
2013 MIAC Men's Swimming and Diving Championship Preview

MINNEAPOLIS - The top swimmers and divers in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) are set to dive back in the water and step back into the spotlight this week at one of the conference's annual highlights - the 2013 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships. The popular three-day event - held once again at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center in Minneapolis - will take place Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Feb. 14-16.

Fans will be treated to an action-packed three days with six total sessions, including both a morning and an evening session each day. The morning sessions - each starting at 10:30 a.m. - will feature preliminary races and diving. The evening sessions will follow each day at 6:30 p.m. with event finals, diving and medal stand ceremonies. Doors will open at 9 a.m. for each morning session and at 5:30 p.m. Thursday and Friday. The doors for Saturday's final session will open at 3 p.m.



This year's event will have its work cut out for it if it hopes to match the drama of the 2012 MIAC Men's Championships. The team title wasn't decided until the final race, when St. Thomas claimed victory in the final relay race to edge St. Olaf for the title by a mere three points. Tom Hodgson's Tommie team finished with a total of 765 to the Oles' score of 762, and the excitement surrounding the final event and the final scoreboard update were as palpable as the pool's humidity. Fittingly, Hodgson and St. Olaf's Dave and Bob Hauck shared MIAC Men's Swimming Coach-of-the-Year honors.

Gustavus scored 570 points to finish third a year ago, with Saint John's (456) edging Carleton (426) by 30 points as both teams rounded out the top five spots in the standings. Saint Mary's scored 141 to finish sixth, Macalester came in seventh at 109 and Hamline finished eighth with 74 points a year ago.

This season, expect another close battle at the top with St. Thomas and St. Olaf again eyeing the conference championship. Though it may not be decided by a few points in the final event of the meet, the race for the 2013 should be just as entertaining and could feature and even deeper pool of contenders. Both Saint John's and Carleton appear to be narrowing the gap between themselves and the top of the standings, and Gustavus will always be in the mix as well. It could be an entertaining five-team fight to the finish, while Saint Mary's, Macalester and Hamline also look for improved scores and times with promising performers on each squad's championship roster.

The Tommies bring back a slew of stars, most of whom are still underclassmen. Junior diver **Nick Johnson** was the one-meter champion a year ago, and enters as the top seed on both the one- and three-meter boards in 2013. Junior **Justin Mullee** also has a title to defend in the 200-yard backstroke, and senior **Sam Rauchwarter** anchored UST's winning 400-yard freestyle relay team and returns as a three-time national qualifier. Junior swimmer **Ben Henrickson** is also back, and freshman **Michael Lanz** is seeded in the top four in three different events.

St. Olaf also has a loaded roster back in 2013, starting with super sophomore **Michael Gratz**, who won three individual titles in his MIAC debut a year ago, and is seeded first in four events this season. Junior **Colby Kubat** has the top time in all of Division III in the 100-yard breaststroke, as well as the MIAC's top time in the 200-breast. Junior **Specner Scarth**, sophomore **Tanner Roe** and freshman **Billy Brebrick** all hold the MIAC's top time in multiple events.

Gustavus will be led by star sophomore Zac Solis, who earned All-MIAC honors a year ago, and fellow Gustie sophomore **Kurt Youngdahl** holds three top-10 times heading into the conference championships. Saint John's graduated MIAC Swimmer-of-the-Year **Josh Seaburg**, but returns a talented youthful core of sophomores **Logan Arnold** - the 2012 100-yard backstroke champ - and **Joe Duxbury**, as well as freshmen **Preston Marsh** and **Braden McCormack**. Carleton star **Erik Klontz** could be in contention for Swimmer-of-the-Year honors, as the 2012 50-yard freestyle champ and Division III All-American has already qualified for nationals in both the 50 and the 100. The Knights also will rely on All-MIAC veterans **Mamrou Kanazawa** and **Benitio Ramirez** at this year's event.

