2002 MIAC MEN'S SOCCER PREVIEW

The 2002 MIAC men's soccer season gets underway with non-conference games beginning August 30. MIAC conference play begins September 18. Last year's MIAC Champion Macalester College looks to be the heavy favorite going into the season. Macalester went undefeated in conference play in 2001 with a 10-0 record and won their fifth MIAC Championship in the past six seasons. Macalester is currently ranked 16th in the nation in the NSCAA Division III preseason poll. Watch for Saint John's and Gustavus, both finished in a tie for second place last season, to be very competitive in 2002 and challenge for the top spot in the MIAC.

This season the MIAC regular season champion will receive the MIAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Next season (2003) MIAC men's and women's soccer will hold a conference playoff with the top four teams from regular season play competing. The winner will receive the MIAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Men's soccer statistics will be will be much improved starting this season as the conference and all of its member institutions have switched to StatCrew. It will offer expanded and more detailed statistics from past seasons. Updated statistics will be posted on the MIAC website.

Season Preview: The Auggies will be young -- with just three seniors and six juniors on the 22-player roster -- and several of the freshmen and sophomores will be asked to contribute right away. But head coach Mike Navarre has high hopes for the Auggies in 2002.

"This is a year where, if people stay healthy, we can turn the corner," said Navarre, entering his fourth season as head coach. "Our starting 11 is going to be pretty solid, although we will need help from underclassmen coming off the bench."

Augsburg finished 5-11-1 overall last season, 2-8 in the always-competitive Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. And while Augsburg has not had a winning season in men's soccer since 1980 (11-1-3) -- the last MIAC championship won by the Auggies -- Navarre is optimistic that this year could be the breakout year for the Auggies.

One of the keys will be the return of defender Joel Stone (Sr., Fridley, Minn./St. Louis Park HS), who was forced to miss last season due to injury. An All-MIAC first-team selection in 2000, Stone's presence as the anchor of the Auggie defense will be important, Navarre said.

The other positive for the Auggies this season will be in scoring potential. Five of the team's top six scorers from last year return, led by midfielder Matt Lachner (Jr., Maple Grove, Minn.) and forward Mike Elcano (So., Sparks, Nev.).

Lachner, who has 13 goals and 10 assists in his first two Auggie seasons, is currently one goal and one assist away from tying the school's career scoring records (records kept post-1980). He led the team in scoring last year, with six goals and three assists. Elcano, who was a dominant scorer in his high school days in Nevada, scored five goals and had three assists in his first Auggie campaign.

In the midfield, the duo of Hugo Quintiliano (Sr., Brasilia, Brazil/Mound-Westonka HS) and Steve Gehrman (Jr, Maple Grove, Minn./Osseo HS) will provide physical and emotional sparks. Navarre calls the two his "most skilled players," and both return with plenty of scoring potential. Gehrman scored four goals last year, and Quintiliano had two goals and four assists.

The defense will be a concern for the Auggies, where Stone and Garrett Robertson (Jr., Maple Grove, Minn.) are the only returners with significant experience. Jon Martinson (So., St. Paul, Minn./Cretin-Derham Hall HS) appeared in eight games last season, and recruits Geoff Johnson (Fr., Blaine, Minn.), Matt Cousin (Fr., Lakeville, Minn.), Andy Lissick (Fr., St. Paul, Minn./Simley HS) and Mike Prendergast (Fr., Rochester, Minn./Century HS) will also compete for starting roles. Johnson and Lissick were prep all-conference players.

The biggest question mark will be in goal, where Navarre will have to find someone to replace Nick Shill, who transferred after playing the bulk of minutes for the Auggies last year. Lucas Grant (So., Starbuck, Minn./Minnewaska Area HS) and Han Zeller (Jr., Winona, Minn.) return with limited experience, and the two will compete with one of Navarre's top recruits, Chad Clausen (Fr., St. Paul, Minn./Highland Park HS). Clausen was an all-conference and honorable-mention all-state selection last season at Highland Park.

With a 7-8-1 record in his first season as a college head coach, head coach Tim Wiens is optimistic about the chances of his 2002 team showing consistent improvement and climbing in the MIAC standings.

Leading the Royals into the 2002 season is senior forward Pepe Jon Chavez, from Seattle, Wash. Chavez, one of the most skilled players in the region, earned All-MIAC and All-Region honors in his first year at Bethel last year as he recorded eight goals and eight assists.

In addition to Chavez, Jered Schock, from Sioux Falls, S.D., provided five goals and one assist in 2001 and will provide consistent offense. Juniors Brent Schiestl, from Brooklyn Park, Minn., and Doug Wester, from Princeton, N.J., earned honorable mention All-MIAC status last season and will provide quality play.

Sophomore goalkeeper Eric Berg, from Hastings, Minn., made an immediate impact his freshmen season as he recorded six shutouts which set a new Bethel single season record.

One facet of the Royals program that Coach Wiens hopes will give them an advantage is Bethel's new Ona Orth Athletic Complex. With an on-campus practice facility and the ability to play games at the facility, the recruiting advantage and ease of travel will help the Royals in 2002.

Season Preview:	Macalester is coming off one of its best seasons ever after going a perfect 10-0 to capture its fifth MIAC championship in six years. Coach John Leaney and the Scots finished at 14-3-1 after surrendering just 12 goals all season, and have gone 86-18-10 over the past six years. It will be very difficult, however, to match last year's success because the Scots graduated some of the best players in the program's history. Gone is first team All-America defender Brendan Mayer, last season's MIAC Player of the Year. Gone is Macalester's all-time career goal scoring leader Kimani Williams, who leaves after netting 58 goals, including 22 in '01. Also gone is all-conference midfielder Martin Oppenheimer, the leader of the Macalester attack.
