've set some pretty lofty goals," admitted the second-year head coach. "We want to improve our dual-meet record (the SMU went 2-4 in six duals), and, more importantly, we want to improve our standing at the conference meet."

Lindquist isn't about to predict a conference championship from either of his squads, but he does expect both teams to make the climb up a few rungs of the MIAC ladder. "It's almost like the MIAC is divided into different plateaus," explained Lindquist, whose men's team finished seventh a year ago. "At the top, you have teams like Gustavus and St. Olaf, perennial swimming powers. From there, there's a significant drop-off to the next plateau, but it's there, the third, fourth, fifth spots in the conference, that we're gunning for."

And if expectation turns into execution, Lindquist is confident that's exactly where you will find the Cardinals when all the conference-meet dust settles. "Last year was a bit of a learning year for everyone involved with the program," said Lindquist of his first season as the Cardinals' head coach. "The team needed to get used to my expectations, and I had to adjust to life as a head coach, as well as to what these individuals were capable of.

"Now, everyone knows what I expect, they know about my mandatory two-a-days, all season long, they know what it's like to train hard all season, to swim tired, and they know that my system works. "That's one of the biggest reasons why my expectations are so much higher this year."

That, and the return of such swimmers as McCarthy, who set school records in both breaststrokes a year ago; Ben Chastek (St. Paul, Minn.), who, thanks to a rigorous off-season workout program, figures to have a break-through season.

"I'm excited and everyone on this team is excited about this year," Lindquist said. "This program has definitely turned the corner, now it's time for us to prove we're ready to make the jump to that next plateau."

Klugherz and captains Chris Bindert (SR-Maple Grove/Osseo), Drew Skirka (SR-Fridley), and Todd Sorensen (SR-Monticello) lead a strong returning core. Nick Schleder (SO-Forest Lake), Abe Hedtke (SO-Monticello), join Jon Waataja (SO-Golden Valley), Keith Murphy (SR-Hutchinson) and Greg Aulwes (SR-Brooklyn Center/Robbinsdale Cooper) as likely scorers at the MIAC Championships. Newcomer Eric Lindell (FR-Shoreview/Mounds View) could potentially be a force in the backstroke, and joins Hedtke and Schleder to give the Tommies a solid 1-2-3 punch in the backstroke, and a great start in the medley relay. "We've always been a team capable of building from within," says UST head coach Tom Hodgson, "and this year, even though we are a smaller team, we have great balance and even potential."
