# 2000 MIAC Men's Soccer Athletes of the Week

#### November 7, 2000

Gustavus Adolphus College Junior midfielder Steve Murray was named MIAC Men's Soccer Player of the Week to close out the 2000 MIAC Men's Soccer season. Two minutes and six seconds into the second overtime of Friday's MIAC Championship showdown, Steve Murray headed home the gamewinner to give the Gusties a 3-2 win over Macalester and their eighth MIAC Title along with the automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament. It was Murray's second gamewinner of the season -- both off corner kicks -- and his third goal of the year. Gustavus will now host the West Regional this Saturday and Sunday, November 11 and 12. The Gusties finished the regular season 16-1-1 overall and 9-1 in MIAC play.

#### October 31, 2000

Augsburg College, Gustavo Quintiliano (Senior, Goalkeeper, Brasília, Brazil) had 13 saves on a 1-0 loss against Gustavus and also saved a penalty kick for the Auggies in the previous game against St. Olaf.

## October 24, 2000

Gustavus Adolphus College senior defender Scott Crowell earned at least a point in each of the Gusties' four matches last week. Crowell scored three goals and had two assists in Gustavus' three wins and one tie. He scored against St. Thomas last Saturday to put the Gusties up 1-0, then recorded a goal and an assist against Hamline in the Gusties' 2-0 win on Wednesday. On Saturday, Crowell scored the lone goal against Colorado College when his free kick was deflected into the Tiger's goal. Finally on Sunday, Crowell set up the Gustavus goal against Nebraska Wesleyan when he drove a ball across the field from 40 yards out on to the foot of his teammate, who finished the chance. The Gusties tied Nebraska Wesleyan, and improved their record to 14-1-1 overall. The Gusties are currently ranked 10th in the nation.

#### October 17, 2000

Carleton College sophomore forward Andy Indresano (Grafton, Wis./Marquette) tallied a pair of important goals during the week as the Knights posted two victories to move into a three-way tie for third place in the MIAC standings. In Tuesday's 3-2, overtime win against Saint Mary's, Indresano's goal in the 71st minute knotted the game at 2-2 after Carleton had trailed 2-0. In Friday night's 6-0 triumph over Bethel College at the National Sports Center, the forward tallied the eventual game-winner, getting the Knights on the board in the 26th minute. For the season, Indresano has two goals and an assist.

### October 10, 2000

Scott Crowell, Gustavus Adolphus College (Sr, Defense, Burnsville, Minn.) scored two goals in Saturday's 3-1 win over Carleton, including a free kick from 30 yards out that he tucked into the upper corner. Last Wednesday, Crowell put a driven ball from across the field onto a teammate's foot for his second assist of the year. Crowell has 4 goals and 2 assists this season coming out of the back, and has caused all sorts of problems for opposing teams. Gustavus is currently 11-1 and ranked 14th in the nation.

#### October 3, 2000

Kevin Roos, Concordia College (Jr., M, Fargo, ND, Fargo South H.S.) had a hand in both game winning goals for Concordia this past week. On Tuesday Roos scored the game winner in overtime to lift Concordia past St. Thomas. The goal was a tremendous individual effort as he proceeded to track down a St. Thomas defender on the run, strip the ball from the side and slide a 20 yard shot past the unsuspecting goalkeeper. On Saturday Roos backed up his performance by assisting on the game winner against Carleton. He once again stole the ball from the defender and unselfishly played the ball back across the goal mouth to a teammate to finish the score. For the week Roos had 1 goal and 1 assist in Concordia's two MIAC wins.

## September 26, 2000

Junior All-MIAC forward Kimani Williams, Macalester College (Kingston, Jamaica / Kingston College) scored early in the second half at St. John's to give Macalester a 3-1 lead en route to a 4-1 MIAC win Wednesday (Sept. 20) at Collegeville. On Sunday (Sept. 24) at Luther, Williams tallied a pair of first half goals - including the game-winner - to give the Scots a 3-2 non-conference victory. Williams has seven goals for the 5-1 Scots.
