2000 MIAC VOLLEYBALL PREVIEW

The 2000 MIAC volleyball season gets underway with non-conference games

beginning on September 1. Look for the top teams of 1999 to repeat their success, as they all return several key players. Last season, Bethel and St. Thomas tied for the MIAC Championship, based on a combined regular-season and tournament record. St. Thomas finished the 1999 season with the best MIAC record, finishing with a 10-1 mark in conference play. However, Bethel came out on top at the MIAC Tournament and earned the automatic bid, advancing to the NCAA Division III Championships.

Watch for St. Benedict, last season's third-place finisher, to be in the mix for the MIAC title in 2000. The Blazers return a solid core and have added several quality first-year athletes to their roster. St. Olaf, the fourth-place finisher in 1999, has been an NCAA participant in six of the last seven years, and hopes make another appearance this year.

The 2000 MIAC Tournament will be held November 3-4 at St. Mary's University. The tournament winner will automatically qualify for the NCAA Division III Championships.

Season Preview:

The 2000 version of the Augsburg College volleyball team should be an interesting blend of experience and youth. Four senior starters return, combined with a solid recruiting class for co-coaches Thanh Pham and Ryan Dehnel. The pair enters their first season as co-head coaches; last year, Pham guided the team as an interim head coach, with Dehnel as an assistant. A group of four seniors will lead the Auggies this season. Angie Rieger (Sr., Courtland, Minn./New Ulm Public HS) and Cassi Van Ausdall (Sr., White Bear Lake, Minn.) return to lead the Auggie hitters. Rieger earned first-team All-MIAC honors last season. Van Ausdall battled an arm injury last season that forced her to miss six matches and limited her presence to only back-row duties in several more. Despite the injury, she had a strong season both in the back and front rows. Emily Walen (Sr., Stillwater, Minn./Hastings HS) transferred to Augsburg from Division III volleyball power California Lutheran last season and made an immediate impact for the Auggies in the setting role. Tiffany Lynch (Sr., Isanti, Minn./Cambridge-Isanti HS) became a solid back-row presence for the Auggies last season. In addition to the four seniors, Augsburg returns a solid corps of sophomore hitters who gained valuable playing time on the varsity and on Augsburg's JV team, and Dehnel and Pham will also benefit from a solid recruiting class in 2000.

Four years ago, they came to Saint Mary's as perhaps the most highly touted recruiting class the Cardinal volleyball program had ever had. How good?

Amanda Edmond (Sandstone, Minn.), Diane Wood (Los Alamos, N.M.) and Shelley Haake (Carroll, Iowa) held down the teams top three spots in kills and blocks, while fellow freshmen Amber Rajtora (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) and Aimee Taillefer (Bloomington, Minn.) were the team leaders in assists and digs, respectively. Those five also appeared in more matches than any other players on the Cardinals' roster, as freshmen.

Last season SMU finished a much-improved 13-18 overall, and that was just a hint of things to come. 1999 proved to be the real coming-out party for the Cardinal junior class as SMU posted its highest finish ever the MIAC conference tournament (fifth) en route to a 22-13 record, the team's first 20-win season since 1990. Edmond and Haake were again first-team All-MIAC selections and the statistical leaders were again dominated by the names Edmond, Haake, Wood, Rajtora and Taillefer.

Yet, despite all of their impressive accomplishments, their continued improvement as a team and their steady climb up the conference ladder, something is still missing, win the conference title and earn an NCAA tournament berth.

It doesn't hurt that Lester returns his entire starting lineup for a fourth straight year, either.

"This senior class has had an outstanding run" said Lester, noting that Edmond, Haake, Wood, Rajtora and Taillefer have enjoyed much of the limelight over the last three seasons, but the Cardinals could not have enjoyed the success they have without the play of fellow seniors Lisa Grunewald (Austin, Minn.), Theresa Doheny (Cottage Grove, Minn.) and Teresa Sampson (St. Michael, Minn.). "This group has been through a lot over the past three years, but they've always stuck together and I'm looking forward to seeing them make their final season their most memorable one."

Season Preview:

Cole Tallman made an immediate impact in 1999, his debut season as UST head coach. He guided the Tommies to a 21-11 record, including a 10-1 MIAC regular-season dual record and tie for the MIAC championship. Eight losses came to top-20 teams in NAIA or Division III. Tallman, (496-152 (.772) in 15 seasons), the former head coach at Division I Furman, will reach 500 career coaching wins this fall. The Toms must replace four accomplished seniors -- Jenny Schmitt, Jill Kraus, Kirsten Johnson and Rachel Myskevitz. Schmitt set career records in assists (4,304) and digs (1,627); Johnson holds the career record in blocks (271, with 132 solos); and Myskevitz is the career record holder in service aces (283). St. Thomas' 24-player roster includes 14 newcomers -- nine of whom stand 5-10 or taller. Leading the returners are 5-9 senior OH Steph Blanda (246 kills, 357 digs); 6-2 sophomore OH Katie Reynolds (228 kills, school-record 122 blocks); and 5-9 opposite Sara Diercks (129 kills, 166 digs). Tallman's first recruiting class includes two upperclass players -- 6-2 junior Jenn Ulstad, who made the all-tournament team in basketball for UST at last March's NCAA Final Four; and 5-10 sophomore Erin Keating, who attended Northern Colorado last year. Leading the freshmen class is 5-10 setter Jane Gibbs of Lakeville.
