


MIAC Men's Tennis Athlete-of-the-Week

Jordon O'Kelly, Carleton Lake Forest, Ill. / Lake Forest

Both the Carleton men's tennis team and freshman Jordon O'Kelly (Lake Forest, Ill.) have enjoyed strong debuts. The Knights were victorious

in each of their first two 2016 matches, and O'Kelly opened his college career with wins in all three matches



thus far - one singles win and two in doubles play - all in the top spot in the lineup. For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored O'Kelly Tuesday with the first MIAC Men's Tennis Athlete-of-the-Week award of the 2016 season.

O'Kelly's season debut came in the Knights' No. 1 doubles spot, as his tandem scored an 8-2 victory to help Carleton start conference play off on the right foot with an 8-1 win over Saint Mary's. However, he was even more impressive in his second match, as the rookie won at both No. 1 singles and doubles to help the Knights take down regionally-ranked (No. 13) UW-La Crosse, 6-3. O'Kelly rallied from a one-set deficit to win his first singles match 57-, 6-4 10-6, and he added an 8-5 win at No. 1 doubles as well.

Thanks to the strong start, Carleton is undefeated thus far in the young season with a 2-0 overall record and a 1-0 start in conference play. The Knights and O'Kelly hope to add another MIAC victory Wednesday when they take on Hamline at Lifetime Fitness in Lakeville, Minn., at 6:30 p.m. The team will also host Grinnell in a nonconference match Saturday at 3 p.m. at the Owatonna (Minn.) Tennis Center.

The Carleton women's tennis team and sophomore Danielle Vasiliev (Lincolnshire, Ill. / Stevenson) started the 2016 with an impressive opening statement. The Knights won each of their first three matches by a combined score of 25-2, including two wins over Division II foes, and Vasiliev went 2-0 at No. 1 singles and also won both of her doubles matches to contribute to the team success. For her performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Vasiliev Tuesday with the first MIAC Women's Tennis Athlete-of-the-Week award of the 2016 season.

Carleton started its season with an 8-1 MIAC win over Saint Mary's, that saw Vasiliev contribute to a decisive 8-1 victory at No. 2 doubles in the conference opener. She impressed in her 2016 singles debut with a 6-3, 6-1, win at No. 1 singles to help the Knights beat Division II Winona State 8-1, and she won both her No. 1

singles match (6-3, 6-2) and No. 3 doubles match (8-3) as Carleton swept Division II St. Cloud State 9-0 on Feb. 5. She is one of just two MIAC players to start 2-0 at No. 1 singles, and is also off to a 2-0 doubles start.

Thanks to the strong start, the Knights are 3-0 overall, including two wins against Division II foes, and 1-0 in conference play atop the MIAC standings. Carleton and Vasiliev hope to keep the strong start going with a MIAC match coming up on Thursday against Hamline. The Knights will host the Pipers at Lifetime Fitness in Lakeville, Minn., at 6:30 p.m. After that, the team will take 10 days off before hosting St. Scholastica in Lakeville as well on Feb. 21.

The Gustavus men's tennis team picked up right where it left off a season ago with three dominant wins to start 2016, including a pair of 9-0 victories last

week. Sophomore Mohanad Alhouni (Tripoli, Libya / West Lutheran) had a perfect week at both No. 1 singles and



doubles with a combined 4-0 record at the top of the Gusties' lineup. For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Alhouni Tuesday with the MIAC Men's Tennis Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Alhouni started the week by going 2-0 in the top spot of both the singles and doubles lineups in a 9-0 nonconference win against UW-Eau Claire. He helped Gustavus' top doubles tandem win 8-4, and he was a 6-4, 6-2, straight-sets winner at No. 1 singles as well. He was even better in his 2016 MIAC debut against Saint John's, as his 6-1, 6-1, singles win and 8-3 doubles victory paved the way for another 9-0 Gustavus sweep. Thus far, Alhouni is 4-0 overall in 2016.

The Gusties couldn't have gotten off to a much better start, as the team is already 3-0 with a trifecta of perfect 9-0 wins over the Johnnies, UWEC and Division II Augustana (S.D.). The team has an important day coming up Saturday as it will play a pair of MIAC matches almost simultaneously, as Gustavus hosts St. Thomas in a 10 a.m. match, and travels to Winona to face Saint Mary's at noon. The Gusties are seeking their 28th-straight MIAC title in 2016.

The Gustie sophomore was a perfect 2-0 in singles play in the top two spots in the lineup, and she helped win both her matches at No. 1 doubles as well while her team split a pair of extremely close matches against NCAA Division II foes. For her performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Davis Tuesday with the MIAC Women's Tennis Athlete-of-the-Week award.

Baker brought her 'A' game Saturday in an impressive 6-3 Gustavus win over Southwest Minnesota State and a narrow 5-4 loss to Sioux Falls. Against SMSU, she was a 6-1, 6-3, winner at No. 1 singles, and helped the Gusties' top doubles team pull out an 8-5 victory. She added a 6-2, 6-2, win at No. 2 singles against Sioux Falls, and played a big role in an 8-2 win in the top doubles spot. Saturday was Baker's first action of the

season, and she is off to a perfect 4-0 start, overall.

The Saturday split moved Gustavus' record to 1-2 thus far on the young season, with both losses coming to Division I and II opponents. Baker and company will be back in action against D-II competition on Sunday, with a pair of matches in Sioux Falls, S.D., where the Gusties will face both Augustana (S.D.) and Minnesota State-Moorhead. That will serve as the team's final tune-up for conference play, as the defending champion Gusties will open MIAC action on Feb. 27.



Saturday, Saenz nearly led his team to a win over No. 16-ranked UW-Whitewater, as he accounted for half the team's wins in a narrow 5-4 loss. their top-notch foes. Sophomore Mohanad Alhouni squared off against the opponents' top players and more



than held his own, with a 2-2 singles record at the No. 1 spot, and a 1-3 doubles record. For his performance, the MIAC sports information directors honored Alhouni Tuesday with his third MIAC Men's Tennis Athlete-of-the-Week award of the 2016 season.

Alhouni started his impressive week with a big win against a step up in competition. He defeated the top player from Saint Mary's-Texas, 6-4, 6-2, and lost a narrow 8-4 match at No. 1 doubles as Gustavus nearly upset the 27-ranked ranked team in Division II, 5-4. The team also dropped a narrow 5-4 decision to No. 12 Trinity, with Alhouni dropping his No. 1 singles match to the nation's seventh-ranked player, and his No. 1 doubles team losing an 8-6 heartbreaker. The team and Alhouni also suffered a 7-2 setback to No. 13 Washington (Mo.), but pulled off a 5-4 win over No. 29 Texas-Tyler, with Alhouni getting a 6-2, 7-5, win at No. 1 singles against a nationally-ranked foe, and his No. 2 doubles team was an 8-4 winner.

This season, Alhouni has an 11-4 singles record and an 8-6 doubles mark. The Gustavus sophomore is ranked No. 4 nationally in singles play and No. 11 in doubles play, and he's ranked No. 3 in singles and No. 4 in doubles in the Central Region. The Gusties are ranked No. 19 in the nation and No.5 in the Central Region. Gustavus is now 16-6 overall and 5-0 in conference play, and they have a trio of MIAC matches on this week's schedule.
