

MIAC volleyball teams return to competition

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BLOOMINGTON, Minn. – For the first time in nearly 500 days, Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) volleyball teams are back on the court for match competition.

Though schedules have been abbreviated and pushed to the spring due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, MIAC teams are poised to compete in both non-conference and conference matches over the next six weeks, with non-conference matches already underway and MIAC contests set to begin as early as Saturday, March 27. There will not be MIAC champions or playoffs in any postponed fall sport this spring. No spectators are permitted when a contest is conducted at an on-campus indoor facility. When a contest is conducted at an off-campus indoor facility and a MIAC team is designated as the host, spectators are limited to remaining outside of the playing area, contingent upon the facility and campus spectator policies.

Continuing throughout the regular season, the MIAC will honor outstanding individual performances each Monday with the announcement of the MIAC Volleyball Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week.
