2017 MIAC MEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS PREVIEW

MINNEAPOLIS – The 2017 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) Men's Swimming and Diving Championships are rapidly approaching, and with standout swimmers and talented divers in abundance this season, excitement is at an all-time high for one of the MIAC's marquee events.

The conference meet will be held Thursday, Friday, and Saturday at one of the nation's premier facilities – the University of Minnesota's Jean K. Freeman Aquatic Center in Minneapolis – and the MIAC's eight men's teams all enter the championships with high hopes for either sustained success, or upward mobility in the final standings.

The University of St. Thomas returns to headline the field, as Head Coach Scott Blanchard's club hopes to hoist the championship trophy for the third-straight season. Saint John's, St. Olaf, Gustavus and Carleton all hope to challenge UST and form a very strong top five, with Hamline, Macalester and Saint Mary's all eager to show off their continued improvement on the conference's biggest stage.



In 2016, the Tommie men captured their second-straight conference title in dominant fashion, as they nearly lapped the field en route to the championship with a total score of 883.5. Saint John's led a spirited battle for second place with 495 points, as teams ranked 2-5 all scored at least 442 points. St. Olaf was third with a total of 474.5, Gustavus surged into fourth with 468 points and Carleton rounded out the top five with a score of 442. Hamline finished sixth with 192 points, Macalester's score of 142 was good for seventh, and Saint Mary's rounded out the men's final standings with 92 points.

Three-time MIAC Swimmer-of-the-Year Mike Lanz is no longer in the St. Thomas lineup, after the All-American completed his career last winter, but fellow Tommie Andrew Grabowski is back as the two-time defending MIAC Diver-of-the-Year, as well as the two-time 3-meter champion, and he also won the 1-meter title a year ago. The Tommie men will reload with junior Warren Melton, who won the 200-free, 500-free and 1,650-free titles a year ago, and All-MIAC junior Bailey Biwer back to lead the way in the pool as well.

The Johnnies hope for another top-two finish and have a strong senior trio back to lead the way. Two-time 100-free champion Kenny Bergman is back to go for a three-peat, and he'll be joined in the pool by All-MIAC swimmer Jose Alvarez, and All-MIAC diver Justin Wollin. St. Olaf brings back two All-MIAC swimmers in Bobby Schultze and Nathan France and rookie Jon Loepfe has had a breakout season in preparation for his first MIAC Championships.

Gustavus has super sophomore Tanner Sonnek back to defend his MIAC title in the 200-yard breaststroke, and he's joined by breakout rookies Logan Bican and Matt Allison as the Gusties try to continue their climb up the standings. Carleton brings back All-MIAC senior Alex Mathson to lead its team as the Knights hope for another top-five MIAC finish, and they also have high hopes for junior Colin Lau and freshman Jack Dalluge.

Hamline's Hodd Gorman is back for his junior season after earning All-MIAC honors a year ago, and the Pipers are also excited about senior Ethan Ross in the butterfly events and the emergence of rookie swimmer Gabe Mcgee. Macalester will be led by a trio of sophomores, as Paul Rischmann and Taylor Durbin have posted solid times in the pool and Jacob Roux has had a great campaign on the diving boards. Saint Mary's has solid leadership back in talented senior Joe Tonda, and sophomore Lucas Gerads hopes to make a splash in the butterfly events.

The 2017 MIAC Swimming and Diving Championships will be held Thursday, Feb. 16, through Saturday, Feb. 18, with two sessions each day. The morning sessions will begin at 10:30 a.m. (doors at 9 p.m.) and will feature preliminary races, with the evening championship sessions starting at 6:30 p.m. (doors at 5:30 p.m.). Saturday's championship doors will open at 2:30 p.m. for preliminary heats of the 1,650-yard freestyle and diving.

Tickets are available at either a single-session rate, or all-session passes will also be available for fans who plan to attend the entire event. Single-session passes cost \$10 for adults and \$5 for students, and all-session passes are \$50 for adults and \$25 for students. Heat sheets are included in the cost of admission. Children 5 and under are admitted free, and MIAC passes will be honored for all six session. No other passes or discounts will be accepted.

As in years past, all six sessions will be <u>broadcast live online</u> thanks to <u>Webcast America</u>. Fans will also be able to watched archived video of each session following the event and purchase DVDs of the broadcasts via Webcast America's site. <u>MIAC Media's Mike Gallagher</u> will handle play-by-play duties for four of the six sessions. There will also be <u>"live" results available online</u> with results updated shortly after the conclusion of each event for fans following the action from afar.

The MIAC has an exclusive Web site for the <u>2017 MIAC Swimming & Diving Championships</u>. The site features the complete <u>event schedule</u>, <u>psych sheet</u>, <u>ticket information</u> and <u>venue information</u>. The site will be constantly updated throughout the event with heat sheets, links to follow the action live, results, recaps, photos and more.

Fans can also monitor MIAC men's swimming and diving on-the-go thanks to the the <u>MIAC mobile app</u>, which is a free download for both Apple and Android devices.