Saint Mary's will be led by senior **Mark Ross**, who holds seven Cardinal school records, and diver **Brian Barker** - who finished sixth on both boards in 2012 - as well as freshman **P.J. Heller**, who has the team's top times in the 50- and 200-freestyle. Macalester will look to a trio of talented first-year swimmers, **Ben Kromash** (distance), **Alex Rack** (backstroke) and **Walter Benson** (freestyle/backstroke) to make an impact in their first MIAC appearance. Hamline also has high hopes for some promising underclassmen, including freshmen **Tyler Stanchfield** (distance) and **Parker Johnson** (freestyle/backstroke) and sophomore **Glenn Dworsky** (freestyle/backstroke).

Concordia College, St. Catherine University and Saint Mary's University are serving as this year's host institutions. Tickets are available at either a single-session rate, or all-session passes will also be available for purchase for fans who plan to attend the entire event. Single session admission is \$8 for adults and \$4 for students, while the all-session passes cost \$40 for adults and \$20 for students.

For the second consecutive year, the price of admission includes a heat sheet at each session, and for the first time, the MIAC will offer heat sheets for each session online to assist fans using mobile devices, or viewing the online broadcast. MIAC sport passes will be accepted for admittance. No other passes or discounts will be honored. Due to construction at the U of M, the only working entrance to the facility will be on the University Ave. side.

As in years past, all six sessions will be broadcast live online thanks to <u>Webcast America</u>. Fans will also be able to watched <u>archived video of each session</u> following the event and purchase DVDs of the broadcasts via Webcast America's site. There will also be "live" results available online with results updated shortly after the conclusion of each event for fans following the action from afar.

The MIAC has an exclusive Web site for the 2013 MIAC Swimming & Diving Championships. The site features the complete event schedule, psych sheet, ticket information, venue information and a map, as well as links to the live broadcast and stats. The site will be constantly updated throughout the event with results, recaps, photos and more.

The preview also includes a video preview of the event, information and links for coverage of the 2013 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships, helpful MIAC men's swimming and diving links and team-by-team previews for all 11 teams.

- 45.86: Klontz also holds the second-best time in the MIAC in the 100-free this season, with a time of 45.86

• 5: In five of the last eight seasons, the Knights have finished in the top four at the MIAC Championships

Did You Know?

• Senior Erik Klontz recently qualified twice for nationals, in both the 50-yard and 100-yard freestyle. Klontz raced in both of these events in the 2012 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, finishing 10th in the 100-yard freestyle and eighth in the 50-yard freestyle. He became the first Carleton men's swimmer to earn All-American distinction in the 50-yard freestyle and the ninth to earn All-American status.

Out of the Pool

• Each year the Knights host the "Hour of Power" Relay in honor of Carleton College swimmer Ted Mullin, who passed away in the fall of 2006 from sarcoma, a rare soft-tissue cancer. Funds raised through this event support research at the University of Chicago into the causes and treatment of sarcoma in young people. In its first six years, the Honor of Power has raised over \$330,000.

• As a display of support for sophomore teammate Grace Goblirsch (River Falls, Wis.) who was diagnosed with leukemia in December, head coach Jon Carlson, assistant coach Luke Weyandt, and six male swimmers shaved their heads in front of the entire team on the pool deck of the Lund Center Natatorium. The team is also wear "Race For Grace" wristbands at the MIAC Championships, and has been selling t-shirts as a fundraiser for their teammate.

• The Gustavus Adolphus men's and women's swimming teams will host the Area 6, 8, and 9 Special Olympics swimming competition on Sunday, Feb. 10. The Gusties will invite Special Olympics athletes to the Lund Center Natatorium for what is one of the largest swim meets in the region. Last year, over 400 athletes came together at Gustavus for the swim meet, individual basketball skills challenge, basketball tournament, and power lifting competitions..

- 14: SJU has 14 top-10 times by five different freshmen; Marsh leads with seven, while Jack Getty and Ben Studer combined for five. McCormack and Nolan Bauer gives the Johnnies the other two.
- 3: The Johnnies need to replace the 2012 MIAC Swimmer of the Year, Josh Seaburg, and his three individual titles from last year. Last season, he became the first Johnnie to win three conference titles at the same MIAC Championships since 1999.

Did You Know?

• Of the 39 previous appearances at the MIAC Championships (since 1974), SJU has finished in the top three 33 times, including 16 seasons in second place. The Johnnies, however, have never won the conference title.
