

Maureen Hardwick, St. Thomas

Week of: 2002-10-08

University of St. Thomas first-year golfer Maureen Hardwick (Warroad, Minn.) was crowned the meet medalist as she led the St. Thomas women's golf team to the school's second consecutive conference team title Sunday at the 2002 MIAC Championships in St. Cloud. The Tommies' 504 total beat runner-up Gustavus by 22 strokes and avenged a five-stroke loss to the Gusties seven days earlier. Hardwick shot 38 for nine holes Sunday in cold, windy, wet conditions and closed with a 27-hole total of 121. She topped Macalester's Kristy Schaaf by two strokes for low score out of 52 golfers. Hardwick was recruited by St. Thomas for her outstanding hockey skills and also was a standout softball player in high school.

Kelly Lewis, Carleton

Carleton College first-year Kelly Lewis (Flossmoor, Ill./Homewood-Flossmoor) fired rounds of 85 and 78 for a 163 total, finishing second at the Gustavus Invitational on Saturday and Sunday at Le Sueur Country Club. She was the highest MIAC finisher in the field, and her final round total of five-over par was the low round of the tournament. She finished one shot behind the eventual tournament winner and led the Knights to their best 18- and 36-hole team score in school history. Her 36-hole score tied the school record held by Emily Skinner and set a new school record in relation to par. Her 18-hole total also tied Skinner's single-round record in relation to par. Lewis paces the Knights with an 84.00 stroke average this season. In six events, she's recorded five top 20 finishes, four top 10's and three top-five finishes.

Katie Glorvigan, St. Thomas

University of St. Thomas golfer Katie Glorvigan (Sophomore, Grand Rapids, Minn.) was named MIAC women's golfer of the week Tuesday after she led the Tommies to a strong third-place showing at the Southwest State Invitational. Glorvigan tied for second in a field of 89 golfers loaded with Division II teams. Her career-best 163 total led the Tommies to third place with a 679 score that beat nine scholarship programs and MIAC rivals Concordia and Saint Benedicts. Glorvigan had rounds of 79-84 on the challenging Marshall course. Glorvigan missed most of her high school senior year and most of her college freshman season with a shoulder injury that required surgery. In three tournaments this fall season she's lowered her 36-hole scores from 181 to 166 to 163. The Tommies compete Saturday and Sunday in the Gustavus Invitational in LeSeuer, then defend their conference team championship Oct. 4-5 in the MIAC Championships in St. Cloud.

Katie Taylor, Concordia

Concordia-Moorhead College junior Katie Taylor (Owatonna, Minn.) posted scores of 77-80 for a total of 157 to take second at the Dragon/Bison Inviational in Moorhead, Minn. this past weekend. Taylor's efforts helped the Cobbers to their first team title of the season, as they won the eight-team event by 10 strokes over a Division II dominated field. She leads the Cobbers with an 80.6 stroke average. It marked her second runner-up finish of the season, as she was second at the season-opening Cobber Open.
