Season Preview:

The Gustavus men's tennis team returns nine of its top ten players from the 2000 squad that won its 12th consecutive MIAC Championship and finished second at the NCAA Team Championship. Coach Steve Wilkinson and his squad, which begin the season ranked second nationally have high hopes for the 2001 season with goals that include winning their 13th consecutive MIAC title and once again contending for the NCAA title. The team welcomes newcomer Eric Butorac (So., Rochester, Minn.) to the squad after he played regularly for Division I Ball State University last year. Butorac is expected to be a very significant contributor for the Gusties in both singles and doubles play.

The season opens with a late January trip to Hawaii, the World Team Tennis competition in California, and Division III National Indoor Championships at Whitworth College in Washington. Coach Wilkinson will again challenge his team with a schedule that includes seven teams ranked in the top twenty in Division III along with four Division I opponents.

Hamline University

Season Preview:

The 2001 season should represent another positive step for Hamline in what is a perennially tough tennis conference. Coach Dan Haertl believes that this program has a bright future. The new Walker Field House, housing a 4800 square-foot fitness center and three tennis courts, provides a great indoor facility for in-season and off-season training. The six Holt Tennis Courts are the outdoor site for training and matches. The teams will benefit from the competition they face during their spring break trip to Phoenix.

The 2001 men's team may be the most talented group that Hamline has ever put on the courts. Returning #1 Ivan Guarin (sr) hopes to recover from elbow and shoulder problems to lead this team in his last campaign. Sophomore transfer Kris Premo and first-year John Schollmeier will compete for the top spots with returning sophomore Troy Kleven. Joe Vogel (jr) and Brian Niemczyk (so) return to fill out the lineup along with Perry Smiley (so). If the Pipers can stay healthy they may find themselves near the top of the MIAC standings at the end of the year.

Season Preview:

Third-year coach Eric Eberhardt and the Scots are optimistic that the 2001 campaign can be one of the best ever at Macalester and are looking to finish near the top of the MIAC. The Scots are going for their sixth straight winning conference record after going 5-4 a year ago and taking fourth at the MIAC tournament. Macalester went 0-6 last season in matches decided by a single point and are hoping improved performance in doubles play can make the difference this year.

The Scots lost Mads Sorensen (12-12) and Peter Neumer (17-7) from the top half of the singles lineup to graduation, but return No. 1 player Johan Fryklund (Jr., Lund, Sweden). Fryklund went just 2-7 at No. 2 singles over the season's first half but went 6-7 after moving up to No. 1. R.J. Laukitis (Jr., Holland, MI) returns after going 15-11 - mostly at No. 3 and 4. Mac also welcomes back Peter Loken (So., Duluth, MN / Marshall) and Jeff Falk (So., Bremen, Germany). Loken went 13-10 last year, mostly at fifth singles, while Falk went 16-7 at No. 6.

He will be followed by senior co-captain John Zins, St. Cloud, rounded out by Plymouth natives junior Carl Robinson and sophomore Scott Loe. Zins was the MIAC champion at number two singles in 1999. In doubles, teammates Solum and Zins look to be number one, followed at number two by Robinson and Loe. Finishing up in number three doubles is expected to be senior co-captain Mike Gander and freshman Sean Borg. The team will again be coached by Jack Bowe, who is in his fourth year at SJU with a 29-35 career record.

Season Preview:

Jeff Halberg will be the first to admit that, during his first two seasons as the Saint Mary's University men's and women's tennis coach, he put a lot of stock in the Cardinals' final overall records.



And, on paper, those records weren't exactly anything to write home about. His men's teams managed just two victories in 31 matches during that two-year span -- failing to win a match in 1999 (0-17), while winning twice in 16 matches a year ago.

"When you look at our teams, you can't judge the success of a season solely on how many matches we've won," admitted Halberg. "Our goal is to continue to improve and strive to get better with each match."

"Just because you don't win, doesn't mean you haven't improved." And therein lies the difference between the Halberg of the past two seasons, and the Halberg of 2001.

"Every one of the individuals on the men's team has improved his game since last season," said Halberg, who has penciled in a lineup that includes Geoff Granseth (Winona, Minn.), Brad Reichuber (Mahtomedi, Minn.), Andrew Jackola (Chisholm, Minn.), Chad Boyer (Albert Lea, Minn.), Chad Brusky (Fond du Lac, Wis.) and Dustin Noble (Spring Lake Park, Minn.) -- with Brusky the lone

newcomer to the lineup. "They all put in a lot of time working over the summer, and that work will pay off."

Season Preview:

The 2000 St. Thomas men's tennis team received an invitation to the 27-team NCAA Division III tournament -- UST's first since 1993. The Toms, the MIAC runner-up, had a 15-2 dual-meet record. The Toms' lone dual losses came March 11 to eventual NCAA runner-up Gustavus, 6-1, in a match in which UST won all three doubles matches, and to Washington (Mo.) in the NCAA playoffs, 7-0.

NCAA individual qualifer at No. 1 singles Matt Hering was among three seniors who graduated, but the Toms have four returners who placed second in the 2000 MIAC Championships -- soph Matt Kramer took second at No. 6 singles (lost 6-4, 5-7, 6-2) and joined John Ryan to place second at No. 3 doubles; and Derek Johnson and Andy Horton took second at No. 2 doubles.
