

2013 MIAC MEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING CONFERENCE PREVIEW

ST. PAUL, Minn. -- For the second-straight year, the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) men's swimming and diving championship was decided by an extremely narrow margin. With the young 2013-14 season under way, St. Olaf and St. Thomas are set to duel at the top once again, with a number of other teams trying to join the face for the title.

Last season, the Oles held off the Tommies in memorable fashion, 787-748, to capture the 2013 MIAC championship. That fight to the finish came a year after



The race for third place a year ago was just as entertaining, as Carleton edged Gustavus by just two points - 528-526 - with Saint John's scoring 438 to round out the top five. Hamline (138 points), Macalester (134 points) and Saint Mary's (96 points) were also closely grouped to finish out the final standings.

Last season's title was St. Olaf's fourth in the past seven years and 28th title overall, and the Oles will try to continue the dynasty in 2013-14. However, in the team's recent run of success, St. Olaf hasn't won back-to-back titles, claiming the championship every other year, so a repeat win in 2014 would be a new accomplishment for this current crop of Ole stars.

However, St. Thomas returns a talented team yet again and will try to interrupt a string of St. Olaf titles, as the Tommies did in 2012 when they captured the title in dramatic fashion. Annual contenders Carleton, Gustavus and Saint John's also have plenty of talent on this year's roster to join the championship conversation. Hamline embarks on its first season under a new coach, and Macalester and Saint Mary's also have high hopes to ascend the standings, which should make 2013-14 another thrilling year in the pool around the MIAC.

WHAT'S NEW?

An extremely veteran group of head coaches welcomes one new face to the conference this season, as Ryan Hawke takes over head coaching duties at Hamline. Hawke comes to the Pipers after spending the last three seasons as the head coach at UW-River Falls. The UWRF alum replaces Frank Vaccaro, who is now the Aquatic Manager at the University of Notre Dame.

The rest of the faces on the coaching landscape are plenty familiar with an astonishing number of years on the pool deck. St. Olaf's Dave Hauck is entering his milestone 40th season leading the Oles, along with his son Bob who is in his 24th season. St. Thomas' Tom Hodgson is next in his 35th season, and Gustavus' Jon Carlson, Carleton's Andy Clark, Saint John's Bill Saxton and Saint Mary's Eric Lindquist have all been at their posts for at least 15 seasons. Macalester's Beth Whittle is starting her fourth season leading the Scots.

WHO'S BACK?

The Oles could finally be in line to win back-to-back MIAC titles thanks to a star-studded lineup back in Northfield. All-American junior Michael Gratz who won the MIAC title in the 200-yard individual medley leads, along with seniors Colby Kubat (MIAC meet record in 100-yard breaststroke, defending 200-breast champ), Spencer Scarth (MIAC 400-IM champ). Junior Tanner Roe is the MIAC meet record holder in the 200-yard freestyle and the defending champ in the 500 free, and Billy Brebrick made quite a splash as a freshman setting a conference record in the 200-yard butterfly and a MIAC meet record in the 100-fly.

St. Thomas' optimism starts on the diving board, where 2013 MIAC Diver-of-the-Year Nick Johnson returns after winning the conference title on both the 1- and 3-meter boards a year ago. Senior sprinter Ben Henrickson has finished second in the 50-yard freestyle in each of the past two years and will look to move into first this season, and Michael Lanz is back for his sophomore season after reaching the NCAA championships in his collegiate debut a year ago.

Carleton has the tough task of replacing 2013 MIAC Swimmer-of-the-Year Erik Klontz and fellow star Mamoru Kanazawa, who both graduated, but the Knights have returning talent to ease the transition. Seniors Benito Ramierz has earned All-MIAC honors in each of his first three season, while junior Evan Harris earned All-Connference accolades in a pair of events a year ago. Sophomore George McAneny will also be counted on after helping the Carleton 200-freestyle relay team earn Honorable Mention All-American honors in 2013.

Gustavus welcomes back a lot of talented underclassmen to bolster its 2013-14 expectations. The Gusties will be led by junior Zac Solis, who earned a pair of second-place MIAC finishes a year ago. Sophomore Donte Colucci also earned a pair of All-MIAC honors as a freshman, and another Gustavus sophomore - diver Bennet Woltjer - was third on the one-meter board at the MIAC meet a year ago.



Saint John's said goodbye to a pair of talented swimmers in Logan Arnold and Preston Marsh, but the Johnnies also have a good, young nucleus back. Nolan Bauer had three top-10 finishes at the MIAC meet in his conference debut last year, and junior Joe Duxbury helped two Johnnie relay teams set school records. Sophomore Braden McKormick had two top-six MIAC finishes a year ago, and freshman Jose Alvarez recently earned the first MIAC Athlete-of-the-Week honor of the young season.

Hawke's first Hamline team will be led by distance swimmers Zach Lameyer and Tyler Stanchfield, as well as backstroke/freestyler Glenn Dworsky-Rye. Macalester sophomore Ben Kromash was fifth int he mile in his first MIAC meet last season, and he'll join seniors Nathan Schachtman and Clark Jacobson as the Scots' top swimmers. Saint Mary's will also be led by a talented sophomore, as P.J. Hellelr had the team's top times in the freestyle events in his collegiate debut and could be ready for a breakout season.

CIRCLE THESE DATES

A few of the MIAC teams began competition in late October, with the rest of the league joining in this month. A good MIAC Championship preview will take place at the same site as the conference meet - the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center - when Carleton, Gustavus, Hamline, Saint John's and St. Thomas all compete in the Jean Freeman Invitational on Dec. 6.

There are a couple chances to catch multiple MIAC teams in action in January as well, starting on Jan. 25. Hamline, Saint John's and Saint Mary's will all travel to St. Paul that day to compete in the St. Catherine Invitational. Then, on Jan. 31., Carleton, Saint Mary's, St. Olaf and St. Thomas will all square off in the MIAC Invitational, also in St. Paul, as a good preview of the upcoming MIAC Championships.

The conference title will be decided over three action-packed days in mid February, as the 2014 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships are set to take place on Feb. 13, 14 and 15 at the U of M's Aquatic Center in Minneapolis. There will be two sessions each day - preliminary races in the morning and championship heats in the evening - starting at 10:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. The MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships are always one of the conference's most popular events, and the 2014 edition should be another exciting weekend in the pool and on the diving board.

The 2014 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships will take place Feb. 13-15, 2014, at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center in Minneapolis, Minn. This year's host schools are Gustavus Adolphus College and Hamline University. There will be two sessions each day - a preliminary session each morning at 10:30 a.m., and the finals that evening at 6:30 p.m. The MIAC will provide live results online as well as live video web casts of all six sessions thanks to a partnership with Webcast America. Vic Gustafson was the swimming coach at Gustavus from 1945-77 and during his coaching career led the Gusties to eight MIAC Championships (1949, 1952, 1955, 1956, 1957, 1958, 1959, 1960).
